Committee Meeting
Minutes
April 14, 2011

The members of the Board of Education met as a Committee of the Whole meeting on Monday, April 14, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. at the Don Stroh Administration Center, 5606 South 147th Street. The agenda.

Present: Linda Poole, Dave Anderson, Mike Pate, and Patrick Ricketts

Absent: Mike Kennedy

Administrators in attendance were Keith Lutz, Jim Sutfin, and Kraig Lofquist and other administrators.


Dr. Lutz began the discussion about the security audit completed by the Crisis Management Inc., LLC organization. John Dudley, with Crisis Management, visited all building principals about their safety plans. In all, Mr. Dudley visited 363 staff members during this security audit process. The recommendations made by Crisis Management are intended to be district-wide not specific buildings.

Kraig Lofquist reviewed what the district currently does in regards to safety and security. He reported that the district has had school safety and security plans in the district since 1999, and these plans have been updated periodically, and are compliant with the state and national standards. In the discussion, Dr. Lofquist reported that at least one time a year an undercover officer goes into buildings to see how long it takes for a staff member to challenge them as to why they are in the building. The district also uses a drug dog intermittently in the buildings throughout the year. The buildings also conduct drills for fire, tornado, Code Yellow and Code Red. The district has provided school resource officers at the middle and high schools for many years.

Kraig Lofquist, said the district applied for a grant through the US Department of Education, which is being used to provide additional police officers at each high school until the end of the school year. There is a stipulation in the grant where the district could reapply for additional funds.

The recommendations from Crisis Management included: no cell phones during school hours, clear or mesh book bags, closed campus, student ID's, and monitoring student dress. The board members discussed the pros and cons of the recommendations.

Dr. Lutz stated he was well aware that all of these recommendations will be controversial issues, and that the district would continue discussions with the board and would move slowly in making changes.

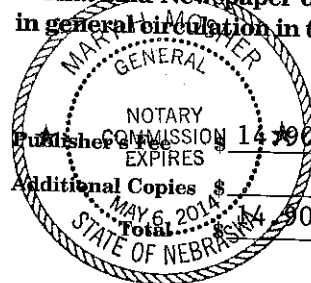
