- 4. The Holiday break will begin Friday, December 21st. School will resume again on January 4, 2013.

Board Comments:

Pat Ricketts said his prayers and thoughts go out to all involved in the tragedy in Conn. He thanked the Administration for being pro-active. Pat had received an alert now message along with parents in the District, reminding everyone that Millard does have a safety hotline which explains how to help children deal with the present events. Linda Poole extended her condolences to Newtown, Conn. She thought the Millard Administration did a great job of communicating through this tragedy and was happy to hear that someone was brought in to help Millard South staff deal with the news. Field trips shall be considered as instruction and planned as such with definite objectives determined in advance. Lists of curriculum-related field trips shall be made available by the offices of elementary and secondary education.

- I. Appropriate instruction shall precede and follow each field trip.
- II. <u>All school</u> **R**rules and regulations of the building and MPS regarding students and student conduct and the District's Standards for Student Conduct shall be in effect from the time of departure until the time of return.
- III. Written approval of <u>the</u> parent or guardian is required for participation of <u>pupils</u> <u>students</u> in field trips.
- IV. At the elementary and middle <u>school</u> level<u>s</u>, all field trips shall begin and end at the school unless approved and communicated by the principal.
- V. Field trips requiring school bus transportation shall not interfere with the regularly scheduled transportation of pupils students to and from school.

- IX. When a field trip is made to a place of business or industry, it shall be required that an employee of the host company serve as conductor.

Journalism

- I. <u>Prohibited Expressions</u>. Prior to publication of the student newspaper, annuals, and magazines, the classroom instructor and school principal or designee shall review classroom materials to determine their acceptability for publication. Student publications may be restricted, edited, or prohibited when, after considering the maturity level of the students, the classroom instructor, principal (or designee) determines any of the following:
 - A. <u>The expression is considered vulgar or obscene</u>. <u>Vulgar or Oo</u>bscene expressions are those which the average person, applying contemporary community standards, would find that when taken as a whole, appeal to prurient interests; or, the <u>written materials expressions</u> depict or describe in a patently offensive way sexual conduct in a manner prohibited by applicable law; or, the obscene materials, taken as a whole, lack serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value.
 - B. <u>EThe expression is considered defamatory</u>. Expressions shall be considered <u>libelous defamatory</u> when they include <u>defamatory libelous</u> falsehoods about individuals. In order to be libelous, the <u>defamatory libelous</u> falsehood must be made with actual malice; that is, with the knowledge that it is false or with reckless disregard of whether or not it is false.
 - C. <u>The expression invades the privacy of others</u>. Invasion of privacy includes exploitation of an individual's personality; providing information of an individual's private affairs with which the public has no legitimate concern; or wrongful intrusion into an individual's private activities in a manner that can cause mental suffering, shame, or humiliation to a person of ordinary sensibilities.
 - D. <u>The expression criticizes school officials or advocates violation of District Policies or Rules</u>. Such expressions are prohibited to the extent that there is evidence that supports a <u>reasonable</u> judgment that substantial disruption of or material interference with the normal operation of the school or school activities will result (see I(F), as provided in Section I (F) below.
 - E. <u>The expression is discriminatory</u>. <u>Discriminatory expression attacks ethnic, religious, or social</u> groups; attacks students with disabilities; or promotes discrimination against said groups. Expressions which attack or promote discrimination against groups or individuals on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, gender, marital status, disability, or age.
 - F. <u>The expression substantially interrupts or materially interferes with the educational process</u>. Such expressions are prohibited when there is evidence which reasonably supports a judgment that a substantial disruption of or material interference with the normal operation of school activities will occur, or injury or damage to persons or property may result if permitted. In order for a written expression to be disruptive or hazardous, there must exist clear and specific facts upon which it would be reasonable to conclude that a clear and present likelihood of an immediate and substantial disruption in the educational process would result if the expression were allowed to occur. Information which causes school administrators to reasonably forecast that a substantial disruption of or material interference with the normal operation of the school or school activities may occur, or injury to persons, damage to property, or interference with the rights of others may result if permitted.
 - G. <u>The expression is highly controversial</u>. The publication is highly controversial and advances or advocates a certain viewpoint or lifestyle which has an inflammatory effect. An indication of whether something is controversial is whether the topic would reasonably offend some groups or would be shocking to teachers, parents, and/or students. To be prohibited under this subsection, the expression must substantially interrupt or materially interfere with the educational process.

H. <u>The expression constitutes sexual harassment</u>. The expression violates District Rules 5210.1 5010.1 or 5400.6 or constitutes illegal prohibited sexual harassment.

II. Guidelines for Student Memorials.

- A. <u>Yearbook Guidelines:</u>
 - 1. A deceased student's picture, if available, will be included with the pictures of other students in the class for the year covered by the yearbook. In addition, approximately one-fourth page will be allowed for each student who died during the year. This area will include each student's picture (if available), the student's legal name, and the dates of birth and death. The top of the page will be designated, "Memorial Page;" or; "In Memory:". If there are no student deaths there will be no memorial page.
 - 2. For yearbooks that are delivered in the Fall, the memorial page will precede the index page. The yearbook will cover deaths from the beginning of summer through the last day of the school year. If there is a death during the summer and the student has not graduated, the student's picture will appear in the next year's yearbook.
 - 3. For yearbooks that are delivered in the Spring, with a Fall supplement, the memorial page will be at the end of the yearbook supplement. The yearbook and supplement cover deaths that occur from July 1st through the next June 30th.
- B. <u>Student Newspaper Guidelines</u>:
 - 1. Because of the periodic nature of student newspapers, no memorial pictures or articles will be published. Letters to the editor of tribute to the deceased or of sympathy to family and/or friends may be published. Letters must be signed and are subject to editing, after consultation with the author(s). Staff editorials may be published, at the discretion of the editorial staff and with the approval of the newspaper sponsor.
- III. <u>Violation of District Policy</u>, or Rule, and/or Regulation. Students who violate District Ppolicy, or Rrule, or regulation governing journalism through printed material, e-mail, or any other written or electronic medium are subject to disciplinary action as set forth in District Rule 5400.1.
- IV. <u>Request for Hearing</u>. Any student or student group believing that the District has unfairly deprived the student or student group of their freedom of expression may request a review of the perceived deprivation by following the procedures set forth in <u>District</u> Rule 5133.1 5510.1.
- V. <u>Advertisements</u>. Any person or entity wishing to advertise in a District publication must obtain written approval by the building principal or principal's designee prior to publication.

Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment

Health Education

As provided in <u>sS</u>tate statute, programs will be provided for instructing <u>pupils</u> <u>students</u> in a comprehensive health education program which shall include instruction (1) as to the physiological, psychological, and sociological aspects of drug use, misuse, and abuse and (2) on mental <u>retardation disabilities</u> and other developmental disabilities, such as cerebral palsy, autism, and epilepsy, their causes, and the prevention thereof through proper nutrition and the avoidance of the consumption of drugs as defined in this section. For purpose of this section, drugs shall mean any and all biologically active substances used in the treatment of illnesses or for recreation or pleasure. Special emphasis shall be placed upon the commonly abused drugs of tobacco, alcohol, marijuana, hallucinogenics, amphetamines, barbiturates, and narcotics.

The health education program will be accomplished through the provision of a multi-cultural, gender-fair, disabilitysensitive instructional program, based on the acquisition of knowledge and the development of personal skills that promote healthy behavior.

In the area of family life education and the study of human sexuality, it is essential that there be understanding, support and continual communications among home, school and community religious organizations. As it regards <u>dD</u>istrict programming, a pro-abstinence position will be conveyed and supported by the <u>dD</u>istrict and its personnel. In addition, the following will be adhered to:

- I. iInstructional materials to be used in Health/Know Yourself/Family Everyday Living will be available for inspection by the parent or guardian. These materials may be viewed at the student's school or during Parent Orientation Nights Events as set forth in District Rule 6140.2 6810.1;
- II. iIf, after a review of the materials and a conference with the teacher/principal, a parent/guardian requests that his/her child not participate in a given course or aspect of a course, an alternative educational assignment will be arranged for the student as set forth in <u>District Rules</u> 6140.36810.24 and 1310.2.

Legislative Update January 7, 2013

Legislative Calendar

The calendar for the session is attached. This is a long session and includes reforming all committees and developing a two-year budget. The first day is January 9th and the last day is June 5th.

Current Education Committee

There are four members of the committee to replace next year including the chairperson. The Education Committee meets on Mondays and Tuesdays. Senator Greg Adams – Chairperson Senator Bill Avery Senator Abbie Cornett Senator Brenda Council Senator Ken Haar Senator Gwen Howard Senator Les Seiler Senator Kate Sullivan

Education Lobby Priorities

The Education Lobby is working on the following priorities:

- 1. Keep the current formula and use a temporary aid adjustment factor if necessary to reduce funding.
- 2. Soften the Education Committee changes by adding the averaging adjustment into basic funding.
- 3. Seek increases in SPED funding to offset local general fund expenditures for that program.

K-12 Funding

In October the estimates on state aid for 2013-14 indicated a 10% increase was needed (about \$88 million) based on keeping the current formula intact.

The Education Committee heard testimony across the state on changes to the formula this past summer. The concepts they are promoting include eliminating the instruction time and teacher education allowances. The Education Committee concepts have reduced projected state aid to a 6% increase (about \$51 million).

Preliminary estimates indicate that these two changes have about a \$5 million dollar negative impact on Millard Public Schools. With these changes estimates show state aid increasing next year by about \$5 million (7%).

National News

Duncan wants Congress to revamp NCLB

U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan is looking to Congress to revamp the No Child Left Behind Act, an effort he says the elected body needs to get serious about handling. So far, 34 states and the District of Columbia have been given waivers under the NCLB law. Noting that he will remain in the Obama administration for the "long haul," Duncan says he will concentrate his efforts on improving teacher and principal quality, and the Race to the Top grant program. Education policy advocates say the pressure will be on Mr. Duncan to use his next four years to deliver another big bang along the lines of Race to the Top, which dangled \$3.4 billion in front of states to devise bold education-improvement plans and change policies that would expand charter schools, adopt common standards, and revamp teacher evaluations.
