Homebound Instruction

Homebound instruction in a student's home under parental supervision may be provided when the student is physically or mentally ill or injured and unable to attend regular classes for an extended period of time. Homebound instruction shall be provided when the student's physical and mental condition are such that the student can benefit from instruction and no other provision will meet the student's educational needs.

Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment

Homebound Instruction

- I. <u>General Statement</u>. Homebound instruction may be provided to a student in his/her home under parental supervision when the student is unable to attend regular classes due to physical or mental illness or injury which results in the student's extended absence from school.
- II. <u>Definitions</u>.
 - A. <u>Homebound instruction</u> shall mean educational instruction provided to a student in his/her home within <u>Millard School</u>-District boundaries or a local hospital to which a student has been temporarily admitted for care of the illness or injury. <u>Temporary hospitalization shall mean less than thirty (30) calendar days</u>.
 - B. <u>Parental supervision</u> shall mean the presence of the student's parent or guardian or other adult as authorized by the parent or guardian, including hospital staff.
 - C. Extended absence from school shall mean a medically prescribed absence from the regular classes the student attends, for a period of at least fifteen (15) school days, or the equivalent period of time for students on a block schedule. The length of time a student may be absent from classes for a medically prescribed reason before homebound instruction begins will be individually determined and based upon, but not limited to the following: duration of the absence, recurrence of the absences, and the ability of the student to participate in instruction as verified by the student's physician.
 - D. <u>Illness or Injury</u> shall mean a medically diagnosed physical or mental condition that prohibits a student from attending regular classes, e.g., cancer treatment, recovery from surgery, school phobia.
 - E. <u>Core <u>Curriculum</u> Subject Areas</u> shall mean instruction in the following areas: reading, writing, mathematics, science and social studies.
 - F. <u>Physician</u> shall mean individuals licensed by the Department of Health and Human Services as Medical Doctors (M.D.) and Osteopathic Physicians (D.O.).
- III. <u>Provision of Homebound Instruction.</u>
 - A. Homebound instruction shall be provided only when no other options are available to meet the student's educational needs.
 - B. The frequency and duration of homebound instruction shall be such instruction as is necessary for the student to progress in the core <u>eurriculum subject area</u> classes that he/she is unable to attend.
 - C. The student's physician shall sanction the student's participation in homebound instruction, verifying that the student's physical and mental condition will not be jeopardized by participation.
 - D. Students who are residents of the Millard School-District and attend a nonpublic school are eligible to receive homebound instruction.
 - E. Students who are residents of the Millard School-District and attend an Exempt School are not eligible to receive homebound instruction, other than the instruction they may be entitled to receive as a student with a disability.
 - F. Homebound instruction will be provided on regularly scheduled school days, following the approved school calendar, and during times that are ordinarily considered to be the school day for professional staff as provided by District Rule 4141.1.

IV. <u>Requests for Homebound Instruction.</u>

- A. All requests for homebound instruction shall be referred to the Director of Special Education or designee.
- B. If the homebound student is not a student with a disability, a Multidisciplinary Team evaluation will-may be conducted to determine if the student is eligible to receive instruction as a student with a disability who is Other Health Impaired. If the student is determined to be eligible to receive homebound instruction as a student with a disability, the student's Individual Education Program (IEP) Team will identify the appropriate homebound instruction to be provided by the District.
- C. If the homebound student is a student with a disability, the student's Individual Education Program (IEP) Team will be convened to consider the student's medical condition and identify the appropriate homebound instruction to be provided by the District.

The revision in this rule, in combination with the revision suggested in board rule 6700.1, provides that an exempt school student may participate in school-sponsored clubs and activities only at the school where that student would be assigned had that student officially enrolled in the district. Exempt Schools: Requests for Programs, Services or Materials

I. <u>General Statement</u>. Nebraska law provides parents and guardians the right to educate their children and wards in alternative schools, which are exempt from state approval or state accreditation requirements.

II. <u>Definitions</u>.

- A. Exempt School shall mean any private, parochial, denominational or home school which has elected not to meet approval and/or accreditation requirements pursuant to state law and regulations of the Nebraska Department of Education.
- B. <u>Exempt School Student shall mean any resident student of school age who has not</u> graduated or received a G.E.D. diploma and who is attending an Exempt School.
- C. Programs shall mean the educational curriculum, co-curricular activities, and extracurricular school-sponsored clubs and activities which are available for students who are enrolled in the District.
- D. Assigned School of Residence shall mean the District school where the Exempt School Student would have attended and received educational instruction if the student had officially enrolled pursuant to the District's enrollment policies and rules.

III. <u>Cooperation with Exempt Schools</u>.

The District shall cooperate with the education of Exempt School Students according to the state and federal laws, and District policies and rules. In cooperating in the educational process of Exempt School Students the District shall:

- A. Provide special education services to qualified Exempt School Students pursuant to District policies and rules, and state and federal laws and regulations. Special education and related services will be provided at the assigned District school that is closest to the eligible student's Exempt School. Services will be available during the hours that public school students attend school.
- B. Allow Exempt School Students to participate in interscholastic athletics or activities as well as any activity or interscholastic athletics under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association, provided however that such Exempt School Students must be enrolled in a minimum of twenty credit hours of schoolwork in a District high school, regardless of the level of participation or competition.
- C. Not provide any ELL, Title I, homebound instruction or other remedial services to Exempt School Students except as may be required by law.

D. Not provide any textbooks, teacher's edition textbooks, ancillary textbook materials, consumable material, library or media materials, or other resources to Exempt School Students or Exempt Schools.

IV. <u>Requests for Participation</u>.

- A. All requests for participation in District programs shall be referred to the Superintendent or designee for consideration and approval or denial. The Superintendent or designee in considering and evaluating the request shall consider the following issues:
 - 1. Whether the school is closed to open and option enrollment or in-District transfers;
 - 2. The availability of the requested program at the assigned school;
 - 3. Whether the school environment or educational process will be disrupted;
 - 4. Whether there is space available and a specified time can be assigned so as to minimize any conflicts or disruption of the education process;
 - 5. Whether the Exempt School Student meets academic eligibility requirements or course enrollment prerequisites for participation;
 - 6. Whether the requested program is appropriate for the knowledge level, intellectual maturity, competence, and age of the Exempt School Student; and
 - 7. Whether the requested program is part of an integrated program which cannot be isolated so as to allow participation in the requested program.
- B. An Exempt School Student shall be required to be officially enrolled and counted proportionately towards the District's ADA/ADM if such Student requests to <u>participate in</u> the District's programs or activities.
- C. Exempt School Students who participate in District programs shall be subject to all District and school policies and rules, including, but not limited to, District and school policies and rules regarding student conduct, discipline, attendance, student fees, student provided materials, equipment and attire, insurance, proof of age and identity, physical examination, and immunizations.
- D. Any Exempt School Student requesting participation in more than fifty percent (50%) of District classes on a daily or weekly basis must enroll as a full-time District student and be subject to all requirements of all other full-time students of the District.

- E. Exempt School Students may participate in those co-curricular activities and extracurricular school-sponsored clubs and activities <u>at the assigned school</u> which are available to students who are enrolled in the District. The exception is any interscholastic athletics or activities as well as any activity or interscholastic athletics under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association.
- F. Exempt School Students must be enrolled in a minimum of twenty credit hours of schoolwork in a District high school in order to participate in interscholastic athletics or activities as well as any interscholastic athletics under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association, regardless of the level of participation or competition.

Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Admittance and Participation by Exempt School Students

I. Placement

Grade and class placement of Exempt School Students requesting enrollment in the District as a full time student shall be determined by the District. The following factors shall be considered in determining the placement of an Exempt School Student:

- A. The age of the student;
- B. A review of the transcript of the program of instruction completed by the Exempt School Student which shall be provided by the parents or guardian of the student;
- C. Achievement Test scores, which shall be provided to the District by the parents or guardian of the student; and
- D. Records from any schools previously attended by the student.

II. Official School Transcripts

The transcript record of the Exempt School curriculum may become part of or incorporated into the official transcript records of the District, noting that the courses were completed in an Exempt School setting.

III. Credits and Grades

- A. For the purpose of placement and graduation, credits may be given for Exempt School curriculum satisfactorily completed, as determined by the District. Credits may not necessarily be given for any Exempt School curriculum. In determining whether to give credits for Exempt School curriculum, the District may use a review of transcripts from prior schools attended, standardized tests, assessments, and teacher evaluations of student competency in the subject matter. The District may give credits for Exempt School curriculum if it is determined that the student demonstrates mastery of the subject matter and completion of course requirements.
- B. Grades awarded to an Exempt School Student for completion and evaluation of Exempt School curriculum shall not be utilized in the calculation of the student's grade point average or in determining class rank.

IV. Graduation Requirements

Exempt School Students enrolling in or returning to a district high school shall meet all of the graduation requirements of the District including the course and credit requirement as well as the District's Essential Learner Outcome (ELO) assessments in order to receive a district diploma.

	 Review of changes: Elementary School Fees Regular education summer school fees increase from \$115 to \$125 for 3 instructional hours per day for 12 days. The board of education previously approved this change and the student fees rule simply reflects this approved change. Middle School Fees Optional HAL field trip fee increases from \$20 to \$22. Add shoes to items provided in the All Sports category. Regular summer school fees increase from \$115 to \$125 for 3 instructional hours per day for 12 days- one course and from \$230 to \$250 for 6 instructional hours per day for 12 days- two courses. I. Parking Permit

1. Students wishing to park in school lots during the school day must obtain a parking permit for \$35.

2. Students who accrue parking lot violations during the school day may be charged up to \$10 per violation.

 - 1. PE: Students provide athletic shoes, socks, swimsuit, towel, elastic-waist shorts, t-shirt, and cold weather attire as needed.
 - 2. Lifeguarding: Students provide a CPR mouth guard.
- K. Musical Instruments (Optional, Non-Extracurricular) *
 - 1. Band & Strings: Students provide their own instruments.
- L. Music Items (Extracurricular) *
 - 1. Pep Band: Students provide a colored polo shirt (general description by band instructor).
 - 2. Band: Students may provide black or white leather shoes as generally described by band instructor.
- * The requirements marked with an asterisk (*) may be waived for students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunches.

IV. Student Fee Fund:

- A. The District shall establish a Student Fee Fund, which shall be a separate fund not funded by tax revenue.
- B. All money collected from students pursuant to §79-2,127(1) (related to extracurricular activities), §79-2,127(3) (related to post secondary education costs), and §79-2,127(8) (related to summer school and night school) shall be deposited into the Student Fee Fund. Money expended from such fund shall be for the purposes for which it was collected from students.

V. Waiver of Fees and/or Requirements:

- A. Students who qualify for free or reduced priced reduced-price lunches under the USDA child nutrition programs may have fees and requirements waived for the following:
 - 1. §79-2,133 Related to participation in extracurricular activities.
 - 2. §79-2,131 Related to optional music courses and extracurricular music activities.
- B. Participating in a free lunch program or a free or reduced-price lunch program shall not be required for students to qualify for a waiver of fees and/or requirements.
- C. Any qualified student desiring a waiver of fees and/or requirements shall complete and submit a Request for Waiver of Fees and/or Requirements form to the building principal (or his/her designee). Once the Request is processed, the principal (or his/her designee) shall inform the student as to whether the Request was approved or denied.

Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment

Student Fees

The District may require and collect fees or other funds from or on behalf of students or require students to furnish or provide materials, supplies, equipment, or attire consistent with the Public Elementary and Secondary Student Fee Authorization Act.

The Superintendent (or designee) shall promulgate the rules and/or procedures necessary for implementation of this policy. For purposes of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-2,133 and § 79-2,134, such rules and/or procedures, when adopted or approved, shall be incorporated in their entirety into this policy by this reference.

Annually, the school board shall hold a public hearing at a regular or special meeting of the Board on a proposed student fee policy, following a review of the amount of money collected from students pursuant to, and the use of waivers provided in, the student fee policy for the prior school year. The student fee policy shall be adopted by a majority vote of the school board and shall be published in the student handbook. The Board shall provide a copy of the student handbook to every student at no cost to the student.

Attached you will find single-sheet drawings that reflect the site grading and drainage plans, the floor plans, and the building elevation plans for the proposed additions to Upchurch Elementary School. 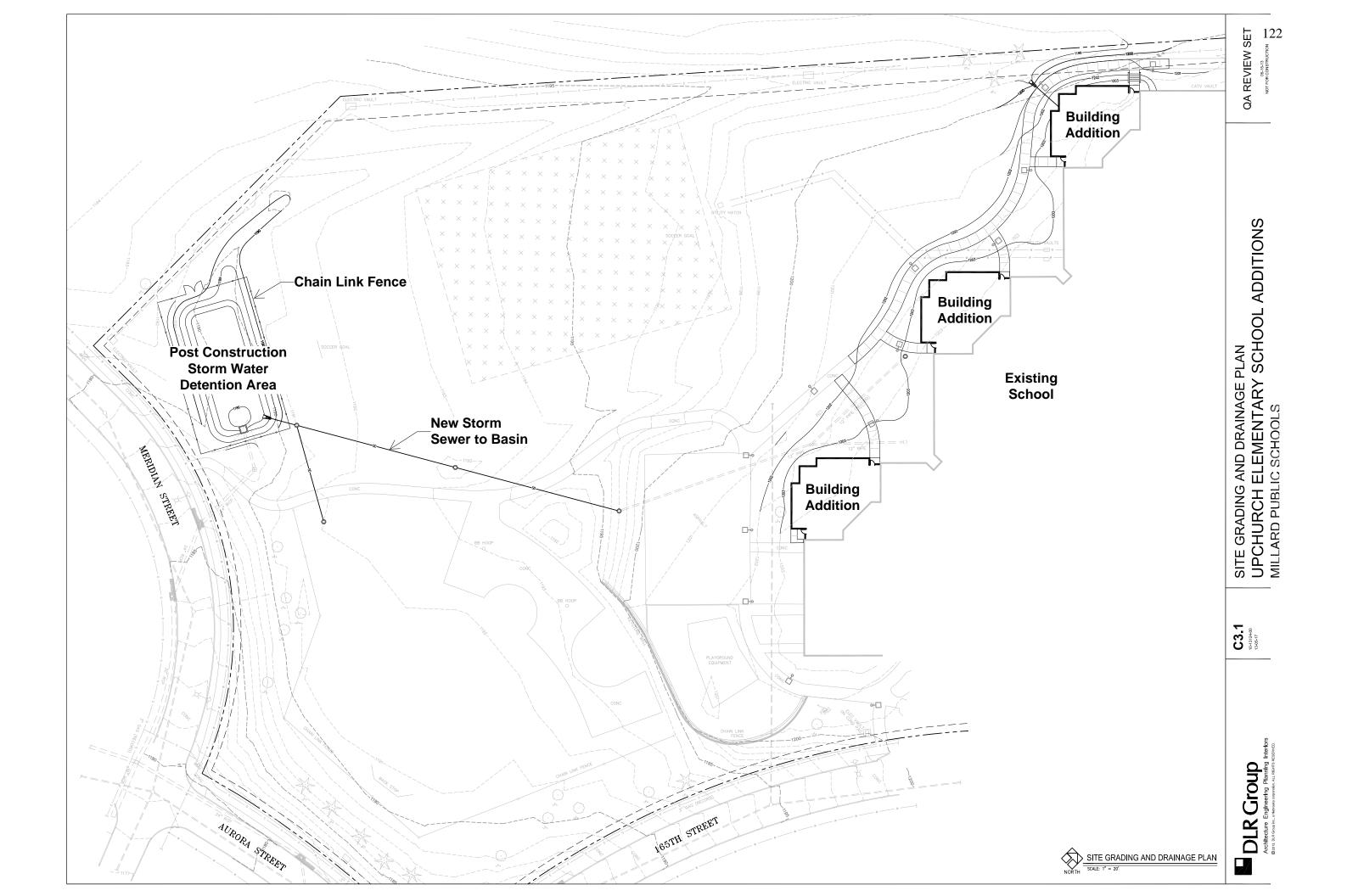
In the planning process, discussion was held with regard to the possibility of having an "accelerated" construction schedule that would complete the project in the shortest amount of time. An accelerated schedule could impact the cost. It could also affect the level of interference the project might have on classroom instruction in the existing areas of the building immediately adjacent to the construction work.

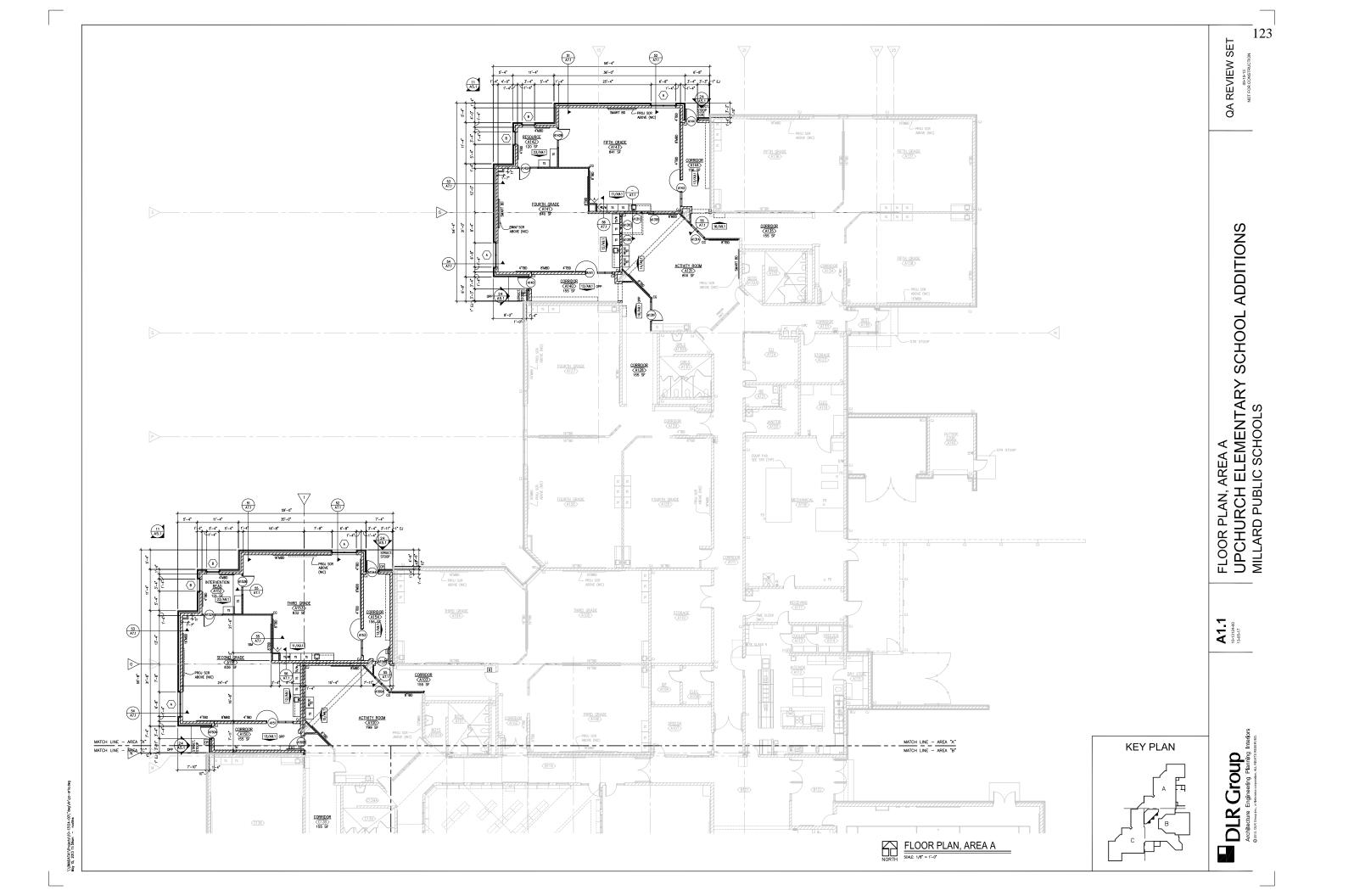
The construction documents being submitted for review by the Board contain two separate projects. One is related to a "traditional" construction schedule (i.e., a schedule with a project completion date shortly before the start of school in the fall of 2014). The other is related to an "accelerated" construction schedule (i.e., a schedule with a project completion date sometime during the 2013-14 school year). Contractors would have the option of submitting bids for either or both of these schedules.

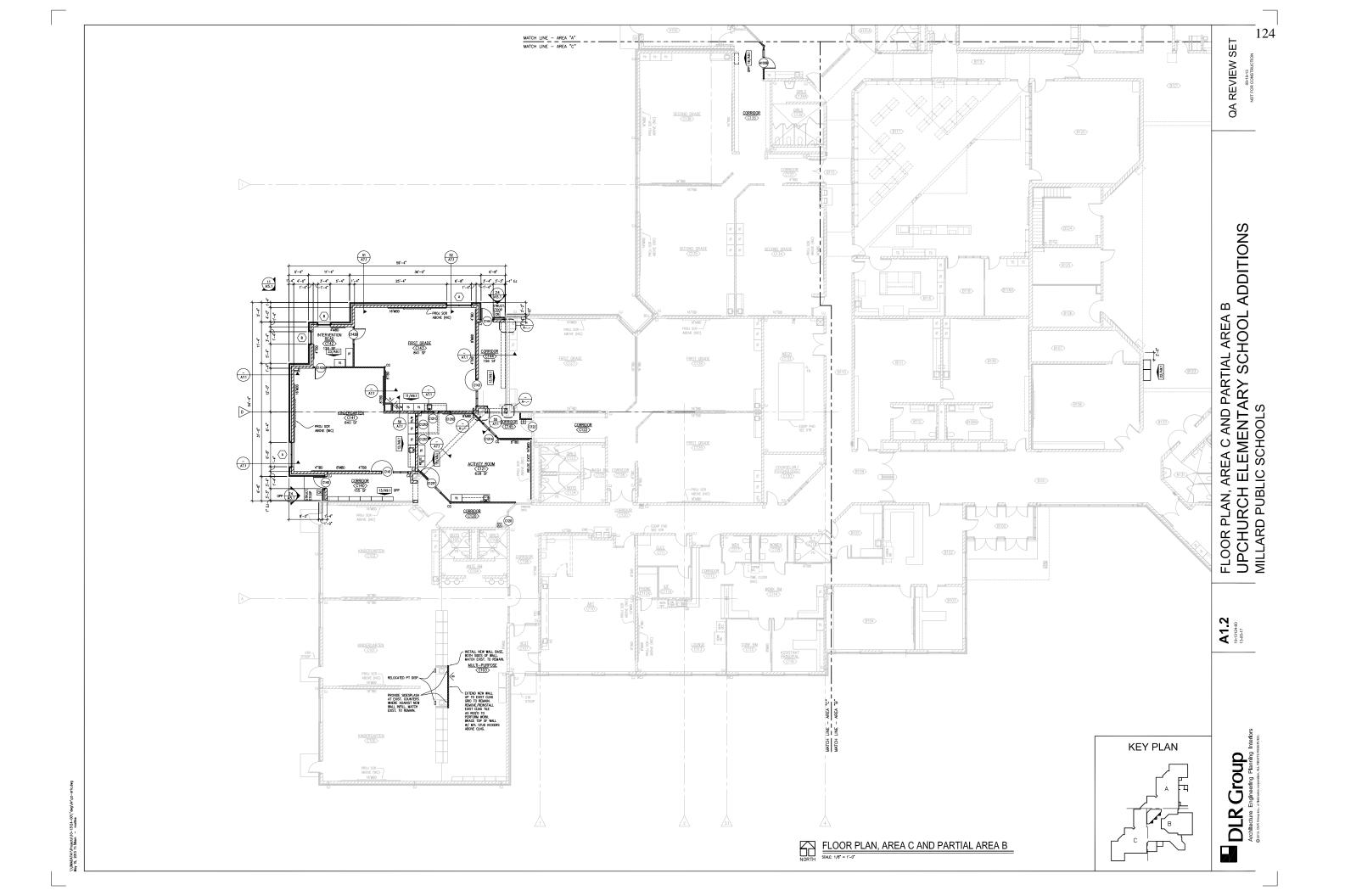
Ordinarily on projects of this nature, we would have construction documents completed and the project out for bids in the January-February time frame. Due to the bond issue election being held in May, we find ourselves in the position of approving the construction documents and sending the project out for bid in May-June. In order to recapture some of this lost time, we are proposing that the District procure certain "long lead time" items direct from the manufacturer and then assign those purchases to the successful bidder. (Note: If we don't do the early procurements and get them delivered, the project will be delayed since the successful bidder will wait until after the contract is awarded before submitting an order for these items.)

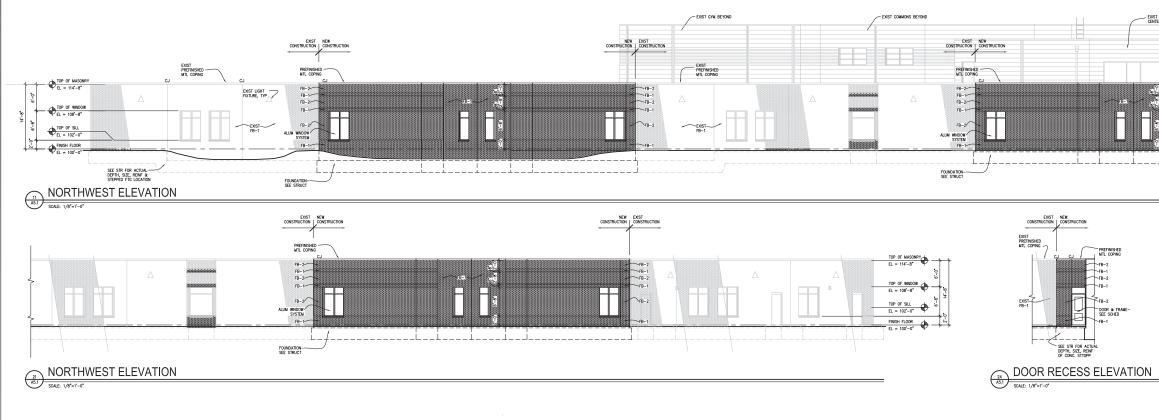
If the construction documents are approved at the board meeting on May 20th, the project will be put out for bids later that week and bids will be due back to the District on June 18th. In order to continue expediting the project schedule, we would like to request a special meeting of the Board on June 20th to award the contract so that the successful contractor will be able to start his mobilization process immediately.

By June 20th (assuming there will be a special board meeting) we will need to finalize the logistics related to classroom re-locations inside Upchurch during the time of construction. There may need to be one plan related to the "traditional" construction schedule and a different plan related to the "accelerated" construction schedule. It is possible that in order to accomplish an "accelerated" schedule there may need to be more disruption inside the building than there would be under a "traditional" schedule. The added disruption in existing classrooms may become a factor when considering whether to accept a "traditional" or an "accelerated" schedule when the contract is awarded on June 20th.

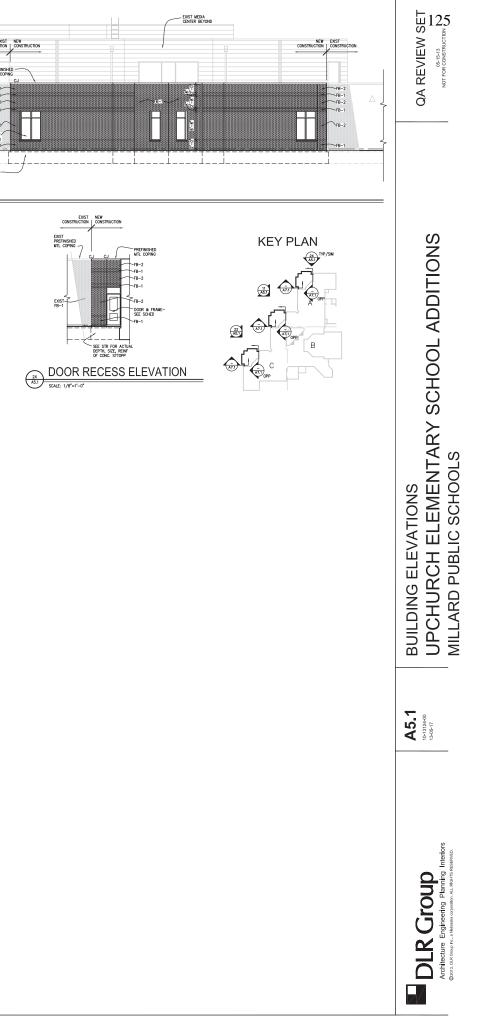

ACTION DESIRED: Approval of Recommendation and Contract

BACKGROUND: A recommendation from the high schools' activities and athletics directors and District Director of Activities and Athletics that the Board of Education accept ATC coverage in which Millard North would receive 1.8 FTE of ATC coverage per school year, Millard South would receive 1.4 FTE of ATC coverage per school year. The cost of described coverage is \$15,000 per FTE per year for a total annual cost of \$69,000 per year during the life of the contract. During the term of the contract, the cost per FTE remains constant; however, a review of the percentage of free and reduced price lunch students will be reviewed annually. If one Millard high school reaches the free and reduced price lunch student percentage of 30 percent or higher during the length of the proposed contract, the annual cost of the contract will be \$63,400 per contract year. The annual cost of the contract for the District is \$59,000 per year.

Four (4) of the six (6) certified athletic trainers currently assigned to Millard Public Schools are part-time employees of Alegent-Creighton Health. Three (3) of the six (6) trainers currently assigned to our schools also are employees of Millard Public Schools. The high schools hope to retain the services of the certified athletic trainers currently assigned to their schools by Alegent-Creighton Health.

RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the contract for the provision of ATC services to Millard North, Millard South, and Millard West High Schools be awarded to Alegent Creighton Health. The contract applies to the 2013-2014, 2014-2015, and 2015-2016 school years and that the Director of Employee Relations and Director of Activities and Athletics be authorized and directed to execute the contract as well as any and all other documents related to such contract.

STRATEGIC PLAN REFERENCE: N/A

IMPLICATIONS OF ADOPTION OR REJECTION: This recommendation will ensure that we have appropriate ATC coverage for all of the athletic practices and contests that occur at the Millard high schools. Rejection of the contract may cause the elimination of the type of ATC coverage at the Millard high schools that we have had for the past nine school years.

TIME LINE: The contract, if approved, is to take effect on August 1, 2013.

ALEGENT CREIGHTON HEALTH SPORTS MEDICINE CERTIFIED ATHLETIC TRAINING AGREEMENT

THIS SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into by and between Alegent Creighton Health d/b/a Alegent Creighton Health Sports Medicine ("Alegent"), and Douglas County School District No. 17, which is also commonly known as the Millard School District ("District").

RECITALS

- **A.** WHEREAS, Alegent is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the promotion of health and well being;
- **B.** WHEREAS, the District has established high school athletic programs as part of its educational mission and in connection therewith is desirous of receiving the services described herein; and
- **C.** WHEREAS, Alegent desires to provide certified athletic trainer services to the high schools of the District and sports physicals to the students of the District.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises hereinafter recited, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. <u>Provision of Services</u>. Alegent agrees to provide such services to District as set forth in the attached Exhibit A ("Services"), which is made a part of this Agreement.

2. Compensation. All terms and conditions agreed to by the parties regarding compensation for Services are set forth in the attached Exhibit B, which is made a part of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement, whether written or oral, nor any consideration in connection herewith contemplates or requires the referral of any patient to any medical facility. This Agreement is not intended to influence the judgment of the students in choosing the medical facility appropriate for the proper treatment and care, the parties agree that the students and their families will be directed to seek additional care or medical treatment through their primary care provider. No party shall receive any compensation or remuneration for referrals, if any. The parties specifically do not intend to violate the federal (or any state's) Anti-Fraud and Abuse provisions [42 U.S.C. 1320a-7b(b)] or the Physician Ownership and Referral Act [42 U.S.C. 1395nn] (commonly known as the Stark Act). The parties intend to comply with the Safe Harbor for Personal Service Agreements contained at 42 C.F.R. 1001.952(d) and the personal service exemption to the Stark Act. If Alegent deems it necessary to amend this Agreement as provided in this Section and the amendment is unacceptable to District, District may choose to terminate this Agreement without cause. In the event the District is not subject to the laws, regulations, etc. referenced in this provision, then this paragraph shall be null and void.

3. <u>Term and Termination</u>.

- **A.** <u>**Term.**</u> The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) school years, commencing on the 1st day of August, 2013 and terminating on the 31st day of July, 2016.
- **B.** <u>Termination with Cause.</u> Either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon written notice of such termination to the other party in the event that: (1) either party is in material breach of any provision of this Agreement and the breaching party has not cured the breach within thirty (30) days of receipt of notice from the non-breaching party; (2) the business of either party is terminated or suspended; (3) a petition for bankruptcy is filed by or against either party; (4) a receiver is appointed on account of either party's insolvency; or (5) if any assignment is made of either party's business for the benefit of its creditors.

C. <u>Termination Without Cause</u>. This Agreement may be terminated without cause by either party at any time upon sixty (60) days' prior written notice to the other.

D. <u>Services Upon Termination</u>. In the event of termination of this Agreement without cause at the sole discretion of District, Alegent shall continue to provide Services as directed by District for the period of time from the receipt of notice of termination until the effective date of termination.

4. <u>Insurance and Indemnification</u>. In order to adequately insure themselves for liability arising out of the activities to be performed under this Agreement, Alegent and District each agree to obtain and maintain in force and effect liability insurance to insure themselves and their respective personnel for liability arising out of activities to be performed under, or in any manner related to, this Agreement.

District agrees to provide general liability insurance for District, and if applicable, its staff, agents, and employees. Alegent agrees to provide professional liability and general liability insurance for Alegent, its staff, agents and employees. Alegent shall maintain professional liability insurance in the minimum amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) aggregate. Alegent and District shall each maintain comprehensive general liability insurance in the minimum amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) aggregate. Alegent and District shall each maintain comprehensive general liability insurance in the minimum amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) aggregate. Prior to the commencement of this Agreement, the parties agree to furnish to the other appropriate certificates of insurance or proof of self insurance. Both Alegent and District agree that such insurance may not be revoked, reduced or changed in a material way without at least thirty (30) days' advance written notice to the other party. To the extent of their separate and respective policies of insurance as provided in this Section, Alegent and District agree to indemnify and hold the other party harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims and defenses arising from or relating to the Services and the actions of their agents, employees and independent contractors.

5. <u>Excluded Provider Warranty</u>. Each party hereby represents and warrants that it is not now and at no time has been excluded from participation in any federally funded health care program, including Medicare and Medicaid. Each party hereby agrees to immediately notify the other of any threatened, proposed or actual exclusion from any federally funded health care program, including Medicare and Medicaid. If applicable, each party further represents and warrants that

none of its employees are now and at no time have been excluded from participation in any federally funded health care program, including Medicare and Medicaid, and that if an employee of one party becomes so excluded, such employee shall be terminated. In the event that either party is excluded from participation in any federally funded health care program during the term of this Agreement, this Agreement shall, as of the effective date of such exclusion or breach, automatically terminate. Each party shall indemnify the other for any and all damages arising from this Agreement which result from its exclusion from any federally funded health care program, including Medicare and Medicaid. In the event the District is not subject to the laws, regulations, etc. referenced in this provision, then this paragraph shall be null and void.

6. <u>Access to Books and Records</u>. Until the expiration of four (4) years after the furnishing of the Services provided under this Agreement, each party shall make available to the Secretary, United States Department of Health and Human Services, and the United States Comptroller General, and their representatives, a copy of this Agreement and such books, documents and records of that party that are necessary to certify the nature and extent of any cost incurred by either party. If a party carries out the duties of the Agreement through a subcontract worth Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or more over a twelve (12) month period with a related organization, the subcontract shall contain a clause placing the same obligations on subcontractor as this clause places on that party. Alegent shall immediately notify District of its receipt of any such request for this Agreement and any other books, documents and records and shall provide District with copies of any such materials. In the event the District is not subject to the provision of 42 U.S.C. 1395x(v)(1)(I) and 42 C.F.R. 420.300 et seq. or relevant regulations, this paragraph shall be null and void.

7. <u>Independent Contractor Relationship</u>. None of the provisions of this Agreement are intended to create any relationship between the parties other than that of independent persons or entities contracting with each other solely for the purpose of effecting the provisions of this Agreement. Neither of the parties, nor any of their respective officers, directors, employees or agents, shall have the authority to bind the other or shall be deemed or construed to be the agent, employee or representative of the other except as may be specifically provided herein. Neither party, nor any of their employees or agents, shall have any claim under this Agreement or otherwise against the other party for Social Security benefits, workers' compensation, disability benefits, unemployment insurance, vacation, sick pay or any other employee benefits of any kind.

8. <u>Confidentiality</u>. Alegent acknowledges the confidentiality of student records in accordance with state and federal laws; Alegent agrees to maintain the confidentiality of such records that Alegent may be given access to under this Agreement.

9. <u>Effect of Government Regulation</u>. Alegent shall have the right to terminate or amend this Agreement, without liability, to comply with any legal order, ruling, opinion, procedure, policy, or other guidance issued, by any federal or state agency, or to comply with any provision of law, regulation, or any requirement of accreditation, tax-exemption, federally-funded health care program participation or licensure which: (i) invalidates or is inconsistent with the provisions of this Agreement; (ii) would cause a party to be in violation of the law; (iii) jeopardizes the tax-exempt status of Alegent, or any affiliate of Alegent; (iv) jeopardizes the tax-exempt status of

any bonds issued for the benefit of Alegent, or any affiliate of Alegent; or (v) jeopardizes the good standing status of licensure, accreditation or participation in any federally-funded health care program, including the Medicare and Medicaid programs, of Alegent, or any affiliate of Alegent.

10. <u>E-Verify</u>. Alegent's hiring process includes compliance with the E-Verify Program. Alegent agrees they will not subcontract any Certified Athletic Training Services provided under this Agreement without the prior written permission of District.

11. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement shall, for any reason, be found to be unenforceable or illegal, this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, except for the unenforceable or illegal provision.

12. <u>**Governing Law.**</u> This Agreement shall be construed under and shall be governed by the laws of the State where the services are provided and, to the extent applicable, the Internal Revenue Code and its Regulations, and the governmental reimbursement statutes and regulations.

13. <u>**Taxes**</u>. Alegent is a nonprofit corporation and exempt from sales or use taxes or any tax in lieu thereof imposed by any government or governmental agency under Nebraska Sales Tax Exemption No. 47-0757164. Alegent shall provide District, upon request, a certificate of exemption. Alegent shall be responsible for all employment and income reporting and/or withholding for Alegent's employees.

14. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither this Agreement nor any rights or duties under this Agreement may be assigned by either party except upon written agreement signed by both parties.

15. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may not be amended except upon written agreement signed by both parties.

16. <u>Notices</u>. All notices and other communications required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be considered given and received when (a) personally delivered to the party, (b) delivered by courier, (c) delivered by facsimile, or (d) deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, properly addressed to a party at the address set forth below, or at such other address as such party shall have specified by notice given in accordance with the provisions of this Section:

17. <u>**Headings</u>**. The headings to the various sections of this Agreement have been inserted for convenience only and shall not modify, define, limit, or expand express provisions of this Agreement.</u>

18. <u>Waiver</u>. Waiver of a breach of or default under any term or provision of this Agreement by either party, by course of dealing or otherwise, shall not be deemed a waiver of any other breach of or default under the same or a different provision of this Agreement.

19. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire written agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement and supersedes any prior written agreements of the parties regarding the subject matter of this Agreement.

20. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together will constitute one and the same instrument.

21. <u>Successors</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties named herein and their respective successors and permitted assigns.

EXHIBIT "A" SERVICES

1. Services. Alegent shall provide the District with the following Services:

a. Alegent shall provide Licensed and Certified Athletic Trainers to District, consisting of 1.8 FTE of certified athletic trainer services per year (August 1 to July 31) for Millard North High School; 1.4 FTE of certified athletic trainer services per year (August 1 to July 31) for Millard South High School, and 1.4 FTE of certified athletic trainer services per year (August 1 to July 31) for Millard West High School, commencing August 1, 2013.

b. Alegent shall provide Certified Athletic Trainers to home games, training room coverage, home tournament coverage for any level or any home varsity districts coverage, practice coverage, first aid and emergency care, treatment of injuries (subject to physician supervision and modality limitations), Injury assessment, including making appropriate recommendations for medical evaluation and treatment as warranted by the circumstances, injury reporting, development and supervision of a student trainer program, and any other services which are agreed to by Alegent and by District.

c. All services will be provided in accordance with the standards of the National Athletic Trainers Association and within the scope of practice of athletic trainers. All Alegent Certified Athletic Trainers are licensed pursuant to the Athletic Training Practice Act, Neb. Rev. Stat.§ 38-401 et. Seq. ("Act") as amended. Alegent will provide the Services under this Agreement subject to the scope of practice limits of Certified Athletic Trainers imposed by the Act.

d. Make appropriate recommendations for medical evaluation and treatment as warranted by the circumstances. The referral will be made to the student's personal physician or other provider or facility preferred by the student, parent or guardian.

2. Alegent Rights and District Responsibilities.

a. District shall provide all necessary medical supplies. In the event District requests Alegent to provide additional supplies, the District shall pay the costs of such supplies.

b. District shall provide Alegent with the sports competition schedule together with a practice schedule to guarantee coverage for events and practices at least one (1) month prior to the start of the season.

c. Additional programs and services offered by Alegent are available with a negotiated fee for service.

d. Alegent shall pay the cost for and provide continuing education and specialization for the Certified Athletic Trainers, including, but not limited to SportsmetricsTM (ACL preventative training), CSCS (strength and conditioning), National Athletic Trainer Conferences, and Sports Medicine Symposiums.

e. The individuals to be assigned as Certified Athletic Trainers to District will be determined and selected by Alegent; provided however, the District may in its sole discretion and at any time direct Alegent to remove the individual from providing services under this Agreement.

EXHIBIT "B" FEES FOR SERVICES

Alegent will contract with volunteers to provide Pre-Participation Sports Physicals at the rate of \$20.00 per athletic physical examination (paid by each student-athlete to Alegent). Three physical sessions are hosted each summer for the Millard Public School student-athletes grades 7-12. Physicians from Alegent Creighton Clinic and other community healthcare providers will assist with these physicals as well as Alegent Physical Therapists and Athletic Trainers. Physicals consist of height, weight, blood pressure, musculoskeletal screen, heart and lung assessments and an orthopedic check-up.

On the anniversary of the Statistic Review Date, Alegent will pull the most current available published data from the website for each school in the District that is utilizing Certified Athletic Training Services and the annual fee will be modified according to the schedule above. The new fee will commence on the succeeding August 1.

Annual Renewal Fees will be adjusted based upon the number of FTEs provided to the District which shall not exceed 4.6 FTEs. Alegent shall determine the scheduling of its Certified Athletic Trainers to meet the allocated FTEs provided under this Agreement. Several of the Certified Athletic trainers are part-time employees and will only be available a maximum of twenty eight hours per week. Alegent shall be responsible for scheduling and monitoring the hours of its employees based on the schools in the District's needs.

Alegent Creighton Health will invoice District on a monthly basis. Such monthly invoices shall detail the number of hours worked by each Certified Athletic Trainer. Time devoted to the preparation of such invoices shall not be compensated for under the provisions of this Agreement. The District agrees that for such invoices received by the 19th day of any month,

it will remit by the 15th day of the following month the amount due consistent with the payment requirements set forth in this Exhibit B.

THIS HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFIED ATHLETIC TRAINER AND PHYSICIAN SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2013 by and between ____, a Nebraska corporation ("____") and Douglas County School District No. 17, which is also commonly known as the Millard School District ("District").

WHEREAS, the District has established high school athletic programs as part of its educational mission and in connection therewith is desirous of receiving the services ("Basic Services") of certified athletic trainers ("Certified Trainers"); and

WHEREAS, _____ has in its employ, or otherwise under contract to it, Certified Trainers who are willing to provide certain services with respect to athletic training and other enhancements to the District's high school athletic programs as well as supplying services of physicians ("Physician's Services") all as specified in this Agreement (the Basic Services and the Physician's Services are collectively referred to as the "Services").

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises hereinafter contained, the District and _____ agree as follows:

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall commence on the <u>lst</u> day of <u>August</u>, 2013 and shall end on the <u>day of July</u>, <u>unless earlier terminated as is immediately hereinafter</u> provided. Either the District or <u>may terminate this Agreement upon submitting</u> sixty (60) days written notice of termination to the other.
- 2. _____has in its employ, or under contract to it, Certified Trainers who are licensed pursuant to <u>the Athletic Training Practice Act</u>. Neb. Rev. Stat. §<u>38-401</u> et seq. ("Act") as amended. Certified Trainers shall furnish the Basic Services under this Agreement subject to the scope of practice limits of Certified Trainers imposed by the Act. The Basic Services to be furnished are those specified on Exhibit "A" hereto.

- 3. _____has in its employ, or under contract to it, physicians who are licensed to practice medicine in the State of Nebraska. The Physician Services are those specified on Exhibit "A". If athletic physical examinations are to be furnished hereunder pursuant to Exhibit "A", _____ will provide, as appropriate, male and female physicians at a location and time determined by ______ for the purpose of conducting athletic physical examinations and providing certain other coverage. All physicians furnishing Physician Services shall observe protocols with respect to the wearing of examination gloves and the like, as shall be established from time to time by _____. No athletic physical examinations so conducted shall have as a component the collection of urine specimens.
- 4. If indicated on Exhibit "A", _____ will assist the District in the development of a student trainer program. Supervision of student/trainers shall be the responsibility of the Certified Athletic Trainers assigned to the District, in accordance with applicable law and District Activities Guidelines regarding the Supervision of Athletic Training Student Aides.
- 5. The fees for the Services to be paid by the District to _____ are those specified on Exhibit "B" hereto. All fees collected from students by the District, in association with the Services specified on Exhibit "B", if any, shall be remitted to _____ within thirty (30) days of the date of billing by _____ to the District, or at the request of the District, _____ shall bill and collect from students of the District any fees associated with the Physician Services and may remit to the District a service charge with respect to the overhead of the District with respect to Physician Services.
- 7. In no event shall the District have any duty or obligation to recommend or refer any student or to recommend or refer any patient to physicians furnishing Physician Services or to _____, and _____ understands that it is the policy of the District to refer students to his or her regular physician.
- 8. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute _____ or its Certified Trainers or physicians furnishing Services under this Agreement as joint venturers, partners, agents, or employees of the District. _____ and its Certified Trainers and physicians shall instead be independent contractors.

- 10. It is agreed and understood by and between the District and ______ that all information contained in the District's records regarding students and staff is confidential. ______agrees that it will abide by the policies and rules of the District, as well as all applicable statutes and regulations, with respect to the confidentiality of student and staff records. ______ shall not disclose the contents of any student and staff records in its possession or control except as required under the terms of this Agreement, the laws of the State of Nebraska, federal statutes and regulations, and the rules and regulations as promulgated by the Nebraska Department of Education.
- 11. To the extent of its policies of insurance as provided in this paragraph, _____ will indemnify and hold the District harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims and defenses arising from or relating to the Services and the actions of its agents, employees, and independent contractors. In connection therewith, _____ agrees to carry, or cause to be carried (a) policies of general and professional liability insurance in amounts and with companies licensed to do business in the State of Nebraska and deemed necessary by it; (b) policies of medical malpractice insurance covering the Certified Trainers for liability claims arising from their actions with companies licensed to do business in the State of Nebraska and in an amount deemed necessary by it but with a minimum coverage of at least \$2,000,000.00; and (c) workers' compensation insurance as prescribed by state workers' compensation laws.
- 12. To the extent of its policies of insurance as provided in this paragraph, the District will indemnify and hold ______ harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims and defenses arising from or relating to its activities and those of its agents, employees, and independent contractors. In connection therewith, the District agrees to carry, or cause to be carried, appropriate policies of general liability insurance and specific coverages as shall be necessary for sound business practices of the District.

13. Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 4-114 ______ is required and hereby agrees to use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska. BACKGROUND: A recommendation from the high schools' activities and athletics directors and District Director of Activities and Athletics that the Board of Education accept physician coverage from Lakeside Orthopedics for Millard North, Millard South, and Millard West high schools. The ATC contract no longer includes physician services as part of that contract and the high schools want to retain the physician services that they have had in past years. There is no cost associated with the physician services contract and as noted in the proposed contract, the District has no obligation to refer services to Lakeside, which is similar to what has been included in past contracts with Alegent, which prior to the upcoming school year also covered physician services.

RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the contract for the provision of physician services to Millard North, Millard South, and Millard West High Schools be awarded to Lakeside Orthopedics. The contract applies to the 2013-2014, 2014-2015, and 2015-2016 school years and that the Director of Activities and Athletics be authorized and directed to execute the contract as well as any and all other documents related to such contract.

IMPLICATIONS OF ADOPTION OR REJECTION: This recommendation will ensure that we have appropriate physician coverage for all of the varsity football contests that occur at the Millard high schools. HIGH SCHOOL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS HIGH SCHOOL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2013 by and between Lakeside Orthopedics, P.C., a Nebraska professional corporation ("Lakeside") and Douglas County School District No. 17, which is also commonly known as the Millard School District ("District").

WHEREAS, the District has established high school athletic programs as part of its educational mission and in connection therewith is desirous of receiving those services ("Services") described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, Lakeside has in its employ, or under contract to it, orthopedists ("Providers") who are willing to provide the Services to the District's high school athletic programs all as specified in this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises hereinafter contained, the District and Lakeside agree as follows:

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall commence on the 1st day of August, 2013 and shall end on the 31st day of July, 2016, unless earlier terminated as is immediately hereinafter provided. Either the District or Lakeside may terminate this Agreement upon submitting sixty (60) days written notice of termination to the other.
- 2. The Providers, to the extent applicable, shall be duly licensed to practice their specialty in the State of Nebraska. All Providers furnishing Services shall observe protocols with respect to the wearing of examination gloves and the like, as shall be established from time to time by Lakeside. Lakeside shall be the exclusive provider of the Services.
- 3. Lakeside shall provide the Services at no charge.
- 4. In no event shall the District have any duty or obligation to recommend or refer any student or to recommend or refer any patient to Providers furnishing Services, and Lakeside understands that it is the policy of the District to refer students to his or her regular physician.
- 5. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute Lakeside furnishing Services under this Agreement as joint venturers, partners, agents, or employees of the District. Lakeside and its Providers shall instead be independent contractors.
- 6. Lakeside shall be responsible for all employee wages and compensation, and for federal, state, and local taxes, including estimated taxes and social security, and for all employment and income reporting and/or withholding for Lakeside employees.
- 7. It is agreed and understood by and between the District and Lakeside that all information contained in the District's records regarding students and staff is confidential. Lakeside agrees that it will abide by the policies and rules of the District, as well as all applicable

statutes and regulations, with respect to the confidentiality of student and staff records. Lakeside shall not disclose the contents of any student and staff records in its possession or control except as required under the terms of this Agreement, the laws of the State of Nebraska, federal statutes and regulations, and the rules and regulations as promulgated by the Nebraska Department of Education.

- 8. To the extent of its policies of insurance as provided in this paragraph, Lakeside will indemnify and hold the District harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims and defenses arising from or relating to the Services and the actions of its agents, employees, and independent contractors. In connection therewith, Lakeside agrees to carry, or cause to be carried (a) policies of general and professional liability insurance covering the Providers for liability claims arising from their actions in amounts and with companies licensed to do business in the State of Nebraska and deemed necessary by it; provided, however, with respect to the professional liability insurance, Lakeside will maintain the limits necessary to participate in the Nebraska Excess Liability Fund; and (b) workers' compensation insurance as prescribed by state workers' compensation laws.
- 9. To the extent of its policies of insurance as provided in this paragraph, the District will indemnify and hold Lakeside harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims and defenses arising from or relating to its activities and those of its agents, employees, and independent contractors. In connection therewith, the District agrees to carry, or cause to be carried, appropriate policies of general liability insurance and specific coverages as shall be necessary for sound business practices of the District.
- 10. Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 4-114 Lakeside is required and hereby agrees to use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska. A federal immigration verification system means the electronic verification of the work authorization program authorized by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, 8 U.S.C. 1324a, known as the E-Verify Program, or an equivalent federal program designated by the United States Department of Homeland Security or other federal agency authorized to verify the work eligibility status of a newly hired employee. Lakeside is further required and hereby agrees to include the same provision in every contract with subcontractors which will be physically performing services within the State of Nebraska in conjunction with Lakeside's Agreement with the District.
- 11. District shall recognize Lakeside and its Providers as the exclusive provider of the Services. Lakeside shall have the right to publicly advertise and promote its relationship with the District, at Lakeside's expense and with prior written approval of the District.

Legislative Update May 6, 2013

Legislative Issues

- There are 10 days left in this session.
- LB 407 was advanced to Final Reading after an attempt by Senator Krist to amend the bill. The bill
 contains an averaging adjustment, instruction time allowance and teacher education allowance. Recent
 models indicated that the increase in state aid would be about 11%.
- LB 585 was placed on Final Reading. The bill will reduce the total extra levy authority to 2 cents down from 3 cents. It changes transportation and supports early childhood programs for students in poverty across the Learning Community.
- LB 553 was vetoed by the Governor and his veto was overridden.

Bills of Interest

LB 346 – Senator Kolowski - Authorize school districts to levy a tax and exceed budget authority for school security measures. This bill allows districts to levy 1 cent outside both lids for security measures. This bill remains in committee. It is not prioritized at this time.

LB 407 – Senator Sullivan - Change calculation provisions under the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act. This bill as amended includes an averaging adjustment in 2014-15 and allowances for instructional time and teacher education among other changes in the TEEOSA calculation.

LB 553 – This bill changes school employees' retirement provisions for new employees in the system starting next year. It changes the way retirement is calculated as a way to put the system on solid financial ground. Contribution rates will remain as they are this year at 9.78%.

LB575 – Senator Harr - Provide for professional development training for school board and learning community coordinating council members. This bill requires school board members to receive training on, their duties, public records, education standards, fiduciary duties, financial planning, labor law, ethics assessments and demographics. This bill remains in committee. This bill was not prioritized.

LB 585 – Senator Smith - Provide, change, and eliminate provisions relating to learning community. This bill as amended will reduce the levy authority from 3 cents to 2. It reduces transportation and includes early childhood programs for children in poverty in all districts.

LB 640 – Senator Hadley - Change provisions relating to the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act. This bill was killed in committee. This bill contains the "temporary aid adjustment" factor that keeps the formula intact and allows a temporary aid adjustment for use in years that the formula cannot be fully funded.

National News

ESEA Re-Authorization Looks Promising

This afternoon, AASA's Executive Director, Dan Domenech, was briefed by key Senate Education Committee staffers on their plans for ESEA re-authorization. The Senate Committee hopes to put forth a bill similar to what passed through the Committee in a bi-partisan fashion in Oct 2011. AASA supported the 2011 bill because it eliminated some of the most problematic aspects of ESEA: AYP, AMOs, SES, and the arbitrary 100% proficiency goal. However, we have not seen the new bill and on Friday, Noelle Ellerson sent a spirited letter to Senate

Committee cautioning them to stay away from federal performance targets and give districts more time to implement new standards and assessments before accountability measures take effect. It should be noted that the work happening in the Senate this Congress is not bi-partisan; the bill has been drafted by the Senate Democratic Committee staff exclusively.

Last week the House Education Committee held an ESEA hearing on local and state accountability that featured AASA member and Minnesota 2012 Superintendent of the Year Chris Richardson. It is expected that the Committee will introduce their version of ESEA later this month. AASA supported the House ESEA package of bills last Congress and are pleased that the Committee is combining them into a single bill this Congress. Unsurprisingly, House Republicans were not able to get bi-partisan agreement to move forward with ESEA, and it is expected their bill will be nearly identical to what was introduced last Congress ensuring that all the Democrats on the Committee will oppose it.

While the House and Senate bills are likely to have major differences when it comes to funding flexibility, comparability, assessments for students with disabilities and school climate and safety, AASA is cautiously optimistic that these bills can move to the floor and then to conference for a complete re-authorization.

Funding Update: Sequestration and FY14 Appropriations

There's unfortunately little to report in terms of additional funding for IDEA and Title I in the next appropriations cycle and relief for districts from the sequester. While the FAA was able to receive a reprieve from the sequester to soften the impact of the agency's cuts on its employment patterns, no further action has been taken or considered for other aspects of the federal budget, although many members of Congress have pet programs they would like to see exempted.

While both the House and Senate have passed budgets, there is little momentum for a budget conference. As for appropriations, both the House and Senate are expected to start marking up appropriations bills in June, but don't look for either chamber to mark up the LHHS appropriation bill (where education is funded) until late in the summer. As it stands right now, the drastic differences in the House and Senate budgets (including the treatment of sequestration and variance in overall spending) put us on a path toward a continuing resolution. It is highly unlikely that Congress will be able to wrap their work in time for the start of FY14 (Oct 1).
