### **Drug-Free Workplace**

4173.1

In order to implement the drug-free workplace policy of the District, the District shall implement the following rules:

- I. <u>The District shall Ppublish</u> a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the District's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation of such prohibition;
- II. The District shall Eestablish a drug-free awareness program to inform employees about:
  - A. The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
  - B. The District's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
  - C. Any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and
  - D. The penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace;
- III. The District shall Pprovide each employee with a copy of the statement set forth in paragraph one Section I.
- IV. <u>The District shall Nnotify</u> each employee in the statement required by <u>paragraph one Section I</u> that as a condition of employment, the employee will:
  - A. Abide by the terms of the statement; and
  - B. Notify the <u>employer District</u> of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than <u>five (5) one business</u> days after such conviction.
- V. <u>The District shall Nnotify</u> any federal or state agency for whom grant money is received within ten (10) days after receiving notice under <u>subparagraph four (b) Section IV(B)</u> from an <u>employer employee</u> or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction.
- VI. The District shall Ttake one of the following actions within thirty (30) days of receiving notice under subparagraph four (b) Section IV(B), with respect to any employee who is convicted;
  - A. Take appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
  - B. Require such employee to participate satisfactorily in <u>a drug</u> abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a federal, state, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.

VII. Make a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of the above rules.

### **Human Resources**

Drug-Free Workplace: Alcohol 4173.2

### General

I. \_\_\_\_\_The purpose of this Rule is to establish standards of conduct for employees as to the use and possession of alcohol while in the course of their employment or in the discharge of their duties and eliminate the unlawful use or distribution of alcohol on District property. The This Rule also applies to acts or any conduct which is illegal under federal, state, or local law. All Millard Public School District employees are covered by this Rule. Violation of this Rule shall result in disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment.

II. This Rule shall be administered in accordance with and subject to all applicable <u>dD</u>istrict grievance policies and procedures contained either in collective bargaining agreements or policies and rules of the District, and pursuant to all constitutional rights, state and federal, to which employees are entitled.

<u>III.</u> The name of any employee violating this Rule shall not be released to the public unless the employee requests an open hearing with the Board-of Education; provided, however, that the Superintendent may notify law enforcement authorities of any suspected violation of criminal statutes or ordinances.

#### **Definitions**

- IV. The following definitions shall apply for purposes of the Rule.
  - I. A. Alcohol or alcoholic beverage shall mean any substance subject to the jurisdiction of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission and those beverages and alcoholic liquors defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. section 53-103 (Supp. 1989) the Nebraska Liquor Control Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 53-103.
  - H. B. Distribution shall mean any delivery, sale, transfer, handling, transmitting, administering, giving, or otherwise making available, alcohol or alcoholic beverages.
  - III. C. "Intoxication" and/or "Under the influence" shall mean for the purposes of this policy Rule, that the employee is impaired and/or affected by an alcoholic substance, or the combination of a drug and alcohol, in any detectable manner. The symptoms of influence are not confined to those consistent with misbehavior or to obvious impairment of physical or mental ability such as slurred speech or difficulty in maintaining balance. A determination of influence can be established by professional opinion, a scientifically valid test and, in some cases, by a lay person's opinion.
  - IV. D. Possession shall mean on the employee's person, in the employee's personal belongings, including any beverage containers, or under the employee's reasonable control. A dDistrict employee shall be deemed in possession of alcohol, if he or she has alcohol, on his or her person, or under his or her control.
  - ¥. E. Employee Assistance Program (E.A.P.) shall mean an Employee Assistance Program provided by the Millard Public Schools District for the benefit of its employees.

### V. Prohibited Conduct The following conduct is prohibited:

- **L.** A. Reporting to work, performing job duties or conducting any <u>dD</u>istrict business while intoxicated or otherwise under the influence of alcohol is strictly prohibited and shall subject the District employee to immediate discipline actions as hereinafter provided. Conduct of an employee giving rise to <u>such a</u> reasonable suspicion <u>that the employee is under the influence</u> shall be reported to the employee's immediate supervisor <u>and documented in a report. or the Human Resources Department.</u>
- II. B. Using or distributing The possession, consumption, or use of alcohol to minors, while on dDistrict property, while performing job duties, or while in the course of the employees' employment, at a dDistrict sponsored student event, or at a student activity in which the District or other school districts participate, is strictly prohibited and shall subject the District employee to immediate discipline actions as hereinafter provided.

- <u>C.</u> The Distribution of alcohol to minors is strictly prohibited and shall be subject to immediate discipline actions as hereinafter provided.
- VI. Procedure In cases of suspected violations of this Rule, the following actions and procedures shall be implemented.
- A. Any employee suspected of being in violation of this Rule shall be interviewed by his or her immediate supervisor or administrator as soon as possible to determine whether the employee is in violation of this Rule or any provisions of this Rule. If necessary, the immediate supervisor or administrator will may summon a second supervisor or administrator to be present at the interview and to assist in the determination. If the supervisor or administrator determines that there is a reasonable suspicion that the employee may be in violation of any provision of this Rule, the supervisor or administrator shall immediately notify refer the employee to the Associate Assistant Superintendent for of Human Resources, or Designee, who shall interview the employee for further investigation. The Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources or designee may interview the suspected employee prior to the immediate supervisor if circumstances warrant.
- B. If, upon further investigation, the Associate Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources; or Ddesignee, has a reasonable suspicion that the employee has violated this Rule, he/she shall suspend the employee with pay from his or her duties and, if the employee is suspected of being under the influence of alcohol, may direct that the employee be tested for alcohol. Employees are required to submit to alcohol testing upon a reasonable suspicion of a violation of this Rule direction from the Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources or designee. The employee shall be advised of the required alcohol testing by the Associate Assistant Superintendent for of Human Resources; or Ddesignee, and be transported to a location for the administration of such required test.
- C. The results of the breath-alcohol test may be used to provide the employee an opportunity to exonerate himself/herself. If the employee tests negative for alcohol, the employee will not be subject to disciplinary measures related to violation of the District's alcohol policy and shall be returned to duty. If a test of an employee's body fluid and/or breath positively detects the presence of alcohol, the results may be confirmed in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. § 48-1903 prior to being used against an employee in any disciplinary or administrative action.
- D. Refusal to submit to a breath test may be offered in evidence in any grievance proceeding related to the disciplinary action for violation of the District's Alcohol Policy. The employee may be subject to disciplinary action based on violations of other district policies and/or rules.

Breath test devices will only be administered by personnel who are properly trained.

Breath test devices will be tested for accuracy and calibrated as necessary pursuant to the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles guidelines.

- E. The Any employee who is subject to disciplinary action under this Rule shall, within a reasonable time, be provided a written statement setting forth the specific reasons for such disciplinary action specifically stating why the employee was suspended. The Notice written statement shall contain a written acknowledgment of receipt signed by the employee. Should the employee refuse to sign the acknowledgment of receipt, the refusal shall be so noted on the receipt by the supervisor or administrator.
- F. The Associate Assistant Superintendent/Designee of Human Resources or designee shall undertake such additional investigation as may be necessary, and shall provide the employee with a such written statement within a reasonable time specifically stating:
  - L. <u>Under the land of the land</u>
  - H. 2. The date and/or the conditions under which the employee may return to his or her regular duties, if applicable; and
  - III. 3. The employee's due process rights and time limits to appeal by reference to the District's Gerievance procedures or, if applicable, the provision of the Collective Beargaining Aagreement.

VII. At all times, each dDistrict employee shall make every reasonable effort to ensure that any employee who, in the course of their employment or in the discharge of duties, is under the influence of alcohol does not operate a motor vehicle. Should an employee refuse to cooperate and attempt to operate a motor vehicle when he/she cannot operate it safely or lawfully such employee is intoxicated and/or under the influence of alcohol, law enforcement officials shall be immediately notified and the employee shall be terminated from employment.

### **Violations & Penalties**

VIII. District employees who violate this Rule shall be subject to the following penalties:

### **Employees of the Millard Public Schools shall not:**

- L. A. Reporting to work under the influence of alcohol.
  - A. 1. First offense: Employee will be issued a written reprimand, a mandatory referral to E.A.P. will be subject to a minimum suspension of suspension of up to five (5) days without pay, and a maximum of termination of employment. Mandatory referral to E.A.P. in the event the employee is not terminated.
  - B. 2. Second offense: Employee will be issued a written reprimand and will be subject to a suspension without pay for a minimum of twenty days and a maximum of termination of employment. Mandatory referral to E.A.P. in the event the employee is not terminated. Employee shall be terminated from employment.
  - C. Third offense: Employee shall be terminated from employment.
- H. B. Use of alcohol or beverages containing alcohol while on dDistrict property, or while in the course of the employee's employment or in the discharge of his or her duties thereunder, at a dDistrict-sponsored student event, or at a student activity in which the District or other school districts participate.
  - A. 1. First offense: Employee will be issued a written reprimand, a mandatory referral to E.A.P. will be subject to a minimum suspension of suspension of up to five (5) days without pay, and a maximum of termination of employment. Mandatory referral to E.A.P. in the event the employee is not terminated.
  - B. 2. Second offense: Employee will be issued a written reprimand and be subject to a suspension without pay for a minimum of twenty days and a maximum of termination of employment. Mandatory referral to E.A.P. in the event the employee is not terminated. Employee shall be terminated from employment.
  - C. Third offense: Employee shall be terminated from employment.
- III. C. Distribute Employee is convicted of distribution of alcohol or beverages containing alcohol to minors. while on district property, at a district sponsored student event, or at a student activity in which the District or other school districts participate.
  - A. 1. First offense: Employee shall be terminated from employment.
- IV. D. Refusal to undergo further testing based on a reasonable suspicion of intoxication and/or performance of duties under the influence of alcohol.
  - A. 1. First offense: Employee shall be terminated from employment.

### Non-Compliance with Employee Assistance Program

IX. Employees of the Millard School District shall fully comply with and successfully complete the treatment directed by the District's E.A.P. when the employee is being disciplined for violation of this Rule. Failure to do so shall result in the following discipline: termination of employment.

- I. First offense: The penalty listed under second offense for whatever prohibited conduct caused the referral to the E.A.P.
- H. Second offense: The penalty listed under third offense for whatever prohibited conduct caused the referral to the E.A.P.

### **Alternative Disposition**

X. The <u>District Superintendent or designee</u> may impose a lesser or alternative <u>disposition of the offense</u> penalty than those provided for herein if the <u>District Superintendent or designee</u> deems that a lesser or alternative disposition is in the best interests of the District and the employee.

### **Criminal Convictions**

XI. \_\_\_\_If a dDistrict employee is convicted of any crime related to the distribution or otherwise making alcohol available to minors, the employee may be subject to disciplinary action. Such disciplinary action may include suspension without pay for up to twenty days or termination of shall be terminated from employment. An employee convicted of any crime relating to the possession, use, or distribution of alcohol must notify the Associate Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources or designee no later than five one business days after the conviction. Failure to timely notify may be grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.

### XII. Education and Counseling The District will use the following counseling and education services:

A. Employees are encouraged to participate in the District's substance abuse awareness programs. Additionally, employees are encouraged to <u>voluntarily</u> utilize the E.A.P. services provided by the District in seeking assistance with alcohol problems. An employee's private use of these services on the employee's own initiative will not jeopardize job security or promotional opportunity. When such use is private and voluntary, no identifying report of any kind will be made by the E.A.P. to the District unless the employee so chooses.

B. Any employee who is disciplined for alcohol use and not terminated shall be referred to the District's E.A.P. for assessment, counseling, treatment and rehabilitation. This shall be a management referral and, as such, the employee shall be required to execute the necessary releases so that the E.A.P. may inform the District whether such employee is in compliance with directed treatment.

<u>C.</u> The District will provide training for its administrators and supervisors to recognize typical symptoms of alcohol use and abuse.

### **Human Resources**

Drug-Free Workplace: Drugs 4173.3

### General

I. The purpose of this FRule is to establish standards of conduct for employees as to the use and possession of illegal drugs while in the course of their employment or in the discharge of their duties and eliminate the unlawful use or distribution of illegal drugs, or the misuse of prescription drugs, on dDistrict property. The This FRule also applies to acts or any conduct which is illegal under federal, state, or local law. All Millard Public School District employees are covered by this FRule. Violation of this FRule shall result in disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment.

<u>II.</u> This <u>FRule</u> shall be administered in accordance with and subject to all applicable <u>dD</u>istrict grievance policies and procedures contained either in collective bargaining agreements or policies and rules of the District, and pursuant to all constitutional rights, state and federal, to which employees are entitled.

<u>III.</u> The name of any employee violating this  $\frac{\mathbf{R}}{\mathbf{R}}$  ule shall not be released to the public unless the employee requests an open hearing with the Board—of Education; provided, however, that the Superintendent may notify law enforcement authorities of any suspected violation of criminal statutes or ordinances.

#### **Definitions**

- IV. The following definitions shall apply for purposes of this Rule:
- L. A. Illegal drugs shall mean all controlled substances as defined in sections Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 28-401, 28-404, 28-405 (Cum. Supp. 1988), and 28-419 (Reissue 1985) including but not limited to "uppers", "downers", barbiturates, marijuana, amphetamines, LSD, heroin, hashish, hallucinogenics, or cocaine, anabolic steroids and any metabolite or conjugated form thereof, and (2)-any other substance, except legal non-prescription drugs or legal beverages, which alters the mood or behavior and which is not taken for medical purposes under a prescription by a licensed physician.
- H. B. Distribution shall mean any delivery, sale, transfer, handling, transmitting, administering, giving, or otherwise making available, illegal drugs.
- III. C. Drug paraphernalia shall mean all equipment, products, and materials of any kind which are used, intended for use, or designed for use, in manufacturing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing illegal drugs into the human body, as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 28-439.
- IV. D. "Look-alike" drugs shall mean any substance which is believed to be or represented to others to be an illegal drug, or possessed with the belief or understanding that the substance is an illegal drug.
- V. E. "Intoxication" and/or "Under the influence" shall mean means for the purposes of this policy Rule that the employee is impaired and/or affected by a drug substance an illegal drug, or the combination of an illegal drug and alcohol, in any detectable manner. The symptoms of influence are not confined to those consistent with misbehavior or to obvious impairment of physical or mental ability such as slurred speech or difficulty in maintaining balance. A determination of influence can be established by professional opinion, a scientifically valid test or and, in some cases, by a lay person's opinion.
- VI. F. Possession shall mean on the employee's person, in the employee's personal belongings, or under the employee's reasonable control A dDistrict employee shall be deemed in possession of illegal drugs, look-alike drugs, or drug paraphernalia if he or she has illegal drugs, look-alike drugs, or drug paraphernalia on his or her person, or under his or her control.
- VII. G. Employee Assistance Program (E.A.P.) shall mean an Employee Assistance Program provided by the Millard Public Schools District for the benefit of its employees.

### **Prohibited Conduct**

V. The following conduct is prohibited.

- I. A. Reporting to work, performing job duties or conducting any dDistrict business while under the influence of any illegal drug is strictly prohibited and shall subject the District employee to immediate discipline actions as hereinafter provided. Conduct of an employee giving rise to such a reasonable suspicion that employee is under the influence shall be reported to the employee's immediate supervisor or Human Resources.and documented in a report.
- II. B. The possession, use or distribution of any illegal drug or "look-alike" drug while on District property, performing job duties, or while in the course of the employees' employment, at a District-sponsored student event, or at a student activity in which the District or other school districts participate, is strictly prohibited and shall subject the District employee to immediate discipline actions as hereinafter provided.

#### **Procedure**

VI. In cases of suspected violations of this Rule, the following actions and procedures shall be implemented.

- A. Any employee suspected of being in violation of this Rule shall be interviewed by his or her immediate supervisor or administrator as soon as possible to determine whether the employee is in violation of this Rule or any provisions of this Rule. If necessary, the immediate supervisor or administrator will may summon a second supervisor or administrator to be present at the interview and to assist in the determination. If the supervisor or administrator determines that there is a reasonable suspicion that the employee may be in violation of any provision of this Rule, the supervisor or administrator shall immediately notify refer the employee to the Associate Assistant Superintendent for of Human Resources, or Designee, who shall interview the employee for further investigation. The Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources or designee may interview the suspected employee prior to the immediate supervisor if circumstances warrant.
- B. If upon further investigation, the Associate Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources; or Designee, has a reasonable suspicion that the employee has violated this Rule, he/she shall immediately suspend the employee with pay from his or her duties, and if the employee is being suspected of being under the influence of illegal drugs, may direct that the employee be tested for illegal drugs. Employees are required to submit to drug testing upon a reasonable suspicion of a violation of this Rule directive from the Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources or designee. The employee shall be advised of the required drug testing by the Associate Assistant Superintendent for of Human Resources, or Designee, and be transported to a location for the administration of such required test.
- <u>C.</u> The results of the drug test may be used to provide the employee an opportunity to exonerate himself/herself. If the employee tests negative for drugs, the employee will not be subject to disciplinary measures related to violation of the District's drug policy and shall-may be returned to duty. If a test of an employee positively detects the presence of illegal drugs, the results shall be confirmed in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. § 48-1903 prior to being used against an employee in any disciplinary or administrative action.
- <u>D.</u> Refusal to submit to a breath test may be offered in evidence in any grievance proceeding related to the disciplinary action for violation of the District's Alcohol Policy. An employee who refuses to undergo testing based upon reasonable suspicion that the employee is intoxicated and/or under the influence of illegal drugs shall be terminated from employment, The employee may be subject to disciplinary action based on violations of other district policies and/or rules.
- E. The Any employee who is subject to disciplinary action under this Rule shall, within a reasonable time, be provided a written statement setting forth the reasons for such disciplinary action, specifically stating why the employee was suspended. The Notice written statement shall contain a written acknowledgment of receipt signed by the employee. Should the employee refuse to sign the acknowledgment of receipt, the refusal shall be so noted on the receipt by the supervisor or administrator.
- <u>F.</u> The <u>Associate Assistant Superintendent/Designee of Human Resources or designee</u> shall undertake such additional investigation as may be necessary, and shall provide the employee with <u>a such</u> written statement within a reasonable time specifically stating:

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# Introduction and Graduation Requirements

### **INTRODUCTION**

The *Curriculum Handbook and Registration Guide* provides information about the academic program offered by Millard Public Schools for the 2014-2015 school year. The handbook contains information on graduation requirements and course offerings, and provides additional resources to serve as a registration guide.

High school course selection is an important decision that helps students prepare for graduation and post-secondary endeavors. In addition to meeting graduation requirements, students should select the most challenging courses that allow them to explore or strengthen areas of interest and prepare for post-secondary education and careers.

The handbook is divided into four sections:

- Section I provides information on the Board of Education approved graduation requirements. A Four Year Plan Sheet is provided to assist in thoughtful discussions and decisions towards post-secondary plans.
- Section II describes all courses, is organized by academic discipline, and contains flowcharts and tables explaining course sequences.
- Section III describes specialized programs including Academies in Millard high schools, Advanced Placement® courses, Information Technology Mini-Magnet, International Baccalaureate, Special Education, and Academies at Metropolitan Community College.
- Section IV provides information on post-secondary planning, Personal Learning Plans, ACT scores and Core Curriculum, Advanced Placement<sup>®</sup> courses, Diploma Paths, Dual Enrollment opportunities, and NCAA, NAIA, and NJCAA athletic eligibility. A master quick-reference table and credit count form are provided within this section.

To earn a diploma from Millard Public Schools, each student must meet three criteria:

- Complete course and credit requirements
- Meet the Essential Learner Outcome of College and Career Readiness Metric Requirements in Reading, Math, Writing and Science
- Complete a Personal Learning Plan (PLP)

Students should use their Personal Learning Plan (PLP) as a tool to help identify and document their accomplishments, strengths, and interests. Students record their goals, create plans for accomplishing these goals, and document progress. With careful planning, students can prepare for post-secondary education and careers while also completing graduation requirements.

Unique opportunities are available at each high school. These opportunities are open to all Millard students in an effort to provide more options and focus for students selected to participate. These specialized programs are listed in the chart below

### ADDITIONAL GRADUATION INFORMATION

- 1. A grade of four (4) or better must be maintained in any course used to fulfill graduation requirements. Should a "pass-fail" grading system be utilized in a course, only a "pass" grade will fulfill graduation requirements.
- 2. Students should be aware of the entrance requirements of post-secondary schools they may choose to attend.
- 3. In order to provide flexibility in such situations as transfers and special needs, course waivers may be submitted by staff and approved by the principal.
- 4. Grading Guidelines for Second Twelfth Grade

The Millard Public Schools Grading Guidelines for second through twelfth grade shall be used to report achievement, academic progress, and compute Grade Point Averages (GPA) and Class Rankings where applicable.

Weighted grade points will apply to Advanced Placement<sup>®</sup> courses, to those courses taken for International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme purposes wherein students are required to meet IB requirements for standard level or higher level assessment, and to those courses which are beyond the Advanced Placement<sup>®</sup> course sequence within a specific content area as identified in the *Millard Public Schools High School Curriculum Handbook and Registration Guide*. IB Middle Years Programme and IB Diploma prerequisite courses do not qualify for weighted grade points.

A student's Grade Point Average (GPA) shall be calculated by dividing the total grade points achieved (standard and weighted) by the total course credits attempted.

Class rank shall be determined by Total Class Rank Points. The Grade Point Average multiplied by the total Grade Points shall equal Total Class Rank Points for each student. The listing of the Total Class Rank Points from highest to lowest shall determine the class rank of each student.

- 5. It is strongly recommended that each student take at least 6 classes each semester, 3 per semester in a 4x4 block schedule. All students must register for a minimum of 4 classes, 2 in a 4x4 block, each semester. Credit is not given for study halls.
- 6. ELIGIBILITY FOR ACTIVITIES: In order to participate in interscholastic athletic competition and/or activities, Millard Public Schools requires that a student be enrolled in at least 20 credit hours per semester (Millard West and Horizon block, 10 credits per term) and has consistent attendance as well as having received 20 credit hours (Millard West and Horizon block, 10 credits per term) the immediate preceding semester.
- 7. CURRICULUM OPTIONS AVAILABLE TO PARENTS: In a diverse society, there may be occasional situations when parents are uncomfortable with the use of a particular book or unit in their child's school. If families should find themselves in this position, Millard Public Schools has a long-standing policy that, at the request of parents, students may be excused from using such materials. When such a request is made, the teacher will provide alternative materials for the student. Parents should contact the principal's office or their child's teacher if they have questions about this policy.

### PERSONAL LEARNING PLAN

In addition to 230 credits required for graduation, each student must also meet the Essential Learner Outcome of College and Career Readiness Metric and successfully complete his or her Personal Learning Plan (PLP).

Personal Learning Plans (PLPs) assist each student to set and achieve challenging educational goals tailored to his or her abilities, interests, and aspirations. The Personal Learning Plan includes a focus on personal, academic and career/college areas. The Personal Learning Plan defines specific expectations for each grade level of high school.

During each of their four years, students are asked to create short-term and long-term SMART Goals (Specific and Strategic; Measurable; Attainable; Results-Oriented; Time-Bound) which are then monitored by the student and his or her advisor throughout the school year. Each year students also reflect on experiences that support their preparation for college and career.

During their freshman year of high school, students begin to create their resumés and then update them at least annually. The resumé could be used for upcoming job interviews or college entrance interviews. Additional requirements include the following:

The PLP will be completed using the *Naviance Family Connection* website. Student progress will be monitored and recorded in Naviance by a school representative such as an advisor, counselor, and/or an administrator. Parents are encouraged to visit their child's Personal Learning Plan to hold conversations, to monitor progress, and to encourage their child's efforts.

At least one month prior to graduation, the Senior PLP must be completed and finalized through *Naviance Family Connection*. Transfer students are expected to complete a Personal Learning Plan with the understanding that the principal (or designee) may waive previous requirements based on the entrance date of the student.

### Effect of Student Performance

- 1. When a student has successfully met the Essential Learner Outcomes Assessment cut score for each outcome, a notation shall be made in the student's cumulative record. Such information will be communicated to parent(s)/guardian(s) in writing.
- 2. A student will be considered ineligible for a diploma from the Millard Public Schools until such time that the requisite cut scores are achieved for High School Essential Learner Outcomes Assessments.
  - a. If the student is verified with a disability or has a 504 Accommodation Plan, then the Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 Team will reconvene to review the education plan and to consider lowering of the cut score requirement as part of the IEP or 504 Accommodation Plan. The student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s) shall be notified and shall also be advised of the effect of lowering the cut score.
  - b. Applications for approval of lowered cut score requirements and/or alternate assessments may be submitted by the student's IEP or 504 Team to the Associate Superintendent of Educational Services for consideration and, where appropriate, approval. The Associate Superintendent of Educational Services or designee shall decide and respond to all such requests.
  - c. If the lowered cut score requirement is approved, the student shall then be eligible to receive a graduation diploma with appropriate notation from the Millard Public Schools.
  - d. An additional opportunity is available to demonstrate student proficiency. After two retest attempts to meet the established cut score(s) for the Essential Learner Outcome assessment(s) without achieving the cut score, students, under building supervision, shall participate in a process, as provided in the District's Assessment Procedures, to demonstrate an appropriate level of proficiency in reading, writing, math, science, or social studies. A student who successfully meets the standards and requirements of a Demonstration of Proficiency shall have met one of the essential criteria for graduating from the Millard Public Schools.

### Student's Right to Appeal

Students who have not achieved the necessary high school cut scores as approved by the Millard Board of Education may appeal the denial of a diploma.

- A. A student may appeal the denial of a diploma only on the grounds that the student's failure to achieve the required cut score is due to:
  - 1. The failure of the District to provide a reasonable accommodation which was previously requested by the student and denied by the District.
  - 2. The failure of the District to provide an alternate assessment or approve a demonstration of proficiency, which had been previously requested by the student and denied by the District.

### B. Procedures for Appeal

- 1. Within seven (7) days after the receipt of the notice that the student failed to achieve the cut score or credits required for graduation from the Millard Public Schools, a written notice of appeal shall be served upon the Superintendent of the Millard Public Schools or his/her designee. Such appeal shall set forth all of the reasons for the appeal as provided herein and shall set forth the relief sought by the student, parent(s) or guardian(s). Such notice of appeal may also include any additional information which is relevant to the appeal.
- 2. Within seven (7) days after the receipt of the written notice of appeal and any supporting information relevant to the appeal, the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall consider and render a decision on the appeal based on whether the decision of the District was unreasonable. Such decision shall then be forwarded to the student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s) advising the student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s) of the basis for the Superintendent's decision and the reasons therefore.
- 3. Within seven (7) days after the receipt of the written notification from the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee, a written request may be made by the student, parent(s), or guardian(s) to the secretary of the Millard Board of Education or the Superintendent for a hearing before the Millard Board of Education be held on the issue whether the decision of the Superintendent or his/her designee was unreasonable.
- 4. Such hearing shall be held before the Millard Board of Education within thirty (30) days of the date the request for hearing was received. If a hearing before the Millard Board of Education is not received in a timely manner, the decision of the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall be final.
- 5. The student, parent(s) and/or guardian(s) shall be advised at least seven (7) days prior to the date of the hearing before the Board and such notification shall set forth the date, time, and place for the hearing before the Millard Board of Education.
- 6. The parties may, by mutual written agreement, extend the time for hearing or final determination.
- 7. The student, parent(s), and/or guardian(s) shall have the right to be represented by legal counsel and shall have the opportunity to present such evidence that is material to the issue or issues stated in the appeal.
- 8. The hearing shall be conducted in closed session and in accordance with the student privacy laws unless the student, parent(s), and/or guardian(s) shall request, in writing, that the hearing be held in open session. Any formal action of the Millard Board of Education shall be taken in closed session unless such proceeding was requested by the student, parent(s), or guardian(s) to be held in open session.
- 9. The decision of the Millard Board of Education shall be by vote of a majority of the members of the Millard Board of Education and the Millard Board of Education shall reduce its findings and decision to writing and provide the written findings and decision to the student, parent(s), and/or guardian(s) within ten (10) days of the hearing.

### **GRADUATION**

Upon successful completion of the required credits, assessments, and a Personal Learning Plan, a student shall be eligible for a diploma from the Millard Public Schools.

### ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS

### Classes of 2016 and Beyond

In addition to 230 credits required for graduation, each student must also meet the Essential Learner Outcome of College and Career Readiness Metric requirements in Reading, Math, Writing, and Science and complete his or her Personal Learning Plan (PLP).

### Effect of Student Performance

- 1. When a student has successfully met the Essential Learner Outcomes of College and Career Readiness metric for each outcome, a notation shall be made in the student's cumulative record. Such information will be communicated to parent(s)/guardian(s) in writing.
- 2. A student will be considered ineligible for a diploma from the Millard Public Schools until such time that the requisite assessment metric for a given Essential Learner Outcome Assessment, is achieved.
  - a. The school/district will initiate a consistent and collaborative problem solving and intervention model called Response to Instruction and Intervention (RtI+I). School representatives will offer the student supplemental learning activities that address recognized Essential Learner Outcomes of College and Career Readiness deficiencies.
  - b. If the student is verified with a disability or has a 504 Accommodation Plan, then the Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 Team will reconvene to review the education plan and to consider the problem solving and intervention strategies and to ensure that the IEP or 504 Accommodation Plan is written to assist the student in areas of weaknesses and that appropriate accommodations are in place. The student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s) shall be notified and shall also be advised of the effect of the above.
  - c. If the student is identified as an English Language Learner (ELL), a school team responsible for planning the student's academic program may reconvene to review the problem solving and intervention strategies and to ensure that needed accommodations are in place in areas of weakness.
  - d. Applications for approval of lowered College and Career Readiness metric requirements may be submitted by the student's IEP or 504 Team to the Associate Superintendent of Educational Services for consideration and where appropriate, approval. The Associate Superintendent of Educational Services or designee shall decide and respond to all such requests. If the lowered College and Career Readiness metric is approved, the student shall then be eligible to receive a graduation diploma with appropriate notation from the Millard Public Schools.
  - e. An additional opportunity is available to demonstrate student proficiency. After review of ACT® Assessment, ACT® Plan Assessment, Nebraska State Accountability (NeSA) Tests, and one or more attempts on Essential Learner Outcome of College and Career Readiness locally-developed assessments without achieving the College and Career Readiness metric, students, under building supervision, shall participate in a process, as provided in the District's Assessment Proceures, to demonstrate an appropriate level of proficiency in reading, writing, math, science or social studies. A student who successfully meets the standards and requirements of a Demonstration of Proficiency shall have met one of the essential criteria for graduating from the Millard Public Schools.

### Student's Right to Appeal

Students who have not achieved the necessary high school College and Career Readiness metrics as approved by the Millard Board of Education may appeal the denial of a diploma. A student may appeal the denial of a diploma only on the grounds that the student's failure to achieve the required cut score is due to:

- 1. The failure of the District to provide a reasonable accommodation, which was previously requested by the student and denied by the District.
- 2. The failure of the District to provide an alternate assessment or approve a demonstration of proficiency, which had been previously requested by the student and denied by the District.

### Procedures for Appeal

- 1. Within seven (7) days after the receipt of the notice that the student failed to achieve the cut score or credits required for graduation from the Millard Public Schools, a written notice of appeal shall be served upon the Superintendent of the Millard Public Schools or his/her designee. Such appeal shall set forth all of the reasons for the appeal as provided herein and shall set forth the relief sought by the student, parent(s) or guardian(s). Such notice of appeal may also include any additional information which is relevant to the appeal.
- 2. Within seven (7) days after the receipt of the written notice of appeal and any supporting information relevant to the appeal, the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall consider and render a decision on the appeal based on whether the decision of the District was unreasonable. Such decision shall then be forwarded to the student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s) of the basis for the Superintendent's decision and the reasons therefore.
- 3. Within seven (7) days after the receipt of the written notification from the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee, a written request may be made by the student, parent(s), or guardian(s) to the secretary of the Millard Board of Education or the Superintendent for a hearing before the Millard Board of Education be held on the issue whether the decision of the Superintendent or his/her designee was unreasonable.
- 4. Such hearing shall be held before the Millard Board of Education within thirty (30) days of the date the request for hearing was received. If a hearing before the Millard Board of Education is not received in a timely manner, the decision of the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall be final.
- 5. The student, parent(s) and/or guardian(s) shall be advised at least seven (7) days prior to the date of the hearing before the Board and such notification shall set forth the date, time, and place for the hearing before the Millard Board of Education.
- 6. The parties may, by mutual written agreement, extend the time for hearing or final determination.
- 7. The student, parent(s), and/or guardian(s) shall have the right to be represented by legal counsel and shall have the opportunity to present such evidence that is material to the issue or issues stated in the appeal.
- 8. The hearing shall be conducted in closed session and in accordance with the student privacy laws unless the student, parent(s), and/or guardian(s) shall request, in writing, that the hearing be held in open session. Any formal action of the Millard Board of Education shall be taken in closed session unless such proceeding was requested by the student, parent(s), or guardian(s) to be held in open session.
- 9. The decision of the Millard Board of Education shall be by vote of a majority of the members of the Millard Board of Education and the Millard Board of Education shall reduce its findings and decision to writing and provide the written findings and decision to the student, parent(s), and/or guardian(s) within ten (10) days of the hearing.

### GRADUATION

Upon successful completion of the required credits, assessments, and a Personal Learning Plan, a student shall be eligible for a diploma from the Millard Public Schools.
