 - 1. District employees will treat parents, members of the public, and other District employees with courtesy and respect.
 - 2. Parents and other visitors to District schools, facilities, and activities will treat students, District employees, other parents, and other visitors with courtesy and respect.
 - B. Unacceptable/Disruptive Behavior.
 - 1. Disruptive behavior includes, but is not limited to, behavior which interferes with or threatens to interfere with the operation of a classroom, a District employee's duties, the functions of a school facility, District activities, or substantially interferes with the educational process.
 - 2. Using loud and/or offensive language, swearing, cursing, using profane language, or the display of anger.
 - 3. Threatening to do bodily or physical harm to students, District employees or other visitors on District property whether or not the behavior constitutes or may constitute a criminal violation.
 - 4. Damaging or destroying District property.
 - 5. Any other behavior that disrupts the orderly operation of a school, a school classroom, any District facility or activity, or a District employee's duties.
 - 6. Refusing to follow District safety instructions <u>or District policies or rules</u>.
 - 7. Defaming District employees.
 - 8. Abusive, threatening, obscene, harassing or repetitive telephone calls, E-mails or voice mail messages.
 - 9. Sexual harassment of District personnel, students, patrons, or vendors is strictly prohibited. Sexual harassment shall include, but is not limited to, unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other verbal, nonverbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature.
 - C. Recourse. Any employee, parent or other visitor who believes he/she was subject to unacceptable/disruptive behavior from a District employee, parent, or other visitor should bring such behavior to the attention of the immediate supervisor, building principal, or the Assistant Superintendent for Human Resources.
- II. <u>Authority of School Personnel</u>.
 - A. <u>Authority to Direct Persons to Leave District Property and to Limit Communications or Monitor</u> <u>Communications with District Employees</u>.
 - 1. Any individual who exhibits the following behaviors may be directed to leave District property by a principal, principal's designee or any District level administrator:

- a. Disrupts or threatens to disrupt school or District activities or operations;
- b. Threatens to or attempts to do or does physical harm to students, District employees, or other visitors;
- c. Threatens the health or safety of students, District employees, or other visitors;
- d. Intentionally causes damage to a school, District property, or property of other visitors;
- e. Uses loud or offensive language;
- f. Defames District employees;
- g. Who without authorization comes onto District property.
- 2. If the person refuses to leave the premises as directed, the administrator or other authorized personnel shall call 911 for law enforcement assistance.
- 3. If a visitor uses obscenities or speaks in a demanding, loud, insulting, and/or a demeaning manner, the District employee to whom the remarks are directed will follow these procedures:
 - a. Shall calmly and politely warn the speaker to communicate civilly.
 - b. If such conduct continues, the District employee to whom the remarks are directed may, after giving appropriate notice to the speaker, terminate the meeting, conference, or telephone conversation.
 - c. If the meeting or conference is on District property, any District employee may request that an administrator or other authorized personnel direct the speaker to promptly leave the premises.
 - d. If the person refuses to leave the premises as directed, the principal or designee or a District level administrator may call 911 for law enforcement assistance.
 - e. If the District employee is threatened with personal harm, the District employee may call 911 for law enforcement assistance.
- B. Authority to Report or Terminate Phone or E-mail Communication.
 - 1. If any District employee receives an E-mail or voice mail message that is abusive, threatening, obscene, harassing or repetitive, the District employee is not obligated to continue the telephone call or respond to the E-mail or return the telephone call.
 - 2. The District employee should save the message and contact their supervisor. If the message threatens personal harm, the District employee may contact law enforcement.

Appropriate signs will be placed at the entrances of all buildings, athletic facilities, and spectator areas advising all persons who enter of the District policy prohibiting smoking and the use of tobacco <u>products and e-cigarette type</u> <u>products</u> on District property.

Anyone who is observed smoking or using tobacco products <u>or e-cigarette type products</u> in violation of District policies shall be asked to refrain from such activity. If the individual fails to comply with the request the violation may be referred to the principal or District supervisory personnel responsible for the area or the program. The supervisor shall make a decision on further action, which may include a directive to leave school property. Repeated violations may result in a recommendation to the Superintendent to prohibit the individual from entering <u>school dD</u>istrict property for a specified period of time. If deemed necessary by school administration, the local law enforcement agency may be called upon to assist with enforcement of this policy.

The District shall use the appropriate standard contract forms published by the American Institute of Architects (AIA) for its construction projects. Such forms may be amended in whole or in part upon recommendation of legal counsel.

Such contracts shall provide: (1) that the contractor provide a certificate of insurance with coverage determined appropriate by the District, (2) that no tobacco products <u>or e-cigarette type products</u> may be used in District facilities or on grounds owned, leased, or operated by the District, and (3) that all workers will wear District-provided security badges as directed by the District.

Prior to the District issuing security badges to employees of contractors and any subcontractors who will be doing work at District facilities or on grounds owned, leased or operated by the District, such employees must receive security clearance, which includes passing a criminal background check conducted by a District-approved background check company. The contractor and/or subcontractor shall be responsible for compliance, which shall include submitting the names of employees to the background check company at least two weeks in advance of the anticipated start date of any work or project at a District facility or on grounds owned, leased or operated by the District, the payment of all costs for conducting the background check and permitting only those employees who receive proper security clearance to work at District facilities.

Substance Use

In order to ensure the highest possible standards of learning as well as the safety, health, and well-being of students, the District endorses a substance abuse policy which will aid students to abstain from the use of illegal drugs, intervene early when student use is detected, take corrective disciplinary action when necessary, and provide aftercare support for students.

As used in this Policy "drugs" shall include tobacco, <u>nicotine</u>, alcohol, controlled substances as defined by state law, other mood or behavior-affecting substances which are not taken for medical purposes, and "look-alike" drugs.

I. PREVENTION

The District will adopt an age appropriate developmentally based drug, tobacco, <u>nicotine</u> and alcohol education and prevention program, which includes in its scope the legal, social, and health consequences of drug, tobacco and alcohol use and provides information and techniques for the resistance of peer pressure for use of illicit drugs, tobacco, <u>nicotine</u> or alcohol. The program shall be for all students in all grades of the schools operated and served by the District from the early childhood level through grade twelve (12).

The District will provide students with information and activities focused on preventing students from using drugs. Prevention activities will be centered around the instructional program, guidance and counseling, school climate, and family and community involvement.

II. INTERVENTION

The District shall make available to students, information about any drug, tobacco, <u>nicotine</u> or alcohol counseling, or rehabilitation, or re-entry programs available to students.

The District shall establish and maintain an assistance program, through a team approach, to aid students who are chemically involved to successfully address their harmful involvement with chemicals and to continue in a school program.

III. DISCIPLINE

The District shall notify all students that the use of illicit drugs and the unlawful possession and use of tobacco, e-cigarette type products, and alcohol are wrong and harmful.

The rules established by the District shall clearly prohibit the unlawful possession and use or distribution of illicit drugs, tobacco, <u>e-cigarette type products</u>, and alcohol by students on school premises or as a part of any District activities and it shall be applicable to students in all of the schools in the District.

The District shall adopt disciplinary sanctions consistent with local, state and federal laws up to and including expulsion and referral for prosecution of students who violate the District's Standards of for Student Conduct and a description of sanctions as described by the rules of the District including sanctions which require the completion of an appropriate rehabilitation program.

Students have the right to attend school in an environment free of drugs. Possession or use of tobacco, <u>or e-cigarette type products</u>, or possession, distribution or use of mood or behavior-affecting substances, alcohol, "look-a-likes" or drug paraphernalia, are prohibited on school grounds and at school-sponsored or school-related activities.

The consequences for possession, distribution, or use of drugs, abusive chemicals controlled substances, mood altering drugs, unauthorized medication, <u>alcohol</u>, or possession of drug-related paraphernalia will result in disciplinary action.

It is the policy of the District to take positive action through education, counseling, parental involvement, medical referral, and police referral where appropriate in the handling of incidents in the schools involving mood or behavior-affecting substances or alcohol.

School property and student property may be searched by school authorities in the interest of the maintenance of the health and safety of students and staff, the educational process, and to further school purposes.

Students may be subjected to alcohol and other drug screening and testing technology pursuant to District Policy 5490 and Rule 5490.1.

IV. TREATMENT

The District will work cooperatively with community treatment personnel to facilitate the educational program of students in treatment.

V. COOPERATION PROGRAMS

The District will work cooperatively with the students, parents, guardians and community treatment personnel, to support aftercare and post-treatment plans for students returning from treatment.

VI. NOTICES

The District shall provide, distribute and shall give to all students, parents and guardians a copy of the Standards of for Student Conduct and the statement of disciplinary sanctions enacted pursuant to this Policy and shall notify parents, guardians and students that compliance with the Standards of Student Conduct are mandatory for all the students in the District.

Substance Use

I. PREVENTION.

- A. The purpose of the District's alcohol, tobacco and other drugs (ATOD) prevention program is to promote wellness and healthy life styles. To accomplish this, the program will be designed and implemented to develop a respect for a healthy mind and body. Students will learn how the body functions, how personal habits contribute to good health, and how drugs affect the body and the nervous system.
- B. The prevention program will focus on classroom instruction, and guidance and counseling. Involvement of students, parents and other community members is essential for the success of District ATOD prevention activities.
- C. The ATOD prevention program shall be an age appropriate and developmentally based program for all students in all grade levels from early childhood through grade twelve (12).
 - 1. <u>Instruction Program</u>.
 - a. All schools will have instructional programs which promote student wellness and which assist students in making responsible decisions about the use of ATOD. Current and accurate information about drugs and their effects upon the body and nervous system is only one (1) component of an instructional prevention program. Other components include instruction and skill development related to self-awareness, decision making, and interpersonal relationships.
 - b. In the elementary schools, major responsibility for providing instruction about the prevention of ATOD use/abuse will be provided by health education programs, following specific objectives to be covered. The health curriculum will be consistently reviewed, evaluated, and updated. Other areas of the elementary curriculum will reinforce the prevention concepts taught in the health program.
 - c. In the secondary schools, components of the instructional prevention program will be integrated into a variety of required and elective courses throughout the curriculum.
 - d. All staff will be provided training in prevention strategies and in any new curriculum. Instructional materials will be available for each school to implement the program.
 - e. Each school will formulate a prevention plan based on that school's needs that complements and supplements the District instructional program. These plans will be an integral part of the District's comprehensive prevention plan and will be reviewed and updated annually by staff and parents and by students, as appropriate.
 - 2. <u>Guidance and Counseling.</u>
 - a. Guidance and counseling personnel will assist teachers and administrators with the implementation of classroom curriculum and school ATOD prevention plans.
 - b. Counselors will work with students, individually and in appropriate groups, to supplement ATOD prevention instruction and skill development. Counselors

5410.1

will also work with staff and parents to maximize the prevention efforts of the school.

- c. All students shall receive a statement that the use of illicit drugs and the unlawful possession and use of tobacco and alcohol is wrong and harmful.
- 3. <u>School Environment.</u> Prevention efforts will emphasize maintaining a safe, positive and healthy school environment that encourages the student's positive self-concept; the student's enthusiasm for learning; outlets for student self-development and creativity which acknowledge individual skills, needs, and interests; responsible student decision-making and problem-solving; and recognition of the special needs of high-risk students or families experiencing undue stress.
- 4. <u>Family and Community</u>. The successful prevention of drug involvement must include a plan to ensure that parents and the community are aware and knowledgeable of programs and services available to them and their children. Parents and community members will be actively involved in the community/school partnership.

II. <u>INTERVENTION</u>.

- A. All schools will establish and maintain an ATOD intervention program. The goal of the ATOD program shall be to eliminate ATOD use by students.
- B. Ongoing inservice training will be provided for all staff. Training will include dimensions of the family illness and dynamics of the addiction process; enabling behaviors; intervention techniques; children in chemically dependent families; student experimentation, abuse and dependency; parental involvement and community resources; prevention issues and strategies; treatment and aftercare support; and implementation of the program into the classroom/building.
 - 1. <u>ATOD Intervention Program Personnel Responsibilities.</u>
 - a. Administration has the primary responsibility for implementation of the ATOD intervention program in each school.
 - b. <u>Pupil_Student</u> Services staff will perform leadership roles in the implementation of ATOD intervention programs.
 - c. The principal in each school will identify staff responsible for the planning, implementation, and evaluation of the ATOD intervention program in their school.
 - d. School staff, including all classified and certificated staff, shall be trained to recognize early symptoms of drug and alcohol use.
 - 2. <u>ATOD Intervention Program Processes</u>.
 - a. The principal in each school will be responsible for implementing an ATOD intervention program that contains the following elements:
 - i. A referral system;
 - ii. A confidential system of record keeping of ATOD referrals and interventions; and
 - iii. Procedures for involving staff in the identification of students at highrisk ATOD use.

III. <u>DISCIPLINE</u>.

- A. <u>General</u>. The unlawful possession, use or distribution of alcoholic beverages, mood or behavior affecting substances, tobacco, <u>e-cigarette type products</u>, drug paraphernalia, and look-a-like drugs on District property or premises or at any of the activities of any school in the District is prohibited.
- B. <u>Definitions.</u>
 - 1. "Alcoholic beverages" shall mean any substance subject to the jurisdiction of the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.
 - 2. "Mood or behavior affecting substances" shall mean alcoholic beverages; controlled substances as defined by Neb. Rev. Stat. §28-401, including but not limited to "uppers," "downers," barbiturates, amphetamines, LSD, heroin, hashish, hallucinogenics or cocaine; substances such as glue, to the extent any such substance is used for the purpose of mood or behavior alteration by a student; and any other substance which alters the mood or behavior and which is not taken for medical purposes (e.g. steroids).
 - 3. "Tobacco" shall mean tobacco products used for smoking, chewing, and as snuff.
 - 4. "Distribution" shall mean any sale, transfer, handling, transmitting, administering, or giving of the item in question, with or without an exchange of value.
 - 5. "Drug paraphernalia" shall mean all equipment, products, and materials of any kind which are used, intended for use, or designed for use, in manufacturing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body any controlled substance.
 - 6. "Look-a-like" (also known as imitation controlled substances) shall mean any substance which is not a controlled substance, but which by its appearance (including, but not limited to, color, shape, size, markings, or packaging) or by representations made, induced or are intended to induce, persons to believe that the substance is a controlled substance. "Look-a-like" shall include any beverage containing alcohol or a beverage that is represented to contain alcohol.
 - 7. "Possession of a substance" shall mean situations where a student has on his person, within his personal property, within school property assigned to him or under his control, a substance prohibited under this Rule, while on school property or at a school sponsored or school-related activity.
 - 8. "Use of a substance" shall mean situations where there is reasonable suspicion to believe a student has assimilated a prohibited substance or is under the influence of the same while on school property or in attendance at a school-sponsored or school-related activity. Factors which may be taken into consideration are: the odor of a prohibited substance on the student's breath or clothes, glassy eyes, slurred speech, and/or physical mobility.

C. <u>Staffing and Other Procedures.</u>

- 1. Definitive assignments shall be given to staff personnel within each school related to ATOD detection and disciplinary procedures.
 - a. The principal will be responsible for carrying out this Rule and its supporting procedures within the school.
 - b. The principal will serve as the coordinator for records, reports and inquiries relating to the school ATOD prevention and disciplinary program.

- d. Any administrative staff member who obtains or generates information concerning a disciplinary matter subject to these provisions shall immediately inform the office of the Director of <u>Pupil-Student</u> Services. The Director of <u>Pupil-Student</u> Services shall have the authority to intervene in any case involving the use, abuse or distribution of mood or behavior affecting substances, and may impose conditions or terms for readmittance of the student involved, and shall also have the authority to readmit the student prior to the conclusion of the term, of the suspension or exclusion.
- 2. The name of any student involved in such a matter will not be released to the general public except as provided by law.
- 3. The parents or guardian of an involved student shall be contacted and informed.
- D. <u>Notification</u>. All students and their parents and guardian shall be given a copy, or a handbook containing a description, of the standards of conduct as described in this Rule or prohibited acts and the description of the disciplinary sanctions which will be imposed for violation of the prohibited acts. The notice to the student, their parents or guardians shall include notice that compliance under the standards of conduct is mandatory.
- E. <u>Voluntarily Seeking Help.</u> Information may be received from students and/or parents who voluntarily seek help from school authorities concerning the student's use of mood or behavior affecting substances before being found to be using or possessing such substances by school or law enforcement officials. This information will be maintained in confidence and will not serve as a basis for disciplinary actions unless the student is currently under investigation for suspected substance use. However, this does not provide immunity from disciplinary actions should these students continue to use, possess, or distribute such substances as provided herein.
- F. <u>Community Liaison.</u>

c.

- 1. The schools will cooperate with the police department by making every effort to identify and report any sources of supply of mood or behavior affecting substances and by developing an inservice instruction program for staff members.
- 2. The schools will cooperate with the city or county health department and individual health care providers in appropriate health education and health care.
- 3. The District shall provide to students and their parents and guardians information about any available drug and alcohol counseling, rehabilitation, and re-entry programs.
- IV. <u>TREATMENT.</u> Counselors will be responsible for ongoing communication and cooperation with community drug treatment personnel and for facilitating the educational programming of students in treatment.

V. <u>AFTERCARE.</u>

- A. It is important that students returning to school from a community inpatient or outpatient treatment program be given aftercare support. Primary aftercare responsibility for students returning from a treatment program rests with those students, their parents, and community treatment program personnel.
- B. School counselors will coordinate with the student, parents, and community treatment personnel to facilitate the aftercare plan at school.

On March 6, 2014 at 2:00 pm bids were publicly opened for the Millard North High School

Running Track Re-surface and Re-striping. Bids were received from Pro Track & Tennis, Midwest Tennis and Track, and Fisher Tracks. The Engineer's Estimate for this work was \$114,715.00 for the project, and bids ranged from \$96,300 to \$115,631. See attached bid tab for a summary of all three bids received.

In performing the typical reference checks that accompany a recommendation to the District, Olsson Associates discovered a significant number of ambiguities in the reference list provided by the apparent low bidder. Pro Track and Tennis, including:

- Contacts were either misidentified or were no longer available for comment;
- Some references citing "multiple" project affiliations were, in fact, either none or only one had been • completed;
- Some of the projects were completed more than 10 years ago by a different company owned by the • principal of Pro Track & Tennis.

Furthermore, multiple references we reached responded that Pro Track and Tennis did not fulfill its contractual obligation to complete jobs as agreed and would not rehire Pro Track & Tennis in the future. Several of the references mentioned that there were construction issues requiring warranty work. It is our understanding Pro Track and Tennis did honor their warranty obligation, but we do have quality concerns that this types of project would have construction issues requiring warranty repairs.

Similar reference checks were performed for the second low bidder. All those contacted had positive things to say about Midwest Tennis and Track. Plus, all indicated that they had or would hire them again in the future. In addition, Midwest Tennis and Track has been involved with District projects in the past and they have always performed satisfactory. Therefore, we have no reason to believe the contractor will not successfully perform on this project.

It is only after careful research and consideration that Olsson Associates recommends that the Millard Public School District award the North High School Running Track Re-surface and Re-striping to the second low bidder, Midwest Tennis and Track, with a bid total of \$108,144.00.

Bids were received for the above-referenced project on March 6, 2014. Enclosed is a copy of the tabulation of bids. Per the bid tabulation, three bids were received. The low bid was submitted by Swain Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$298,400.55.

The preliminary construction cost estimate prepared by Lamp, Rynearson & Associates, Inc. (LRA) and presented to the Millard School Board for budgeting purposes on February 1, 2013, was \$243,089.44. The engineer's estimate prepared by LRA based on final construction plans was \$297,172.00.

The discrepancy of \$54,082.56 between the preliminary construction cost estimate and the engineer's construction cost estimate was primarily due to the addition of pavement for improved vehicular circulation around the front of the building as well as for dumpster pads and for sidewalk construction to improve pedestrian safety and accessibility to the building.

On March 6, 2014, bids were received for the above referenced project at South H.S. Buell Stadium. Per the attached bid tabulation sheet, four (4) bids were received.

The low base bid was submitted by CBS Constructors in the amount of \$93,000. In addition to the Base Bid, CBS Constructors also submitted bids for Alternate No.1 to replace a portion of the upper concourse guardrail in the additional amount of \$4,700 and Alternate No.2 to replace existing bleacher supports in the additional amount of \$35,000.

The original project budget was \$55,000 based on information the District received in 2011. The updated Architect's base bid estimate was \$123,900. Bids were received for the above referenced project at the Don Stroh Administration Center, 5606 South 147th Street, in Omaha on Thursday, March 6, 2014. Per the enclosed bid tabulation, three bids were received. The bid received from Pro Track and Tennis, Inc. did not include required unit prices for the bid items and only a final sum for the Base Bid and is therefore nonconforming and nonresponsive. We recommend that this bid be rejected as a nonconforming bid due to failure to complete the unit prices on the bid form. The lowest conforming and responsive Base Bid was submitted by Western Waterproofing Company of America in the amount of \$94,867.50.

Our revised engineer's opinion of probable construction costs is \$65,223.15 for the Base Bid. It included additional civil site work (concrete replacement) which was identified after the original conceptual design cost estimate for the project at Millard South High School. We based our opinion of probable construction costs on 2012-2013 prices from other Millard Public Schools projects and other similar projects. We used mid-range values of those unit prices. There was a large discrepancy between the estimated price and Western Waterproofing's bid price for the pavement removal and replacement and the resurfacing (acrylic coatings) with this project.

The lowest conforming and responsive Alternate Bid was also submitted by Western Waterproofing in the amount of \$100,693.50. Bid items included in the Alternate Bid for this project included the furnishing and installation of new net posts and nets. Our revised engineer's opinion of probable construction cost is \$68,883.15 for the Alternate Bid.

In regard to performance of Western Waterproofing, we checked with references to recent experience with similar projects. Western Waterproofing intends to use a subcontractor, Midwest Tennis and Track of Denison, Iowa, to perform the acrylic surfacing and court layout work. Western Waterproofing's referenced projects were determined to be better than satisfactory in schedule, performance and quality of work.

In consideration of their history on past projects and the recommendation of references, we have confidence that results for this project will be to your satisfaction.

In summary, the Base Bid and Alternate Bid amounts received for this project were over the opinion of probable construction costs. Therefore, we recommend a contract be awarded to Midwest Waterproofing Company of America in the total Base Bid amount of \$94,867.50.

Bids were received for the above-referenced project on March 6, 2014. Enclosed is a copy of the tabulation of bids. Per the bid tabulation, two bids were received. The low bid was submitted by Nemaha Sports Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$497,940.40.

The preliminary construction cost estimate prepared by Lamp, Rynearson & Associates, Inc. (LRA) and presented to the Millard School Board for budgeting purposes on January 30, 2013, was \$380,165.00. The engineer's estimate prepared by LRA based on final construction plans was \$449,922.00.

The discrepancy of \$69,757.00 between the preliminary construction cost estimate and the engineer's construction cost estimate was primarily due to the revision of the scope of the project following the geotechnical investigation and final topographic survey. The geotechnical investigation revealed poor subgrade conditions with unstable soils and high moisture content, which lead to the recommendation of soil remediation, post tension concrete courts, and additional sidewalk removal and replacement.

The discrepancy of \$48,018.40 between the construction cost estimate and the low bid received was primarily due to the bidding climate with respect to increased material costs in conjunction with limited contractor availability. Based on conversations with contractors, we had anticipated additional bids on this project.

Nemaha Sports Construction, Inc. has previously successfully completed this type of work for our clients and is qualified to complete this project within the required contract time. After consulting with Millard Public School officials, we recommend that a contract for the project be awarded to Nemaha Sports Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$497,940.40.

Please inform us if award of contract is to be made, so that we may prepare the necessary contracts.

Legislative Update March 3, 2014

Legislative Issues

All hearings are now completed. The bills have been prioritized by a senator, committee or the speaker. Full day debate will begin on March 4. There are 24 days left in this session.

LB 276 (Nordquist) provides funding for federal Medicaid for special education funds to carry out provisions of the Early Intervention Act. This will fund a previously unfunded mandate.

LB 438 (Adams) provides for priority schools, operating councils, and community schools where intervention teams would be assigned. This bill advanced to Select File.

LB 464 (Ashford) creates a council on student attendance to consider school district attendance policies and make recommendations for improvement. It also calls for a grant program for districts to access to reduce absenteeism and truancy.

LB 670 (McCoy) changes property tax valuations for agricultural land from 75% to 65%. This bill remains in committee on a 4 / 4 vote.

LB 725 (Sullivan) advanced on initial debate. This bill increases stat aid funding for MPS.

LB 923 (McGill) requires at least one hour of suicide awareness and prevention training each year for nurses, counselors, teachers, and administrators.

LB 967 (Education Committee) was heard in the Education Committee. This bill will phase out aid for instructional time and teacher education. It also contains a number of items from several bills including early childhood grants.

LB 972 (Lautenbaugh) adopts the Independent Schools Act. This bill deals with Charter schools.

LB 1103 (Sullivan) calls for a strategic planning process. Senator Sullivan refers to it as a visioning process to establish educational goals that will then drive the future formula.

Calendar April 17 – Adjourn Sine Die.

The bills in yellow have been prioritized for the session and will be debated. The other bills will not likely be debated this year. All bills that remain in committee this session will be dispensed with and will have to be reintroduced next year. I have attached the bills we are supporting and the ones we oppose. We are also monitoring a number of bills.

National News

Background Checks for School Employees

Tuesday March 11 a bill by Sen. Pat Toomey that would require periodic, comprehensive background checks for all prospective and current school employees and contractors could be voted on by the full Senate. Senator Toomey has aggressively pursued attaching his legislation, the Protecting Children from Sexual and Violent Predators Act, to any legislative vehicle in the Senate. This is the same legislation that passed the House in October. Toomey's bill would substantially increase the administrative burden on

school administrators and central office personnel without providing any additional resources. The bill is silent on who would pay for the checks, but does allow districts to use Title I administrative funds. The unions are pushing to add language requiring that districts pay for all background checks, but they do not appear to have much traction in either caucus. We are working with Republican and Democrat leaders to keep this bill off the floor and address K-12 background checks in the context of ESEA reauthorization.

Students choose more fruits, eat more veggies, data show

Harvard School of Public Health researchers who inspected more than 1,000 lunch trays at four schools found that students chose 23% more fruits and ate 16% more vegetables after U.S. Agriculture Department school-nutrition rules were issued in 2012. The study in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine did not find an increase in wasted food

Obama proposes universal preschool, new grant competition in budget

President Barack Obama's proposed fiscal 2015 budget includes \$69 billion for education, a call for universal preschool for all 4-year-old students, additional support for teachers, a new Race to the Top–Equity and Opportunity grant competition and \$70 million to expand state data-collection systems. Obama announced his budget proposal Tuesday at an elementary school in Washington, D.C.

Colo. district set to boost rigor beyond common core

Curriculum coordinators and teachers in a Colorado school district say their recent assessment of the Common Core State Standards found the standards are not rigorous enough. Educators say they plan to go beyond the common core's requirements to integrate more higher-level thinking skills. For example, one social studies teacher's lessons about the rise and fall of a civilization includes more than facts and figures -- instead, it requires comparisons to a modern civilization.

Highlights

- The Millard College-Going Rate for the Class of 2012, represented by enrollment in postsecondary education within the first year after graduation from high school (August 2012 -August 2013), is 79% compared to the Nebraska College-going Rate of 70%.
- The Millard Retention/Persistence Rate represented by the number of freshman who enrolled in college the first year after graduation who returned for the second year is 88% for the Class of 2011 compared to the State Retention Rate of 71%.
- The Millard Degree Completion for the Class of 2007 is 51%. The most recent Nebraska Degree Completion Rate is 51.1% for the Class of 2005 while the most recent National Degree Completion Rate is 54.1% for the Class of 2006. This information includes Associate, Bachelor's and Master's degrees.
- Of the graduates of the Class of 2007, 50% of the American Indian or Alaskan Native, 51% of the Asian or Pacific Islander students, 45% of the Black (not Hispanic) students, 39% of the Hispanic students, and 50% of the white students earned a degree.
- The gap between students who qualify for free and/or reduced lunch and those who do not decreased between 2009 and 2012 and increased for 2013 for enrollment immediately after graduation. However, the gap decreased from 26% in 2008 to 8% in 2012 for college enrollment within the first year. The gap for fewer students returning the second year remained constant from 2007-2010 and decreased in 2011. For post-secondary degree completion, the gap between the two groups decreased from 2005 to 2006 high school graduates (24% to 21%) and increased for 2007 graduates to 28%.
- As with the Class of 2006, thirty-one percent of the graduates in the Class of 2007 identified Human Sciences and Education related majors, with 24% (28%) Business, Marketing and Management related majors, 18% (13%) Health Science related majors, 12% (10%) Communication and Information Systems related majors, 11% (12%) Skilled and Technical Sciences related majors, and 2% (3%) Agriculture, Food & Natural Resources related majors.
- The post-secondary institutions most frequently attended by the classes of 2006-2013 included Metropolitan Community College, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and University of Nebraska at Omaha, Creighton University, and Iowa Western Community College. While these are the same institutions showing greatest attendance by Millard graduates, UNL and UNO switched order of attendees between the last report year and this report year.

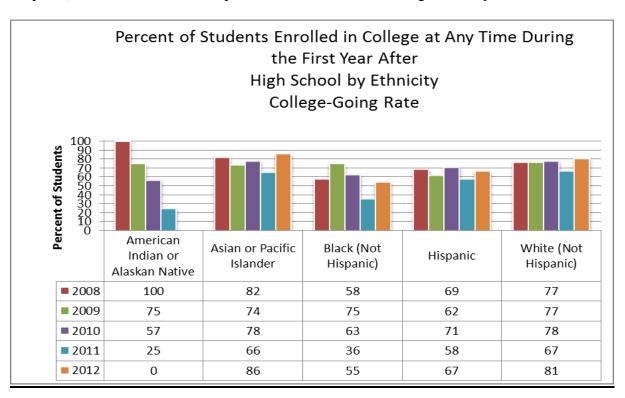

College-going Rate Millard Five Year History

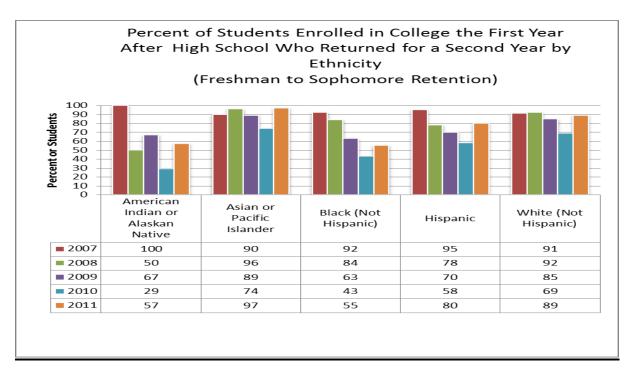

Eighty-eight percent of the 2011 Millard graduates returned for a second year while 89% percent of the Class of 2010 returned for second year.

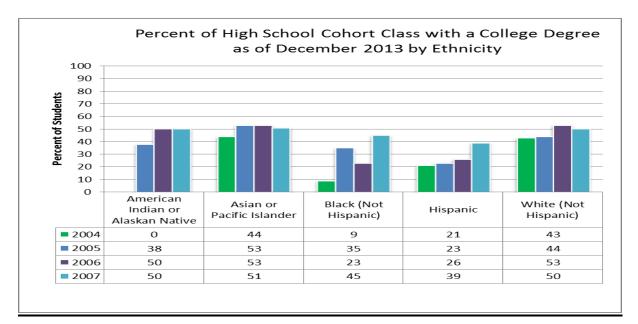


Degree Completion Four Year History

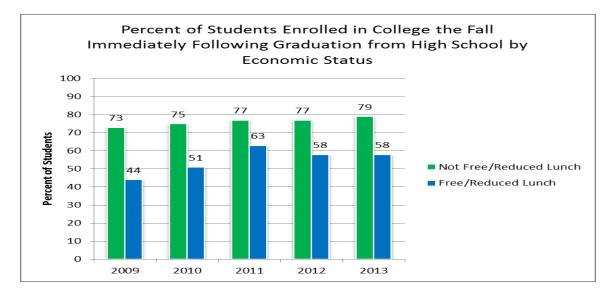

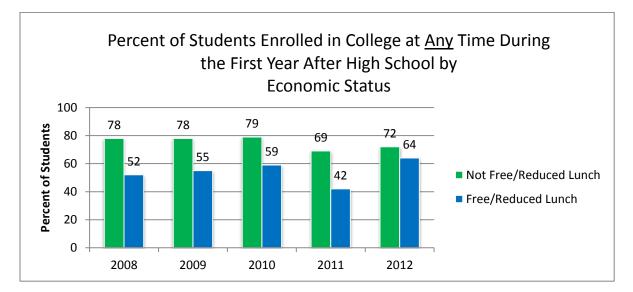
College-going Rate by Economic Status Five Year History

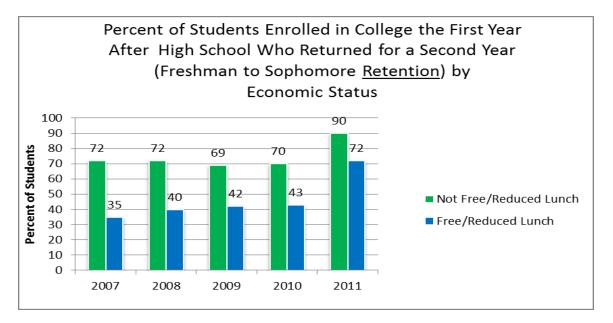


Of the class of 2012, 64% of those who qualified for free/reduced lunch and 72% of those who did not qualify enrolled in college any time during the first year after high school graduation. A greater percent of students who qualify for free and reduced lunch than those who do not qualify delayed enrollment to winter after graduation. The difference in college enrollment any time the first year after graduation between those who qualify for free/reduced lunch and those who do not decreased from 26% in 2008 to 8% in 2012.



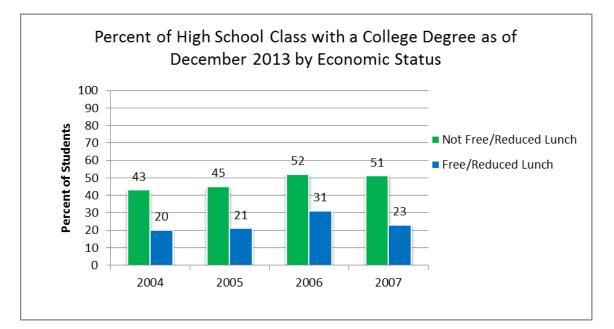
Retention Rate by Economic Status Five Year History

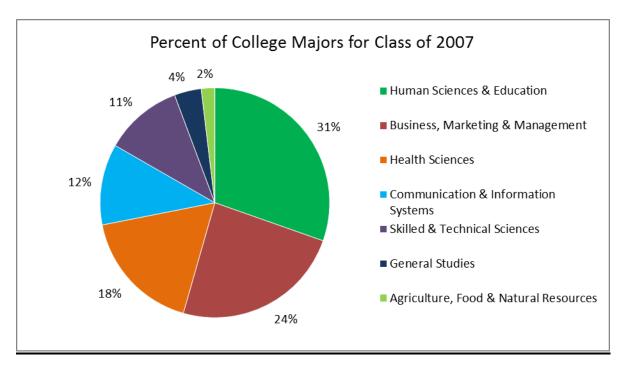

Post-secondary Activity of Students Not Reported

The National Student Clearinghouse includes enrollment records for 96% of the Nation's postsecondary institutions. Graduates not represented may have gone directly to work, enrolled in the military, or enrolled in one of the 4% of the institutions not represented by the Clearinghouse.

Examples of institutions not included are Vatterott College, Kaplan College, University of Phoenix, and some private career schools such as schools of cosmetology, massage therapy schools, real estate schools, etc.
