MILLARD PUBLIC SCHOOLS FYE15 BUGET PUBLIC BUDGET HEARING SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 17 SEPTEMBER 2, 2014

At 6:00 p.m. Pat Ricketts opened the public hearing.

Roll call was taken, Board members present were Mike Pate, Pat Ricketts, Linda Poole, Mike Kennedy and Paul Meyer. Absent from the hearing was Dave Anderson.

Mike Kennedy made a motion to excuse Dave Anderson from the meeting, seconded by Paul Meyer. Voting in favor of said motion was: Mrs. Poole, Mr. Kennedy, Mr. Meyer, Mr. Pate and Mr. Ricketts. Voting against were: None. Motion carried.

President, Pat Ricketts, announced that the open meetings laws are posted and available for public inspection.

Mr. Ricketts stated that two hearings were being conducted. The first hearing was on adopting the Proposed FYE15 Budget and the second hearing was on the proposed property tax request required to fund the Proposed FYE15 Budget.

Prior to conducting the hearing, Mr. Ricketts gave Ken Fossen some time to present information related to the hearing topics. The proposed budget would provide for \$218.3 million in spending, a 2.2 percent increase. The tax levy would be raised by 2 cents per \$100 of valuation. The money raised would go into the building fund.

Some Board members said the 2-cent levy increase would avoid cuts in programs, maintain facilities and avoid depleting the district's reserves. Mike Pate said that maintaining cash reserves is fiscally responsible. He also mentioned that Millard has the lowest per-student cost in the state and high test scores, which reflects a good return on investment.

Linda Poole, Mike Kennedy, Mike Pate and Pat Ricketts, all said they were in support of the increase. Mr. Meyer feels that taxes are piling on and some families already have a difficult time making ends meet.

Mr. Ricketts had two requests to speak from the public. Called to the podium to speak was Dick Wilson of 3932 S. 183 Ave. Mr. Wilson stated his concerns on the budget. Also, called to the podium was Doug Kagan of 12320 William St. Mr. Kagan represents Nebraska Taxpayers for Freedom. Mr. Kagan offered the Board suggestions on how to make cuts without increasing taxes.

Mr. Ricketts opened the second hearing on the Proposed FYE15 Property Tax request. The purpose of this hearing was to receive testimony from the public on the proposed tax request to fund the Proposed Budget for FYI15.

Mr. Ricketts received no request to speak on this issue and asked for a request to adjourn the meeting.

Reports:

Enrollment Report: Tami Williams reported that the Millard numbers are just shy of 1% growth. Millard would need around 30 students to hit 1%.

Leadership Development Report: Dr. Sutfin gave an overview of how staff can develop leadership skills in our district. He explained that once a selection is made for someone to become an administrator in the District, they then participate in a two year new administrator induction program that is over-seen by Dr. Kim Saum-Mills. Dr. Sutfin explained that candidates are selected through an application process, then interviews are conducted by the executive team and scored followed by a meet and confer with applicants being selected. Dr. Sutfin said it is an extremely competitive process. Dr. Heather Phipps added that there are several ways listed in the report for all teaching staff to further their leadership skills.

Legislative Standing Positions Report: Nolan Beyer reported that each year we bring a list of standing positions that we provide our lobby to guide them before the session starts in January. Typically, this would come as an action item for approval. Because we are bringing a recommendation to add a Standing Position, it is being brought to the Board in report form. The new Standing Position states: The Millard Public Schools opposes legislation that establishes tuition tax credits, vouchers, and private charter schools. Rationale: The District has opposed all attempts to channel public money to private schools and circumvent the control of the local Board of Education. Mrs. Poole felt that this should be brought to the attention of NASB and get their support also.

Open, Option and Within District Transfer Report: Bill Jelkin stated that we are down in open enrollment as compared to last year. Part of the reason for this was the reduction of two kindergarten classrooms. This reduction is necessary to control numbers later on at the middle and high schools. Dr. Sutfin said the middle school numbers capped before the open enrollment ceaclline. Word may have spread that Millard was full and therefore, parents did not apply. Dr. Sutfin also commented that we have wanted to use open enrollment to control our numbers. Mr. Jelkin added that people are trying to option their children in early, in kindergarten and 1st grade, and continue on through our school system.

Student Services Report: Bill Jelkin provided the Student services report. Attendance rates are very good at 96%. The graduation rate is at 94.3%. Mr. Jelkin also stated that discipline numbers were very good for a district of 23,500 plus students. He also pointed out that scholarships are up 1.6 million dollars. Mr. Pate brought up bullying and felt we should continue to work on this issue in the schools and find a way to educate the public more. Mrs. Poole brought up the in consistency in reporting discipline incidences in one school as compared to another. She also wanted to know how the reports look compared to schools using BIST and those using PBIS. Mr. Kennedy wants to make sure we are doing everything possible to handle any drug issues.

Paul Meyer stated that the Board is here to represent the people who put us here. The people that Paul has spoken to think there is too much *piling on* by the government and its entities. Mr. Meyer feels there is a lot of waste and the "wants" can be made to sound logical when it is actually not a "need". He was not in favor of the proposed budget.

Pat Ricketts gave an update of what has been happening over the last few years that has led up to this point and said we knew it was coming. He said he does not take this lightly. If the increase goes through, Millard will still have the lowest cost per student in ESU #3 and #19. Mr. Ricketts vote is to keep the quality programs in tack so we can continue to provide opportunities to achieve high results.

Mike Kennedy said he has been on the Board for 12 years and thinks we have a quality program. He feels the administrators in the district have done a good job in shielding us from the cuts. There have now been cuts in job positions and people are going without. He said next we will have to cut programs and make cuts in the classroom. Mr. Kennedy said he is not willing to do that. Mr. Kennedy stated he will be voting for the 2 cent increase to help ensure that students 13 years from now will be receiving a world class education.

Linda Poole said some very good points had been made and did not want to reiterate them. She said that toth she and Mike Pate are going on their 19th year as Board members. When they first were elected, Millard had a line of credit and she does not want to go down that path again. Mrs. Poole said that we have been planning on this for a long time and as a Board member, she is doing her job to insure that Millard students continue to receive a quality education. Mrs. Poole said she would be voting for the 2 cent increase.

Dave Anderson said the value that we provide our taxpayers is very good. We have known that we would be facing this issue. We have done a great job at keeping the levy at \$1.23 for a long time. Millard has been growing and property values have been flat. We have technology needs and we are no longer funding that out of the building fund. Mr. Anderson said that we do not like to go up 2 cents, but it will be at the detriment of the kids and he is not willing to do that. Mr. Anderson said he would support the increase.

Mike Pate said he has three things he is concerned with. 1. The loss of State Aid. State aid formulas were changed and cuts were made by roughly \$2,500,000. 2. Reserves. We have had to use our reserves and maintaining reserves is critically important. 3. Return on investment. Mr. Pate said this is good in two ways, student achievement and property values of homes in the Millard school district. For these reasons, Mr. Pate said he is in favor of supporting the increase because it is the right thing to do.

Paul Meyer said he agrees that we do need to maintain reserves and keeping up maintenance is important, but he also thinks cutbacks can be made.

Mr. Ricketts asked for roll call. Voting in favor of said motion was: Mr. Pate, Mr. Kennedy, Mr. Ricketts, Mrs. Poole and Mr. Anderson. Voting against was: Mr. Meyer. Motion carried.

Motion by Linda Poole and seconded by Mike Pate to approve the Resolution Regarding FYE15 Property Tax Requests as submitted and that such resolution be incorporated in its entirety into this motion. Voting in favor of said motion was: Mr. Kennedy, Mr. Ricketts, Mrs. Poole and Mr. Anderson and Mr. Pate. Voting against was: Mr. Meyer. Motion carried.

There were no requests to speak on non-agenda items. Mr. Ricketts adjourned the meeting at 6:25 p.m.

The members of the Board of Education met as a Committee of the Whole on Monday, September 8, 2014 at the Don Stroh Administration Center, 5606 South 147th Street.

Mrs. Poole stated this was the time for public questions and comments. There were none.

The first item on the agenda was a presentation on Digital Learning by Dr. Curtis Case.

Dr. Case stated that Millard's Strategic Plan, Stradegy 2, Action Plan 6, drives Digital Learning. This action plan reads: Expand use of and access to interactive tools and technology to support and improve PK-12 learning and innovation.

He explained that Digital Learning encompasses instructional practices that effectively increase student and teacher productivity, creativity, innovation, and engagement through enhanced learning experiences using a wide spectrum of digital resources that improve teaching, learning, and achievement.

Dr. Case went on to say that text books are a resource, but there are so many more resources available. It is a new change in thinking. Future learning for Millard schools would include ebooks, interactive etextbooks, video, documents, web links, smartboard presentations, etc.

Millard is already using some digital learning. Gaggle is used for student email and as collaboration tools. ANGEL is used for staff development for staff and for students in high school classes, Interactive White Boards are being used (SmartBoard) and iPads.

Dr. Case said that Millard Schools will be substituting, replacing and increasing digital resources and devices. The connection to the internet needs to be improved and increased along with the connections between buildings and within the buildings.

The second item on the agenda was an On-Line Board Packet Training by Craig Caples, Chief Information Officer at Nebraska Education Technology Services. Board members were shown how this product works. There were some concerns by Board members on the quick assessability to attachments. The system we use now allows for all attachments to be included in one document. The new system has an attachment for each action item or report.

No decisions are being made at this time in regard to moving forward with this product.

- II. No money for such private travel shall be deposited into school District funds nor shall any expenses for such private travel be paid out of District funds.
- III. No fundraising activities for such private travel shall be conducted on school grounds or as part of any school activity.
- IV. No teacher, administrator, or other employee of the District shall, in his/her capacity as a District employee, promote private travel plans in his/her classroom, at school activities, or during any other time when the teacher is on duty with the District. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a teacher may, during the summer months when he/she is not under contract with the District, provide services to a private organization conducting foreign travel tours.

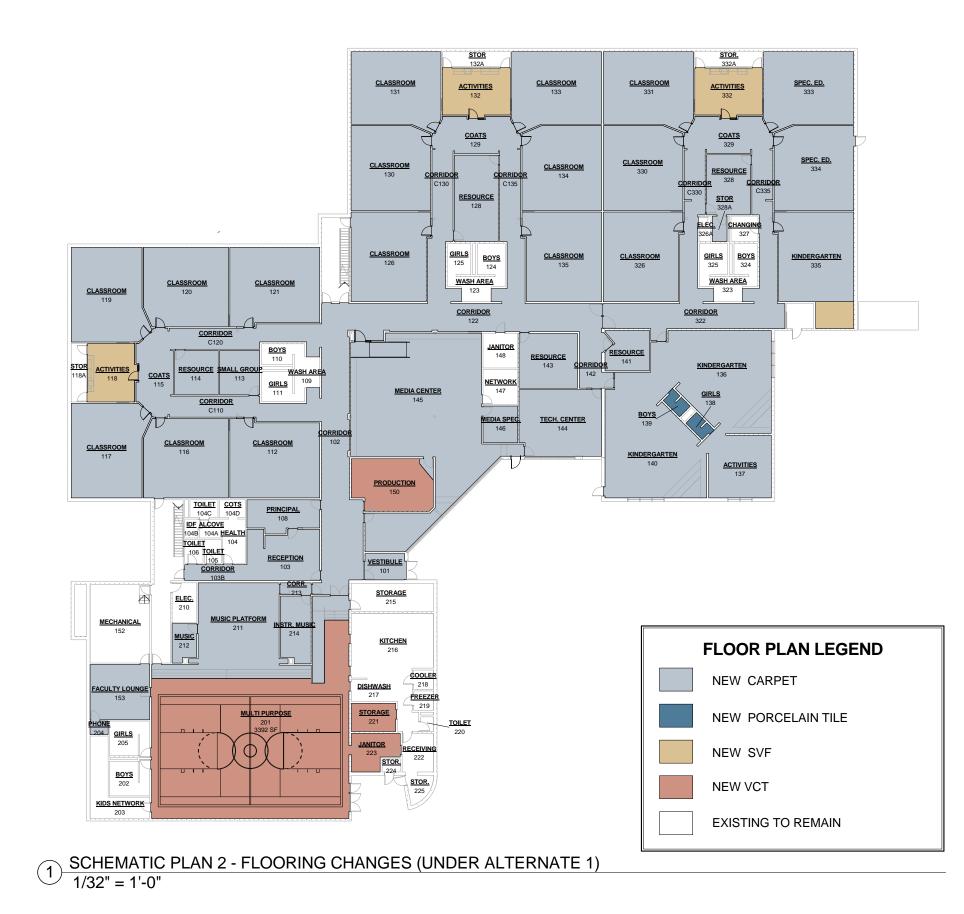

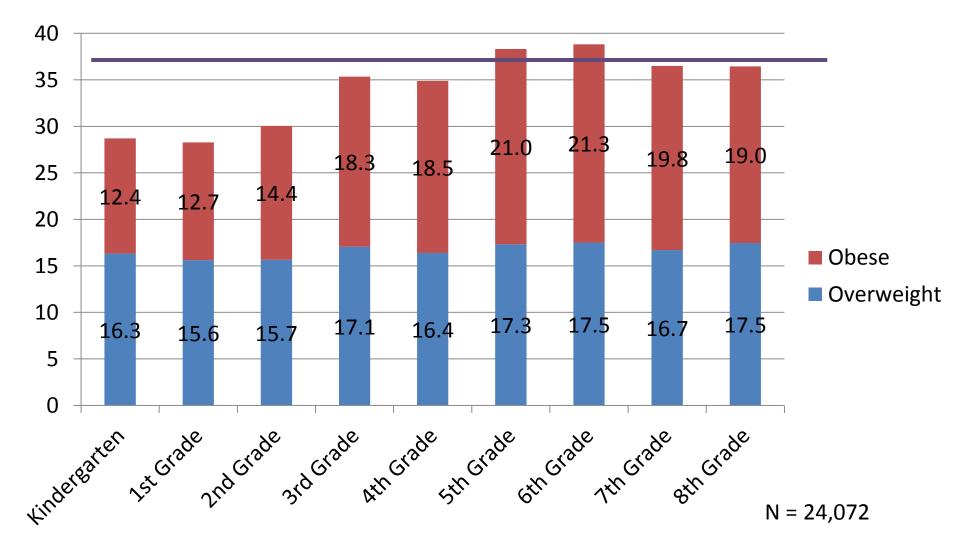

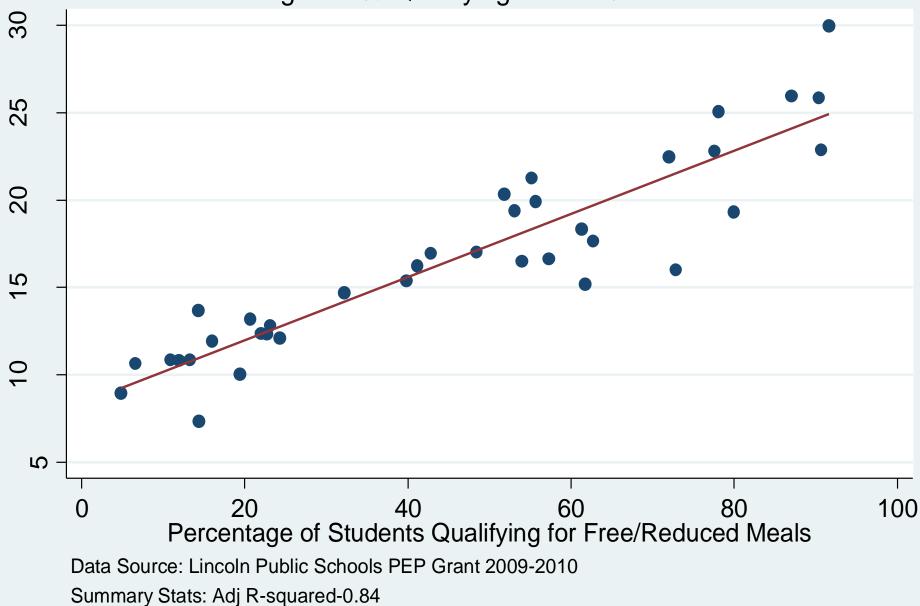

Lincoln Elementary Schools Obesity Prevalence Plotted Against % Qualifying for Free/Reduced Meals



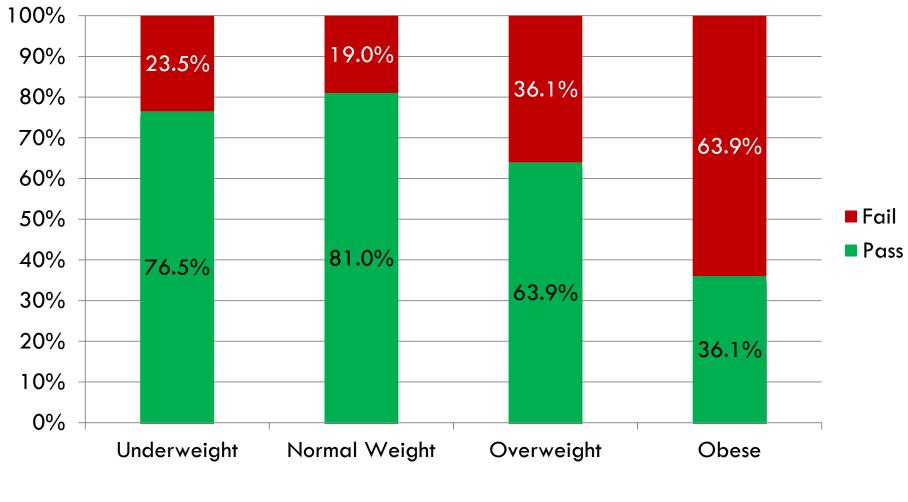

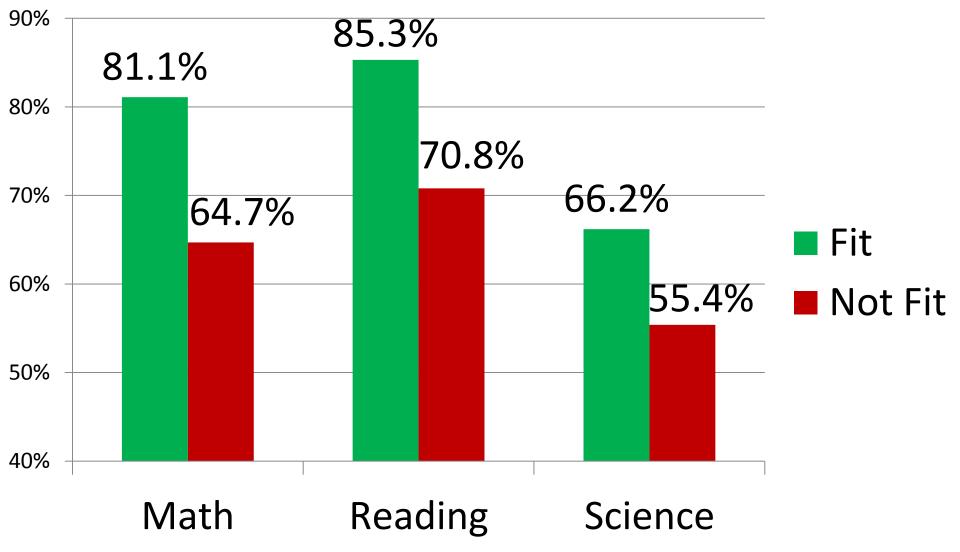
Percent of 4th-8th Grade Students Passing Aerobic **Fitness Test** by Weight Status 2012-2013



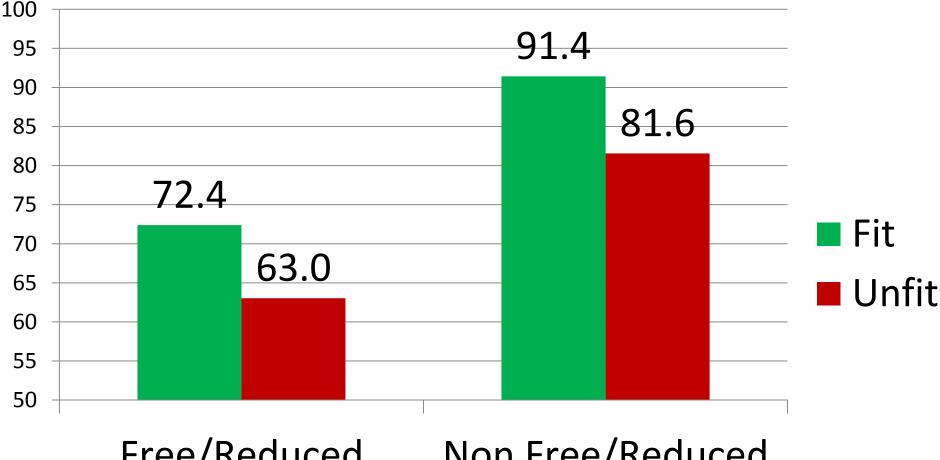

Evidence that Aerobic Fitness Is More Salient than Weight Status in Predicting Standardized Math and Reading Outcomes in Fourth- through Eighth-Grade Students

Objective To determine whether aerobic fitness is more salient than weight status in predicting performance on standardized math and reading tests in fourth- to eighth-grade students.

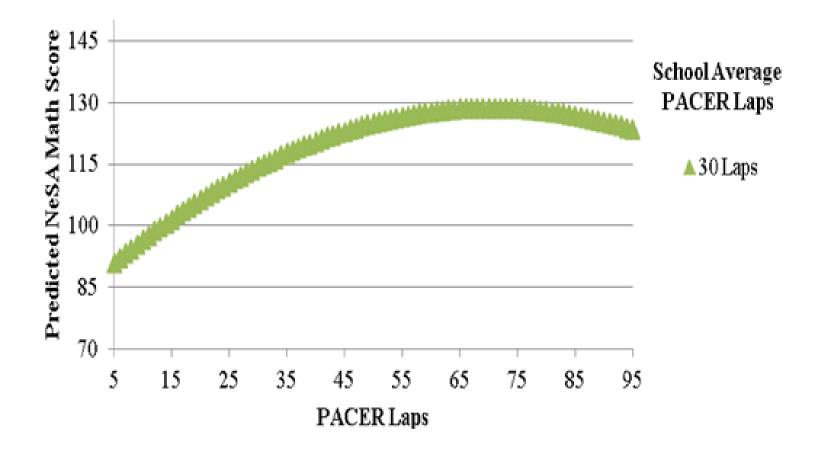
Study design A cross-sectional study of data abstracted from 11743 students in 47 public schools. Aerobic fitness was defined by entering the healthy fitness zone of Fitnessgram's Progressive Aerobic Cardiovascular Endurance Run, which has been shown to correlate highly with maximum oxygen consumption. Mixed-effects logistic regression analyses were conducted to model the student-level effect of aerobic fitness status on passing the Nebraska State Accountability (NeSA) math and reading tests after adjusting for body mass index (BMI) percentile, free/reduced lunch status, sex, race, grade level, and school type.

Results After adjustment, aerobically fit students had greater odds of passing the NeSA math and reading tests compared with aerobically unfit students regardless of whether the students received free/reduced lunch; however, the effect of being aerobically fit on the standardized test scores was significantly greater for students not receiving free/reduced lunch. Weight status, as measured by BMI percentile, was not a significant predictor of passing the NeSA math or reading test after including free/reduced lunch status in the model.

Conclusions Aerobic fitness was a significant predictor of academic performance; weight status was not. Although decreasing BMI for an overweight or obese child undoubtedly improves overall health, results indicated all students benefit academically from being aerobically fit regardless of weight or free/reduced lunch status. Therefore, to improve academic performance, school systems should focus on the aerobic fitness of every student. (*J Pediatr 2013*; \blacksquare : \blacksquare - \blacksquare).

The number of AP Exams increased from 2,995 during the 2012-2013 school year to 3,077 last school year. While more Millard students are taking AP Exams, students still perform well compared to their counterparts across the state and globally. Sixty-three percent of the Millard students earned a 3 or higher, compared to
	 Fifty-four percent of Millard students earlied a 5 of higher, compared to the state average of 60% and Global average of 61%. Fifty-four percent of Millard graduates completed at least one AP course while in high school. The number of AP Scholars increased by 1, with 348 students named as scholars as a result of 2013-2014 testing. Included in the 348 AP Scholars were 82 students who received AP Scholars with Distinction. One of two State Scholars was from Millard Public Schools.
	The financial support provided by the Millard Public Schools Foundation continued to assist in the increase of exams taken during the 2012-2013 school year. The cost of taking an AP exam in 2014 was \$89.00. Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, the Foundation paid for all AP exams not funded through UNO Dual Enrollment course registration. In 2013-2014 this was a financial commitment of \$239,677.00, which was an increase of \$11,926.00.
RECOMMENDATIONS:	The recommendation is to continue to support growth of the AP culture by encouraging students to take AP courses and exams and continue to add AP courses for students when identified through the curriculum cycle process.
STRATEGIC PLAN:	The 2004 Strategic Plan established action plans that were activated in 2005 calling for the creation of an AP culture, providing systematic training and support for AP teachers, and ensuring the AP curriculum for AP courses is aligned with College Board standards for Advanced Placement exams. The 2009 Strategic Plan including Strategy 2, Plan 3 and Strategy 4, Plan 4 called to support promoting personal excellence, increasing student achievement, and engaging students. The 2013 Strategic Plan included the focus on Career and College Readiness.

- AP course completion decreased slightly at all three high schools while test enrollment increased at all three high schools as noted in the table above. Millard North maintained the greatest number of exams taken. AP exams taken increased by 82 compared to the 2012-2013 school year.
- Of the total AP exams taken in 2013-2014, 56% of the exams were scored as 3, 4 or 5, compared to 2012-13, 57.2% (includes multiple exams per student).
- Of the Millard students taking AP exams in 2013-14 (1,564), 63% of the students earned 3, 4 or 5. Of the Nebraska students taking AP exams in 2013-14, 60% of the students earned 3, 4 or 5; the Global (United States and other countries) average was 61%. Millard students taking AP exams exceeded Nebraska and Global performance (based on non-duplicated students).
- The number of students recognized by College Board as AP Scholars continued to grow during 2013-2014 with 348 AP Scholars in Millard, an increase of 1 AP Scholar from 2012-2013.
- In 2013-2014, one of the two Nebraska State Scholars was from Millard Public Schools. The Male State Scholar was from Millard West High School with a 4.33 average on 18 exams.
- Fifty-four percent of Millard graduates have completed at least one AP course while in high school.
- In 2013-2014, Millard students accounted for 32% (3,030/9,536) of the exams taken in Nebraska for the 23 courses MPS offers.
- During 2013-2014, there were a total 3,077 exams taken in Millard (course and non-course exams) compared to 11,008 across the state. Millard Public School students took 28% of total exams within the state. Millard students took 86% of the Environmental Science exams. Other courses where Millard students took 50% or more of the state AP exams were in Music Theory (61%), European History (55%), and Latin: Vergil (54%), German Language (53%), and Statistics (51%). They took 40% or more of the state AP exams Computer Science A (44%), Microeconomics (41%), and Human Geography (40%).

Advanced Placement Strategy & Action Plans

The 2004 Strategic Plan established action plans that were activated in 2005 calling for the creation of an AP culture, providing systematic training and support for AP teachers, and ensuring the AP curriculum for AP courses is aligned with College Board standards for Advanced Placement exams.

The 2009 Strategic Plan including Strategy 2, Action Plan 3 call to actively engage students, families and staff to improve student achievement and attain personal excellence, and Strategy 4, Action Plan 4 to utilize instructional best practices, formative and summative assessments, and student data designed to ensure high achievement for all students and all demographic subgroups, which both support promoting personal excellence, increasing student achievement, and engaging students. Advanced Placement[®] courses provide the opportunity for students to achieve personal excellence by engaging in rigorous courses.

Advanced Placement[®] Courses

Advanced Placement[®] Courses follow the curriculum recommendations of the College Board. The course and corresponding exam provide for a rigorous, fast paced, college level class. During the 2013-2014 school year, Millard offered 23 Advanced Placement[®] courses. Courses are listed below with the number of exams taken.

Students may elect to take exams even though the district does not provide a corresponding course. Forty-seven non-course exams were completed by Millard students during 2013-2014. Examples this past year included: Art History (1), Chinese Language and Culture (1), U.S. Government & Politics (10), Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism (11), Physics C: Mechanics (15), and World History (9).

Student Course and Test Enrollment

Overall, there has been an annual increase in completion of Advanced Placement[®] classes since the 2005-2006 school year when the AP Plan was implemented. Course completion decreased in the 2013-2014 school year by 29 students, but still above from the 2011-2012 school year as noted in Chart 1. The focus of testing is to provide students the opportunity to take a national test, which is utilized as a measure to predict success in college. Students may compare their test results with students nationally who are taking the same exam.

Chart 1 shows the number of students who completed AP courses compared to the number of exams taken as a result of participation in the provided courses.

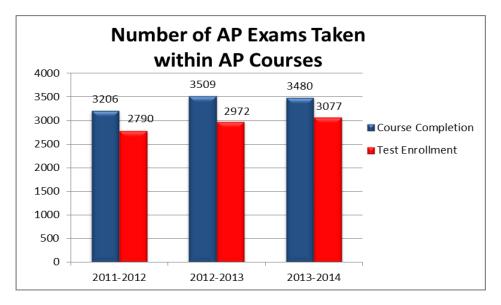

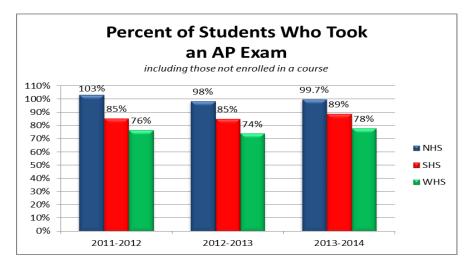
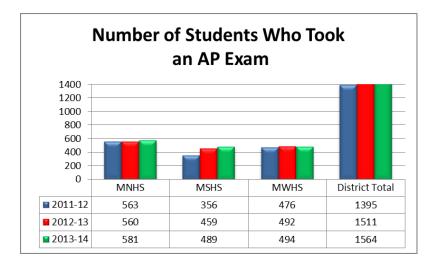
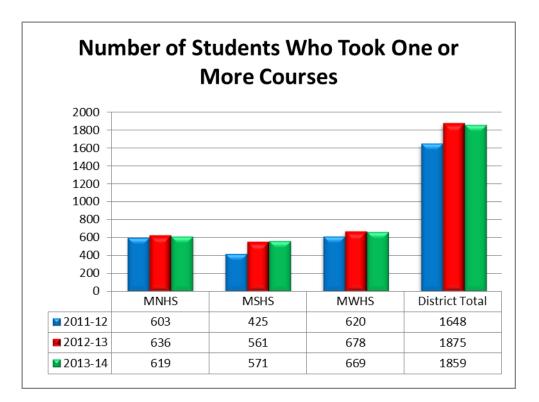


Chart 2 reflects the percent of AP participants who took the AP exam by high school building, including students who took an AP Exam for a course offered in Millard, but did not enroll in the course and those that took an exam for courses not offered in Millard.



The number of students who took at least one AP Exam increased by 53 between the 2012-2013 school year and the 2013-2014 school year as noted in the above chart.



While Millard South High School again showed an increase in the number of students who took one or more Advanced Placement courses during 2013-2014; overall, there was a slight decrease from 1,875 in 2012-2013 to 1,859 in 2013-2014 as noted in the above chart.

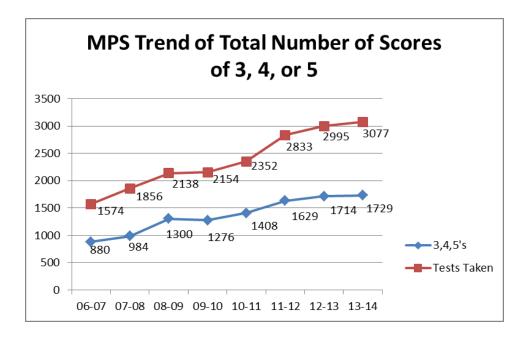

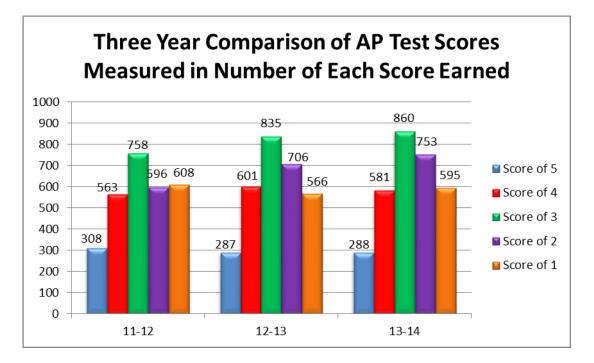
Advanced Placement[®] Examination grades are reported on a five-point scale as follows:

- 5 = Extremely well qualified;
- 4 = Well qualified;
- 3 =Qualified;
- 2 = Possibly qualified;
- 1 = No recommendation

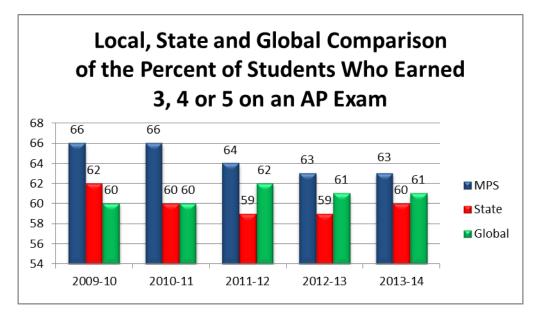
These grade categories are designed to reflect achievement scores in the AP course that is analogous to performance in a comparable college course. Fifty-six percent of the exams taken by Millard students had a score of 3, 4 or 5 in 2013-2014 compared with 57% in 2012-2013.



Comparison of district scores from the last three years shows that the number of students performing at high levels on this national measure increased annually. The highest number of 3, 4, and 5 scores (1,729) were obtained during the 2013-2014 school year.



Sixty-three percent of Millard students earned a 3, 4 or 5 on the AP Exam compared with the state average of 60% and the Global (United States and other countries) average of 61% as noted in the below chart. In order for a student to be counted within this percentage, he/she had to earn a 3, 4 or 5 on each exam taken regardless of the number taken.

The College Board recognizes students who have distinguished themselves academically by announcing AP award recipients.

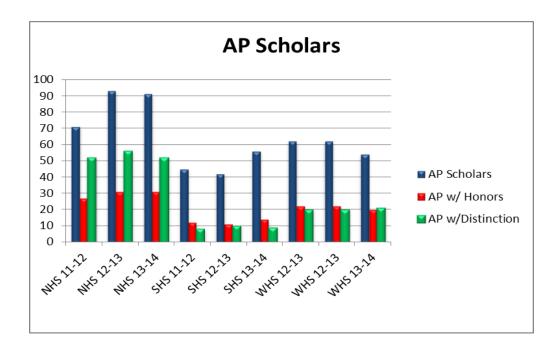
- AP Scholars = Grades of 3 or higher on 3 or more AP exams (full year courses)

Included in the 348 scholars for the district were 65 students recognized as AP Scholars with Honors and 82 students achieved AP Scholars with Distinction.

In addition, the College Board designates 2 State Scholars per state, one male and one female, with grades of 3 or higher on the greatest number of AP Exams, and then the highest average grade (at least 3.5) on all AP Exams taken. The 2013-2014 Nebraska State Male Scholar was from Millard West High School.

The College Board designates National AP Scholars to students who receive an average grade of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 4 or higher in eight or more of these exams. This past year, NHS had fifteen and WHS had two for a district total of 17, which was an increase of three from 2012-2013.



MPS Foundation Advanced Placement[®] Support

As the number of Millard students taking AP Exams increased, a greater need for financial support has continued. The financial support provided by the Millard Public Schools Foundation continued to assist in the increase of exams taken during the 2013-2014 school year. The cost of taking an AP exam in 2014 was \$89.00.

Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, the Foundation paid for all AP exams not funded through UNO Dual Enrollment course registration. In 2013-2014 this was a financial commitment of \$239,677.00.

Background:	 On August 11, 2003, Millard Public Schools approved a University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) Dual Enrollment option. Through this opportunity, students enroll in selected Advanced Placement[®] courses, take the course for high school credit at the same time as they pay tuition, and receive transferable credit through UNO. Dual enrollment opportunities include seven non-Advanced Placement[®] courses at UNO and courses completed through Metropolitan Community College (MCC) by participation in a Millard Career Academy or a MCC Career Academy. Each UNO department establishes criteria for dual enrollment. The ability to offer dual enrollment varies for each building every year based on teacher credentials and the criteria established by UNO. Students paid \$250.00 per course regardless of the number of credits for courses dual enrolled through UNO. UNO tuition for a full time student is \$196.75 per credit hour for undergraduate students. This represents a savings of \$351,286 for the 2,835 UNO credits earned by Millard students. Students paid \$25.00 per course regardless of the course students.
	enrolled through MCC. MCC tuition for a full time student is \$63.00 per credit hour. This represents a savings of \$314,055 for the 4,985 MCC credits earned by Millard students. The total savings due to reduced tuition of \$665,341 benefits students, their families and the MPS Foundation.

INTRODUCTION

The American College Test (ACT) is a widely used college admissions test that is typically taken by high school juniors and seniors. It measures skills students have learned in high school and will need for academic success in college. The ACT is a 2 hour and 55 minute assessment that consists of 215 questions distributed among four tests:

English 75 items/45 minutes

Mathematics 60 items/60 minutes

Reading 40 items/35 minutes

Science Reasoning 40 items/35 minutes

Students receive a score for each of the four tests as well as a composite score. The composite score is the average of the four test scores, rounded to the nearest whole number. Test and composite scores range from 1 to 36.

There is an optional ACT Writing test that measures skill in planning and writing a short essay. The Writing test is not included in the composite score.

ACT reports College Readiness Benchmark Scores. A College Benchmark score is the minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher, or about a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college course. The benchmark scores, which are based on the actual college performance of students who have taken the ACT, are listed below:

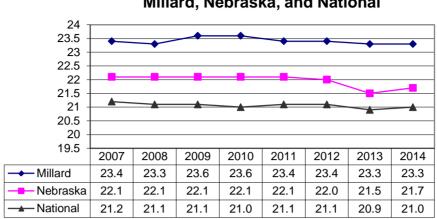

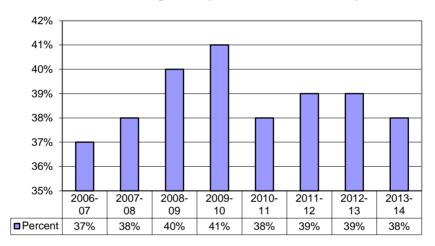

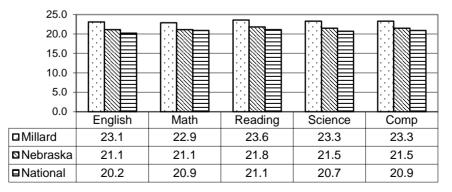


ACT Composite Scores Over 8 Years Millard, Nebraska, and National

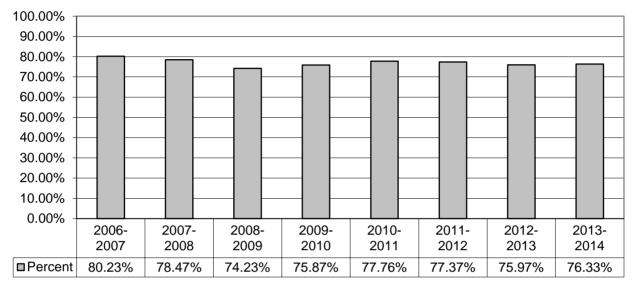
Percent of Millard Students Scoring in Top Quartile Nationally



Comparison of ACT Average Scores with Other Groups 2013-2014

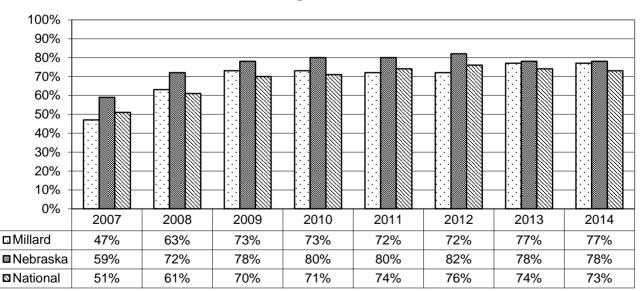

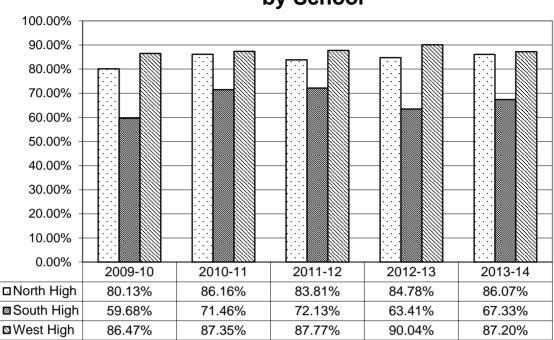


Percent of Millard Seniors Taking the ACT Over Eight Years

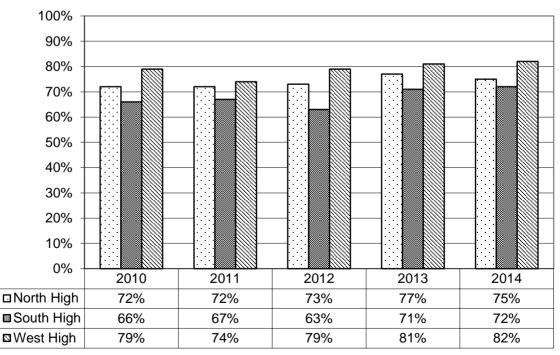


Percent of ACT-Tested Students Who Reported Taking Core Curriculum

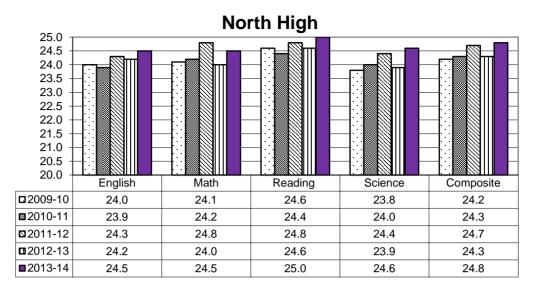


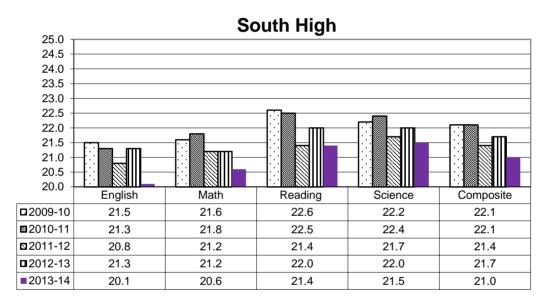
Percent of Seniors Taking the ACT by School

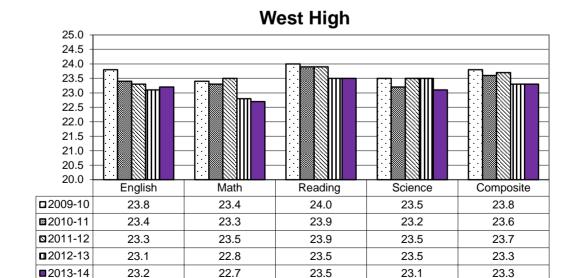
Percent of ACT-Tested Students Who Reported Taking Core Curriculum

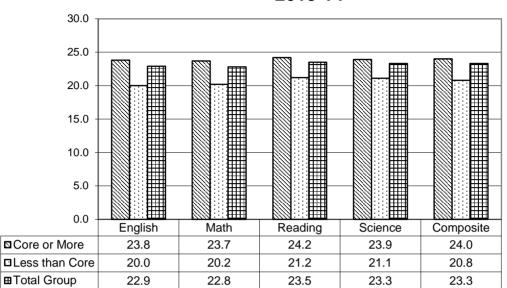


Average ACT Scores over Five Years



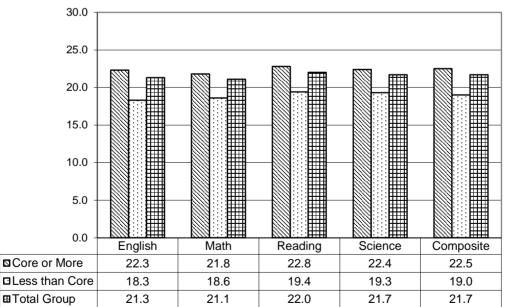






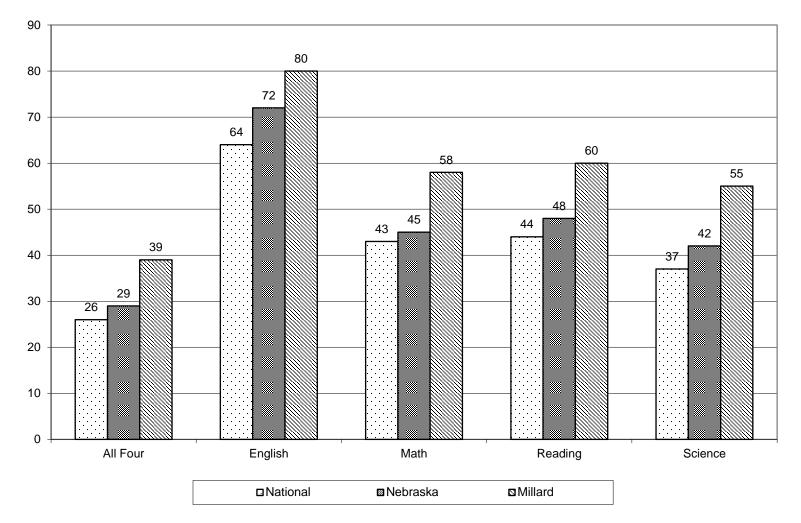

INTRODUCTION

On April 23, 2014, Millard Public Schools sponsored our first Spring District Choice State Testing (DCST) ACT test for all Millard juniors who participate in the general education curriculum. 1,673 Millard juniors took the ACT that day and earned an 11th grade DCST ACT Composite of 21.4. This is our first year of 11th grade DCST ACT testing is considered a baseline year.

Millard Public Schools is committed to college and career readiness for all students. The ACT assessment is one tool to measure current academic development, explore career/training options, and make plans for the remaining time in high school and post-graduation years. Starting with the Class of 2016 (this year's juniors), the ACT College Readiness Benchmarks are part of our local district definition of College and Career Readiness Metric required to earn a Millard Public Schools high school diploma.

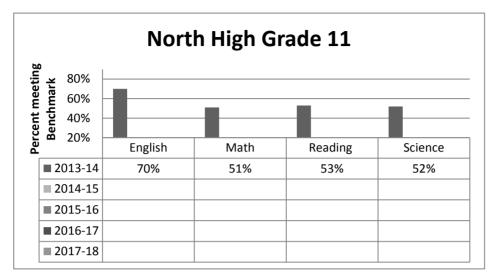
Average DCST Grade 11 ACT Scores over Five Years

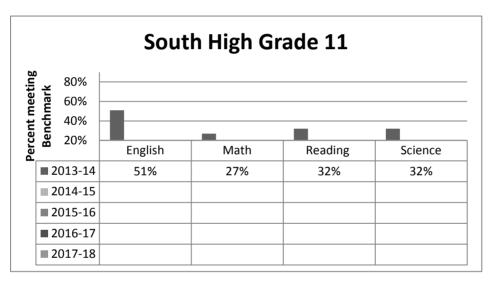


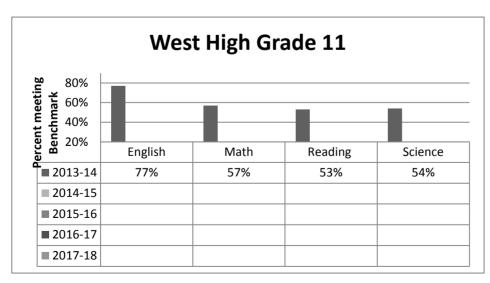




Percent Meeting 11th Grade DCST ACT College Benchmark Scores By School

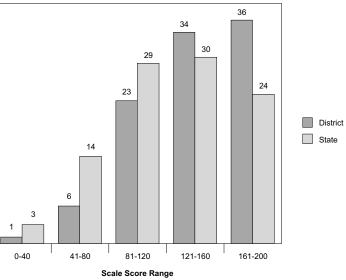

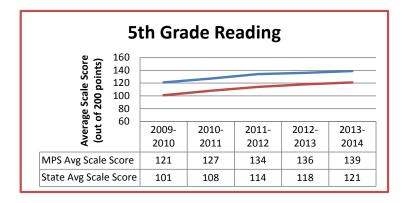
State Writing Standards were not assessed in grades 8 and 11 in 2001-2002. In 2010-2011, 11th graders participated in NeSA-Writing Pilot testing. No district or individual results are available for 11th graders in 2010-2011. 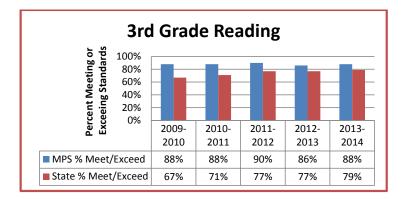

The increase from 75% to 77% of our 4th graders meeting or exceeding the standards indicates a continued, positive focus on writing skills.

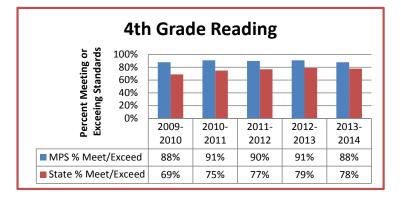


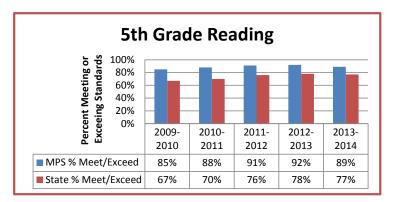


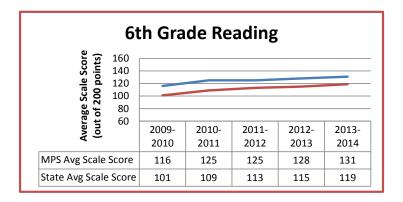

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE EXIT SURVEY

- The percentage of students who participated in extracurricular activities remained stable at Millard North, South and West High Schools. Twenty-four percent of the students who took the survey at Horizon High School reported participating in extra-curricular activities (decrease from 48.2% in 2013 and 40.6% in 2012).
- The percent of students who held a job while attending high school has gradually declined from 86.8% in 2009 to 81.9% in 2012, increased slightly to 83.7% in 2013 and decreased to 83% in 2014. Of the students who reported holding a job while in high school, 64% (decrease from 67% in 2013) worked 20 hours a week or less, while 37% (increase from 33%) worked more than 20 hours a week. Students could select more than one response.
- The degree of uncertainty about the nature of future work fluctuated from 24.2% in 2010 to 23.7% in 2011, 26% in 2012 and declined to 22.5% in 2013 and 20.5% in 2014.
- The percent of students who feel adequately prepared to achieve their educational or training goals decreased from 84% in 2013 to 81% in 2014 with more students not feeling as prepared and more feeling unsure if they were adequately prepared.
- Ninety-three percent of the respondents in 2014 (stable since 2010) expect to be in school at least part of the time a year after they graduate from high school.
- Sixty-five percent (increase from 60% in 2013) of all students report earning a grade point average of 3.0 or higher, and 26.4% (26.7% in 2013) report applying themselves "very much" during high school.
- The percent of respondents who felt they took challenging courses fluctuated from 53.4% in 2010 to 56.7% in 2012 to 54% in 2013 and 55.7% in 2014.
- The number of students who report a GPA of 3.0-4.0⁺ have fluctuated from 62.2% in 2012, 60.2% in 2013 and 64% in 2014.
- The order of most to least frequently selected career fields changed slightly. Health Sciences moved from third to first, Human Resources shifted from first to second and Business, Marketing & Management moved from second to third.
