Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Daily Record on Friday, February 13, 2015; a copy of the publication is being attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board of Education and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice and the agenda are attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in advance notice and in the notice of the Board of Education of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

President, Pat Ricketts, announced that the open meetings laws are posted and available for public inspection. Mr. Ricketts asked everyone to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Jordon Newsom, student representative from Millard South High School reported on the academic and athletic happenings at her school. Libby Baxter, student representative from Millard North High School and Kellie Ecklund, student representative from Millard West High School were absent from the meeting.

Transportation ID Badge Project: Ken Fossen reported that this week Sandoz Elementary will begin piloting the new I.D. Badge program for students getting on and off the bus. This project is being tested in an effort to keep track of students that ride the bus and assure their safety. Mr. Fossen explained that a devise will be attached to a GPS system that is already on the bus. Students will swipe their I.D. badge when boarding and also when getting off the bus. Dr. Heidi Penke, Principal at Sandoz Elementary has attached the badges to lanyards which are then kept in the students' backpacks in an effort to keep from losing them.

Construction Report - Sampson: Dave Cavlovic with Sampson Construction was present to give the construction update and to answer questions. The Abbott Elementary bid was previously rejected and has been rescheduled to bid on March 10. The Willowdale Elementary bids will be on February 26. - I. All certificated personnel shall be evaluated in accordance with the District's written procedures on appraisal forms provided by the **District Human Resources Office** as follows:
 - A. Probationary certificated employees shall be evaluated at least once each semester in accordance with the procedures provided by law.
 - B. Permanent certificated employees shall be evaluated at least once every school year.
- II. The District will obtain approval of its teacher evaluation policies and procedures from the Nebraska Department of Education as a requirement to legally operate as an accredited school district in Nebraska in accordance with Title 92, Nebraska Administrative Code, Chapter 10. In the event the District changes its policies or procedures for teacher evaluation, it shall re-submit the revised policies and procedures to the Nebraska Department of Education for approval. The policies and procedures submitted for the approval of the Nebraska Department of Education shall be in writing, shall be approved by the Millard Board of Education, and shall include the following:
 - A. A policy containing a statement of the purpose of teacher evaluation in the District.
 - B. A teacher evaluation procedure, which shall:
 - 1. Contain specific criteria upon which teachers are to be evaluated. Evaluation instruments shall be designed primarily for the improvement of instruction and shall include, at a minimum: (1) instructional performance, (2) classroom organization and management, (3) professional conduct, and (4) personal conduct. Specific standards for measurement in each of these four areas shall be tied to the instructional goals of the District.
 - 2. Describe the process to be used for evaluation, including the duration and frequency of the observations and the formal evaluations for probationary and permanent certificated teachers.
 - 3. Provide for documenting the evaluation.
 - 4. Communicate results of the evaluation annually, in writing, to those being evaluated.
 - 5. Provide for written communication (commonly referred to as a growth plan) to the evaluated teacher on all noted deficiencies, specific means for the correction of the noted deficiencies, and an adequate timeline for the implementing the concrete suggestions for improvement.
 - 6. Provide for the teacher to offer a written response to the evaluation.
 - 7. Communicate the evaluation procedure annually, in writing, to those being evaluated.

Bids were received for the Harvey Oaks Elementary Lighting Upgrade Project in Conference Room C at the Don Stroh Administration Center on February 18, 2015 at 11:00 a.m. Per the attached bid tab, four bids were received. The low base bid was submitted by A-1 United Heating, Air Conditioning, and Electrical in the amount of \$206,728 (two hundred six thousand seven hundred twenty eight dollars). A-1 United has indicated a mathematical error in calculating their bid. We recommend allowing A-1 United to withdraw their bid and proceeding with the second low bid by OK Electric in the amount of \$259,370 (two hundred fifty nine thousand three hundred seventy dollars). OK Electric has satisfactorily completed many projects with Morrissey Engineering including past projects for MPS.

The bid amount of \$259,370 is above the project estimate of \$199,000. The project estimate was originally put together at the time of the District Energy Masterplan in 2011. The prices were escalated last year to reflect increase in material cost since 2011, but the estimate was done to reflect the more aggressive bid market of last year. Our revised estimate after receiving bids for DSAC for this project was \$285,000 and this project came in below that amount. In light of recent bids on electrical scope, we are pleased with the amount of interest this project received. Removing the low bid with an error, the three other bids were within 5% which indicates good competition. The project also qualifies for an OPPD Lighting Incentive rebate of approximately \$17,000 which is not included in the project estimate or bid amount.

OK Electric indicated on their Bid Proposal they would finish by January 4, 2016 per the specifications.

We recommend a contract be awarded to OK Electric in the amount of \$259,370 (two hundred fifty nine thousand three hundred seventy dollars).

The Temporary Construction Easement shall commence upon the date of execution of this agreement and shall expire upon completion of the work set forth in Exhibit "A." Grantee agrees to surrender possession of the premises upon expiration of the Temporary Construction Easement or any extension thereof, and to leave the premises in substantially the same or better condition than they were on the date this agreement was executed, as reasonably determined by the Grantor; provided, however, it is understood that certain changes, particularly the planting of several tree varieties with accompanying re-contouring of surrounding ground, pursuant to the construction plan shall be the subject of the Non-exclusive Maintenance Easement.

The Non-exclusive Maintenance Easement shall commence upon the completion of all work and shall include rights of ingress and egress reasonably calculated to serve the purposes of the easement. This easement is intended only for the maintenance and replacement and, if necessary, the removal of trees and plantings and contouring around same and shall not include any items

not specifically mentioned herein, and shall continue for so long as is necessary for the maintenance and replacement of trees and plantings and contouring around same, and shall terminate upon agreement of the parties when the easement is no longer necessary or desired by the parties. Such agreement to terminate the Non-exclusive Maintenance Easement shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Grantee, in further consideration of the granting of the Easements, agrees to the following:

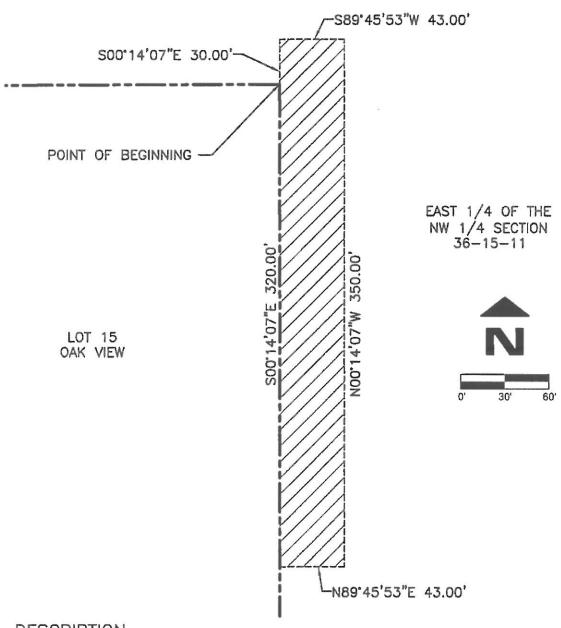
- 1. To provide to Grantor written notice of not less than one week of Grantee's intention to begin work or perform subsequent maintenance after the initial project is complete, and to comply with the District's "One Source" policy for all persons present on the District's property.
- 2. To complete all work contemplated in this agreement by August 1, 2015.
- 3. To perform all reasonable and necessary trimming and other necessary care consistent with good arboricultural practices.
- 4. To provide, at Grantee's cost, full construction fencing around the entire construction area for the duration of the project if requested by Grantor.
- 5. To take all reasonable steps to safeguard Grantor's facilities including, but not limited to, turf, detention cells, paving, sidewalks, and fencing, and to provide, at Grantee's sole cost, restoration and replacement of any of Grantor's property damaged as a result of or during such mobilization, demolition, construction or cleanup.
- 6. To replace any and all fence damaged, disturbed or removed with 9 gauge galvanized fence to match in material and height the existing and undisturbed fence.
- 7. To pay and reimburse Grantor for all reasonable engineering fees incurred by Grantor in overseeing the design and the work in progress and finalizing closeout for the project to the satisfaction of Grantor.
- 8. To pay and reimburse Grantor for any and all damages to Grantor's property caused to or resulting from the trees and/or plantings and contouring around same and shall hold Grantor harmless from any claims for injuries sustained to any person or persons caused by or resulting from the construction and maintenance of trees and plantings.
- 9. To take all reasonable steps to safeguard Grantor's facilities including, but not limited to, turf, paving, sidewalks, track surface, fencing and shall provide, at Grantee's sole cost, restoration and replacement of any Grantor's property damaged as a result of or during such mobilization, demolition, construction or cleanup.
- 10. To abide by Grantor's District-wide policy prohibiting the use and/or possession of alcohol and tobacco on District property at all times while on the District's property.

This agreement and the obligations, conditions, and promises herein stated are binding upon the administrators, successors and assigns of Grantor and the officers, directors and stockholders of Grantee and it is understood that this agreement cannot be changed or altered in any way except by writing, legally signed by both parties concerned herewith.
