Terry Houlton explained that we are required by law to provide special education services from birth through the school year that a student would turn 21. He said our home based services are for kids who have a disability that can be identified in years' birth to three and that these children usually transition into our preschool program. Dr. Feldhausen addressed questions regarding culinary class sizes. It was explained that no further students are being accepted for *Culinary-year one* this fall and *Culinary-year two* students will be allowed to finish their culinary classes this fall.

I. <u>Collection of Information</u>

At the beginning of each school year, the District will collect enrollment information on paper report forms to provide a baseline for judging the accuracy of the District's computerized database. Paper reports will be used on the third school day and on September 20th; computerized records will be used thereafter.

When a student enrolls during the school year, the principal or principal's designee will be responsible for collecting the applicable census data for all the children in that student's family. The District's administration may develop and implement guidelines and procedures to assist school principals or the principals' designee in obtaining the appropriate census and enrollment information.

II. Contents and Timelines of Enrollment Reports

An accurate enrollment report will be accessible to authorized users on or by the 20th day of each month. It will be the responsibility for each District school to ensure that each student is properly recorded in the District's database.

Student database information shall include each student's:

- A. Grade, teacher (for elementary grade students), race, and sex;
- B. Status (whether the student has been added to or dropped from enrollment in the District); and
- C. Housing subdivision.

Student Discipline 5400.1

I. <u>General Statement</u> The District's disciplinary rules and procedures are designed to protect students' constitutional and statutory rights within the context of an orderly and effective educational process. Students will be excluded from school and/or school activities when their conduct interferes with an orderly and effective educational process.

II. Types of Exclusion and Disciplinary Action.

- A. <u>Short-term Suspension</u>. Exclusion from all schools in the District not to exceed five (5) school days. If there are insufficient school days in the first semester to complete the suspension period, the suspension period will be carried over to the second semester.
- B. <u>Emergency Exclusion</u>. Immediate exclusion if:
 - 1. The student has a dangerous communicable disease transmissible through normal school contacts and poses an imminent threat to the health and safety of the school community; or
 - 2. The student's conduct presents a clear threat to the physical safety of himself, herself, or others; or
 - 3. The student's conduct is so extremely disruptive as to make temporary removal necessary to preserve the rights of other students to pursue an education.
 - 4. An emergency exclusion shall be based upon a clear factual situation warranting it and shall last no longer than is necessary to avoid the dangers necessitating the exclusion.
 - 5. Emergency Exclusion for Five (5) Days or Less. The same procedures for short-term suspension shall be used for an emergency exclusion for five (5) days or less.
 - 6. Emergency Exclusion for Over Five (5) Days. If the Superintendent or Superintendent's designee determines that the exclusion will extend beyond five (5) days, the following procedural provisions must be followed:
 - a. Hearing/Final Determination. A hearing will be held and a final determination made within ten (10) school days after the initial date of exclusion.
 - b. Hearing Procedures. The hearing will be conducted in compliance with the disciplinary hearing procedures which are used for long-term suspension, expulsion and reassignment.
- C. <u>Long-term Suspension</u>. Exclusion from all schools in the District (except the location designated for alternative education for students suspended for ten (10) school days or more) for more than five (5) school days but less than twenty (20) school days. <u>Exclusion from all schools in the District for more than five (5) school days but less than twenty (20) school days</u>. If there are insufficient school days in the first semester to complete the suspension period, the suspension period will be carried over to the second semester.
- D. <u>Length of Suspension</u>. If there are insufficient school days in the first semester to complete the suspension period, the suspension period will be carried over to the second semester.

- <u>D.</u> Expulsion. Exclusion from all schools in the District (except the location designated for alternative education) for a period not to exceed the remainder of the semester in which it took effect with the following exceptions:
 - 1. If the misconduct occurred within ten (10) school days prior to the end of the first semester, the expulsion shall remain in effect through the second semester; or
 - 2. If the misconduct occurred within ten (10) school days prior to the end of the second semester, the expulsion shall remain in effect for summer school and the first semester of the following school year subject to the annual review provision of Section II(D)(3)(d) below.
 - 3. The time periods above do not apply to the following infractions which have the following periods of exclusion:
 - a. Firearms and/or Guns. Exclusion from all schools in the District for not less than one (1) year of any student who is determined to have knowingly possessed, used, or transmitted a firearm or other gun as provided in Rule 5400.6 (II)(D)(1) and Rule 5400.6 (II)(D)(2) on school grounds, in a vehicle owned, leased, or contracted by a school being used for a school purpose or in a vehicle being driven for a school purpose by a school employee or his or her designee, or at a school-sponsored activity or athletic event. This subsection shall not apply to:
 - i. The issuance of firearms or the possession of firearms by members of the Reserve Officers Training Corps when training; or
 - ii. Firearms which lawfully are possessed by the person receiving instruction under the immediate supervision of an adult instructor who may lawfully possess firearms.
 - b. Personal Injury. Students who knowingly and intentionally use force in causing or attempting to cause personal injury to a school employee, school volunteer, or student (unless caused by accident, self-defense, or other action undertaken on the reasonable belief that it was necessary to protect some other person as hereafter provided) or the knowing and intentional possession, use, or transmission of a dangerous weapon, other than a firearm, shall be excluded for a period not to exceed the remainder of the school year in which it took effect if the misconduct occurs during the first semester. If the expulsion takes place during the second semester, the exclusion shall remain in effect for summer school and may remain in effect for the first semester of the following school year unless modified or terminated by the District at any time during the expulsion period. Personal injury caused by accident, self-defense, or other action undertaken on the reasonable belief that it was necessary to protect some other person shall not constitute a violation of this provision.
 - c. Sexual Assault. Students who sexually assault or attempt to sexually assault any person on school grounds shall be excluded for one (1) year. Students who sexually assault or attempt to sexually assault any person off school grounds may be excluded for one (1) year, provided that a complaint must have been filed by a prosecutor in a court of competent jurisdiction alleging that the student has sexually assaulted or attempted to sexually assault any person off school grounds not at a school function, activity, or event, and the student's presence at school has a direct and immediate effect on maintaining discipline, order, or safety in the school. Sexual assault shall mean sexual assault in the first degree as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 28-319, sexual assault in the second degree as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 28-320, sexual assault of a child in the second or third degree as defined in Neb.

- Rev. Stat. § 28-320.1, or sexual assault of a child in the first degree as defined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 28-319.01, as such statutes now provide or may hereafter be amended. Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-267(9).
- d. Annual Review. Any expulsion that will remain in effect during the first semester of the following school year shall be automatically scheduled for review before the beginning of the school year. The review shall be conducted by a hearing examiner after the hearing examiner has given notice of the review to the student and to the student's parents or guardian. The review shall be limited to newly discovered evidence or evidence of changes in the student's circumstances occurring since the original hearing. This review may lead to the hearing examiner recommendation that the student be re-admitted for the upcoming school year. If the Board (or Board Committee) took the final action to expel the student, the student may be re-admitted only by Board action. Otherwise, the student may be readmitted by the Superintendent.
- E. Mandatory Reassignment. Involuntary transfer to another school in the District in connection with any disciplinary action.
- F. Exclusion from School Grounds and Activities. During any time period that a student is excluded from school due to short-term suspension, long-term suspension, expulsion, or emergency exclusion, the student will be prohibited from being on school grounds (except the location designated for alternative education) and from participating in any District-sponsored extracurricular activities and from attending any extracurricular activities which take place on District property.
- G. Other Disciplinary Action. Administrative and teaching personnel may take actions regarding student behavior which are reasonably necessary to aid the student, further school purposes, or prevent interference with the educational process. Such actions may include, but need not be limited to, counseling of students, parent conferences, rearrangement of schedules, requirements that a student remain in school after regular hours to do additional work, restriction of extracurricular activity, or requirements that a student receive counseling, psychological evaluation, or psychiatric evaluation upon the written consent of a parent or guardian to such counseling or evaluation.
- III. Standards for Student Conduct (Rule 5400.6). In conjunction with the Student Discipline Act, the District shall adopt Standards for Student Conduct contained in Rule 5400.6 that will set forth student misconduct and the maximum sanction that the District shall impose. Rule 5400.6 shall be reviewed annually by the Board, and shall be distributed to students at the beginning of the school year or, in the case of student transfers, upon enrollment in the District.
- IV. <u>Effective Date of Exclusion</u>. When a notice of intent to discipline a student by long-term suspension, expulsion, or mandatory reassignment is filed with the Superintendent, the student may be suspended by the principal until:
 - A. If no hearing is requested, the date the disciplinary action takes effect; or
 - B. If a hearing is requested, the date the hearing examiner makes the report of his/her findings and a recommendation of the action to be taken to the Superintendent, if the principal determines that the student must be suspended immediately to prevent or substantially reduce the risk of interference with an educational function or school purpose, or a personal injury to the student himself or herself, other students, school employees, or school volunteers.
- V. <u>Procedures for Exclusion</u>. The District will adhere to the procedural requirements of federal and state law for the exclusion of students from school and school activities.
- VI. <u>Hearings</u>. In cases involving emergency exclusion for more than five (5) school days, long-term suspension, expulsion, and mandatory reassignment, the student will have the right to a hearing to contest the exclusion. A

Request for Hearing form will be provided to the student and the student's parents or guardian along with a description of the hearing procedures provided by the Student Discipline Act along with the procedures for appealing any decision rendered at the hearing.

- VII. <u>Formal Hearings and Appeal</u>. If a principal makes a decision to discipline a student by long-term suspension, expulsion, or mandatory reassignment, the following procedures shall be followed:
 - A. Written Charge and Summary of Evidence.
 - 1. On the date of the decision, a written charge and a summary of the evidence supporting such charge shall be filed with the Superintendent or designee.
 - 2. The principal shall, within two (2) school days of the decision, send written notice by registered or certified mail to the student and his or her parent or guardian informing them of the rights established under the Student Discipline Act.
 - B. Written Notice. Written notice must include the violation and summary of evidence; the recommended penalty; the right to a hearing; the hearing procedure; and a statement that the principal, legal counsel for the school, the student, the student's parent or the student's representative or guardian shall have a right to examine the student's academic and disciplinary records and any affidavits to be used at the hearing, plus the right to know the identity of the witnesses to appear at the hearing and the substance of their testimony. A form on which the student, the student's parent, or the student's guardian may request a hearing must accompany the written notice.
 - C. <u>Suspension until Hearing</u>. When a notice of intent to discipline a student by long-term suspension, expulsion, or mandatory reassignment is filed with the Superintendent or designee, the student may be suspended by the principal until:
 - 1. The date the disciplinary action takes effect if no hearing is requested;
 - 2. If a hearing is requested, the date the hearing examiner makes the report of his/her findings and a recommendation of the action to be taken to the Superintendent or designee, if the principal determines that the student must be suspended immediately to prevent or substantially reduce the risk of interference with an education function or school purpose or a personal injury to the student himself or herself, other students, school employees, or school volunteers.
 - D. <u>Procedures if a Hearing is not Requested</u>. If a hearing is not requested by the student or the student's parent or guardian within five (5) school days following receipt of written notice, the punishment recommended in the charge by the principal or his/her designee will automatically go into effect upon the fifth (5th) school day following receipt of the written notice by the student or his/her parent or guardian.
 - E. <u>Procedures if a Hearing is Requested.</u>
 - 1. Request for Hearing. A hearing must be requested within five (5) school days after receipt of the written notice.
 - a. Request of Hearing Beyond Five Days. If a hearing is requested more than five (5) school days but not more than thirty (30) calendar days following the actual receipt of the written notice, the hearing shall be held but the imposed punishment shall continue in effect pending final determination.
 - 2. <u>Appointment of Hearing Examiner.</u> If a hearing is requested the Superintendent shall appoint a hearing examiner. The hearing examiner can be any person designated by the

Superintendent or designee if such person has not brought the charges against the student, is not a witness at the hearing, and has no involvement in the charge.

- 3. <u>Notice of Time and Place for Hearing.</u> Within two (2) school days after being appointed, the hearing examiner shall give written notice to the principal, the student, and the student's parent or guardian of the time and place for the hearing.
 - a. The hearing shall be scheduled within a period of five (5) school days after it is requested, but such time may be changed by the hearing examiner for good cause.
 - b. No hearing shall be held upon less than two (2) school days actual notice to the principal, the student, and the student's parent or guardian, except with the consent of all the parties.
- 4. <u>Right to Examine Records and Statements</u>. The principal or legal counsel for the District, the student, and student's parent or guardian, or representative, shall have the right to examine the records, <u>affidavits</u> and written statements referred to Section VII (B) of this Rule, and the statement of any witness in the possession of the principal at a reasonable time prior to the hearing.

F. <u>Hearing Procedures</u>.

- 1. <u>Required Attendance at Hearing</u>. The hearing examiner, student's parent or guardian, the student's representative, if any, and legal counsel for the principal or District, if any, shall attend the hearing.
- 2. <u>Witnesses</u>. Witnesses shall be present only when they are giving information at the hearing. The student, the student's parent, guardian, or representative, the principal, or the hearing examiner may ask witnesses to testify at the hearing. Such testimony shall be under oath, and the hearing examiner shall be authorized to administer the oath. The hearing examiner shall make reasonable effort to assist the student or the student's parent, guardian, or representative in obtaining the attendance of the witnesses.
 - a. <u>Cross-Examination</u>. The student, the student's parent, guardian, or representative, the principal, the principal's or the District's legal counsel, and the hearing examiner shall have the right to question any witness giving information at the hearing.
 - b. <u>Immunity</u>. Any person giving evidence by written statement or in person at a hearing shall be given the same immunity from liability as a person testifying in a court case.
- 3. <u>Student Testimony</u>. The student may speak in his or her own defense and may be questioned on his or her testimony, but he or she may choose not to testify and, in such case, shall not be threatened with punishment nor be later punished for refusal to testify.
- 4. <u>Individuals may be Excluded from the Hearing</u>. The student may be excluded from the hearing in the discretion of the hearing examiner at times when the student's psychological evaluation or emotional problems are being discussed. The hearing examiner may exclude anyone from the hearing when his or her actions substantially disrupt an orderly hearing.
- 5. Evidence on the Student's Conduct and Records. The principal may present to the hearing examiner statements, in affidavit form, of any person having information about the student's conduct and the student's records, provided that such statements and records have been made available to the student or the student's parent, guardian, or representative prior to the

- hearing. The information contained in such records shall be explained and interpreted, prior to or at the hearing, to the student, parent or guardian, or representative, upon request, by appropriate District personnel.
- 6. <u>Rules of Evidence</u>. In conducting the hearing, the hearing examiner shall not be bound by the rules of evidence or any other rule of courtroom procedure.
- Proceedings Recorded. The proceedings of the hearing shall be recorded at the expense of the District.
- 8. <u>Joint Hearings</u>. A joint hearing may be conducted when more than one (1) student is charged with violating the same rule and acted in concert, and the facts are substantially the same for all such students.
 - a. <u>Discretion of Hearing Examiner</u>. A joint hearing may be conducted if the hearing examiner believes that a joint hearing is not likely to result in confusion and no student shall have his or her interests substantially prejudiced by a single hearing.
 - b. <u>Order for Separate Hearing</u>. If during the conduct of the hearing the hearing examiner finds that a student's interests will be substantially prejudiced by a joint hearing or that the hearing is resulting in confusion, the hearing examiner may order a separate hearing for any student.
- G. <u>Post-Hearing Report</u>. After the hearing, a report shall be made by the hearing examiner to the Superintendent or designee. The report shall contain the hearing examiner's findings and recommendation of the action to be taken, and the report shall explain in terms of the needs of both the student and the District, the reasons for the particular action recommended.
 - 1. <u>Range of Recommendations</u>. The recommendation by the hearing examiner may range from no action, through the entire field of counseling, to long-term suspension, expulsion, mandatory reassignment, or an alternative education placement.
 - 2. Review by Superintendent or Designee. A review of the hearing examiner's report shall be made by the Superintendent or designee. The Superintendent or designee may change, revoke, or impose the sanction recommended by the hearing examiner but shall not impose a sanction more severe than that recommended by the hearing examiner.
 - 3. <u>Decisions Based on Evidence</u>. The findings and recommendations of the hearing examiner, the determination by the Superintendent, and any determination on appeal to the Board, shall be made solely on the basis of the evidence presented at the hearing or, in addition, on any evidence presented on appeal.
- H. <u>Final Disposition</u>. Written notice of the findings and recommendations of the hearing examiner and the determination of the Superintendent or designee shall be made by certified or registered mail or by personal delivery to the student or the student's parent or guardian. Upon receipt of such written notice by the student, parent, or guardian, the determination of the Superintendent or designee shall take immediate effect.
- VIII. Request for Appeal to the Board. The student or the student's parent or guardian may, within seven (7) school days following receipt of the Superintendent's written notice of the determination, appeal the determination to the Board by a written request which shall be filed with the secretary of the Board or with the Superintendent.

A. Appeal Hearing.

1. When. A hearing shall be held before the Board within a period of ten (10) school days after

- it is requested, and such time for a hearing may be changed by mutual agreement of the student and Superintendent.
- 2. <u>Deliberating Body</u>. The hearing may be held before a committee of the Board of not less than three (3) members.
- 3. <u>Admissible Evidence</u>. Such appeal shall be made on the record, except that new evidence may be admitted to avoid a substantial threat of unfairness and such new evidence shall be recorded at the expense of the District.
- 4. <u>Deliberation.</u> After examining the record and taking new evidence, if any, the Board or designated committee may withdraw to deliberate privately upon such record and new evidence.
 - a. <u>Limitations</u>. Any such deliberation shall be held in the presence only of Board members in attendance at the appeal proceeding but may be held in the presence of legal counsel who has not previously acted as the designee of the principal in presenting the school's case before the hearing examiner.
 - b. <u>Questions during Deliberation</u>. If any questions arise during such deliberations which require additional evidence, the deliberating body may reopen the hearing to receive such evidence, subject to the right of all parties to be present.
- 5. <u>Action on Appeal</u>. The deliberating body may alter the Superintendent's disposition of the case if it finds the decision to be too severe but may not impose a more severe sanction.
- 6. <u>Dispatch of Final Action</u>. The final action of the deliberating body shall be evidenced by personally delivering or mailing by certified mail a copy of the deliberating body's decision to the student and his or her parent or guardian.
- B. <u>Judicial Review</u>. Any person aggrieved by a final decision in a contested case under this Rule, whether such decision is affirmative or negative in form, shall be entitled to judicial review. Nothing in the Rule shall be deemed to prevent resort to other means of review, redress, or relief provided by law
- IX. <u>Settlement</u>. Nothing in this Rule shall preclude the student, the student's parents, guardian, or representative from discussing and settling disciplinary proceedings with appropriate school personnel prior to the hearing stage.
- X. <u>Reporting of Criminal Acts to Law Enforcement Agencies</u>. The school principal or principal's designee shall notify as soon as possible the appropriate law enforcement authorities of any student act which the principal or principal's designee knows or suspects is in violation of the Nebraska Criminal Code.
- XI. <u>Annual Report to State Department of Education</u>. The Superintendent or Superintendent's designee shall annually provide to the State Department of Education:
 - A. An assurance that the District has in effect the expulsion policy for bringing a firearm to school required by state and federal law; and
 - B. A report, in a manner prescribed by the State Department of Education, which describes the circumstances surrounding any expulsion for possessing, using or transmitting a firearm on school grounds or in a vehicle owned, leased, or contracted by a school being used for a school purpose or in a vehicle being driven for a school purpose by a school employee or designee, or at a school-sponsored activity or athletic event, including the name of the school concerned, the number of

students expelled from the school, the types of weapons concerned, and the types of programs to which students have been assigned.

Student Discipline: Curtailment of Extracurricular Activities

5400.4

- I. <u>General Statement.</u> When reasonably necessary to aid the student, further school purposes, or prevent interference with the educational process, the District shall curtail a student's participation in District extracurricular activities. Students shall not be permitted to be on District Property or participate in or attend District-sponsored extracurricular activities during the time period that the student is excluded from school for disciplinary reasons. In addition, students may be curtailed from extracurricular activities for misconduct taking place off school grounds and not at a school function, activity, or event. Curtailment may also occur outside the academic school year if the misconduct takes place during a school sponsored activity pursuant to the provisions of this Rule and Rule 5400.6.
- II. <u>Ineligibility During Short and Long-term Suspension, Expulsion, or Emergency Exclusion: Misconduct On School</u> Grounds or Under District Control.
 - A. Period of Ineligibility. During any time period that a student is excluded from school due to short-term suspension, long-term suspension, expulsion, or emergency exclusion for conduct occurring on District property, or in a vehicle owned, leased, or contracted by the District being used for a school purpose or in a vehicle being driven for a school purpose by a school employee or his or her designee, school grounds, in a school-owned vehicle being used for a school purpose, or at a school-sponsored activity or athletic event, or any other place where the governing law permits the District to discipline students for prohibited conduct, the student so excluded shall also be ineligible for participation in extracurricular activities for the entire period of exclusion, and will also be prohibited from attending any District-sponsored extracurricular events during the period of exclusion from school.
 - B. <u>Effective Following Semester If Necessary.</u> The ineligibility period shall remain in effect during the following semester (including the following academic school year) if there are insufficient school days in the semester to complete the ineligibility period.
 - C. Summer. Curtailment of extracurricular activities may occur outside the academic school year if the misconduct takes place during a school sponsored activity pursuant to the provisions of this Rule and Rule 5400.6.
- III. Additional Ineligibility: Misconduct Off School Grounds.
 - A. <u>Period of Ineligibility for Conduct off School Grounds.</u> The prohibited conduct contained in Rule 5400.6 shall subject the student to the periods of ineligibility for extracurricular activities defined in Rule 5400.6 for conduct occurring off school grounds and not at a school event during the academic school year:
 - B. <u>District Events During Ineligibility Period.</u> Students who are ineligible for participation in extracurricular activities will also be prohibited from attending any District-sponsored extracurricular events during the ineligibility period.
 - C. <u>Effective Following Semester if Necessary.</u> The ineligibility period shall remain in effect during the following semester (including the following school year) if there are insufficient school days in the semester to complete the ineligibility period.
- IV. <u>Commutation.</u> Penalties assigned under this Rule may be reduced by the Superintendent or Superintendent's designee upon the successful completion of counseling, community service, or other alternative to curtailment set by the District. The District shall have the sole discretion in determining whether the student is eligible for commutation, and what form the counseling, community service, or other alternative to curtailment must be successfully completed before commutation may take place. Any costs associated with counseling, community service, or other alternative to curtailment shall be borne by the student or the student's parent(s) or guardian(s).

- V. <u>Procedure.</u> If a student is not being subjected to short-term suspension, long-term suspension, emergency exclusion, mandatory reassignment, or expulsion, but is having his/her participation in extracurricular activities curtailed for disciplinary reasons, the following procedures will be followed:
 - A. The principal or principal's designee shall make an investigation of the misconduct.
 - B. The principal or principal's designee may curtail or prohibit participation in an extracurricular activity after the principal or principal's designee determines that it is necessary to aid the student, further school purposes, or prevent interference with the educational process.
 - C. Prior to the curtailment, the student will be given oral or written notice by the principal or principal's designee of the charges, an explanation of the evidence against the student, and an opportunity to present the student's version.
 - D. Within twenty-four (24) hours or such additional time as is reasonably necessary following the decision to impose curtailment, the principal or principal's designee will send a written statement to the student and the student's parent or guardian describing:
 - 1. The student's conduct; and
 - 2. The reasons for the action taken.
- VI. <u>Effective Date</u>. The effective date of the curtailment of extracurricular activities shall be the date that the principal or principal's designee provides the student with the oral or written notice of the charges, except the principal shall not issue a letter of curtailment until there is a student admission, court decision, or citation.

VII. Appeal.

- A. <u>Curtailment for Ten (10) School Days or Less.</u> If the student's curtailment of extracurricular activities is ten (10) school days or less, there will be no right to an appeal.
- B. <u>Curtailment for More than Ten (10) School Days.</u> Any student whose curtailment of extracurricular activities exceeds ten (10) school days may appeal the decision to the Superintendent or Superintendent's designee by complying with the following procedures:
 - 1. Within five (5) school days of the date of the receipt of the written decision to curtail participation in extracurricular activities, the student, or the student's parent or guardian, shall submit in writing to the Superintendent or Superintendent's designee:
 - a. A request to have the decision reviewed; and
 - b. The reason(s) for the request.
 - 2. Any supporting evidence for the student's appeal shall be submitted in affidavit form with the written request for review. The evidence may include evidence that the student did not give to the principal or principal's designee when the student was given oral or written notice of the charges.
 - 3. The Superintendent's or the Superintendent's designee's written disposition of the appeal will be mailed to the student, or the student's parent or guardian, within five (5) school days of the Superintendent's or Superintendent's designee's receipt of the appeal. If the request for review is not submitted to the Superintendent or Superintendent's designee in a timely fashion, the appeal shall be considered waived dismissed unless the student, or student's parent or guardian, are able to show that exigent circumstances prevented the timely submission of the appeal. The Superintendent or Superintendent's designee may change, revoke, or impose the sanction recommended by the principal or principal's designee. The Superintendent or the Superintendent's

designee, however, cannot impose a sanction more severe than that recommended by the principal or principal's designee.

VIII. Adoption of Rules by Athletic Teams, Clubs, and all Other Organizations Sponsored or Associated With the District. This Rule and Rule 5400.6 shall be adopted and enforced by all District teams, clubs, and organizations, which make up the District's extracurricular activities. If any District team, club, organization, or other extracurricular activity has written rules or regulations, this Rule and Rule 5400.6 (VIII) will be incorporated into such rules or regulations. Coaches and staff in charge of District extracurricular activities may adopt such other rules and regulations as are necessary to maintain discipline and order.

IX. <u>Definitions.</u>

- A. "Academic school year" shall mean the time students are in school during the dates and times that are set by the school calendar adopted by the Board, including summer school.
- B. "Extracurricular activities" shall mean all athletic teams, activities, groups, clubs, homecomings, proms, dances, graduation ceremonies, and all other organizations or events sponsored by or associated with the District which are not part of the District curriculum.
- C. "Ineligibility period" shall mean that period of time that a District student is prohibited from participating in and/or attending any District extracurricular activities.
- D. "On school grounds" shall mean on District property, in a vehicle owned, leased, or contracted by the District being used for a school purpose or in a vehicle being driven for a school purpose by a school employee or his or her designee, or at a school sponsored activity or athletic event, or any other place where the governing law permits the District to discipline students for prohibited conduct.
- E. "School day" shall mean any day that school is in session and students are attending academic courses. It does not include days that practices for extracurricular activities are held during the summer, <u>or</u> weekends, <u>or and</u> vacations <u>that occur</u> during the academic school year.

Pupil Student Services

Student Discipline: Academic Credit for Expelled Students and Students Suspended for Ten School Days or More through Alternative Courses or Programs

- I. <u>Expelled Students</u>. Students expelled from the District will be eligible for academic credit upon successful participation in and completion of approved alternative courses, or programs.
 - A. <u>Alternative School, Classes, or Programs Available to Expelled Students.</u>
 - 1. <u>Notice</u>. All students expelled from the District will be advised in writing of the availability of alternative courses or programs.
 - 2. <u>Alternative Education</u>. The alternative education available to <u>D</u>district students who are expelled will consist of the following:
 - a. <u>High School</u>: Expelled students will be assigned to a <u>D</u>district-approved program that provides approved courses of study designed to support their academic needs.
 - b. <u>Middle School</u>: Expelled students will be assigned to a <u>D</u>district-approved program that provides approved courses of study designed to support their academic needs.
 - c. <u>Elementary School</u>: A program consisting of materials in reading, math, and writing will be provided by the student's elementary school. A tutor will be provided by the District one (1) day per week at the student's home or another agreed upon location to proctor the course. The principal or principal's designee must approve the learning program prescribed for the student.
 - 3. The District reserves the right to change or modify the alternative education set forth above at any time without advance notice other than to advise expelled <u>Delistrict</u> students in writing of the changed or modified alternative education available to them. At the conclusion of the expulsion period, any student who has satisfactorily participated in the alternative education program will be given full academic credit for the school work, classes, or programs completed. Those students who fail to satisfactorily complete the alternative education program will not be given any academic credit for the alternative school attended.
 - 4. <u>Refusal to Participate</u>. If a parent or guardian refuses to permit an expelled student to participate in an alternative school, class, or program, the District will have no further obligation to the student, parent, or guardian with regard to providing an alternative school, class, or program.
 - B. <u>Academic Credit and Requirements for Successful Participation.</u>
 - If an expelled student successfully completes the course requirements of an alternative school, class, or program by meeting the attendance, grade, conduct, and other requirements imposed by the District, such student will be given full academic credit for the school work, class, or program completed.
 - 2. To successfully meet the District's attendance requirements, the student must not miss any school, class, program, or session assigned the student unless the absence is excused. Whether or not an absence is excused will be determined solely by the District. In

- addition, if the student violates any of the District's Standards for Student Conduct, the District will, without further obligation, terminate the program for such student after a due process hearing.
- 3. The District may adopt such other rules, regulations, or requirements it deems necessary to effectively administer this Rule.
- C. <u>Right to a Due Process Hearing</u>. If an expelled student enrolled in an alternative school, class, or program fails to meet any of the conditions, rules, regulations, or requirements of the learning program, the District may, without further obligation, terminate the program for such student after a due process hearing; no due process hearing will be required, however, if waived by the parent or guardian.
 - 1. <u>Nature of Due Process Hearing</u>. If an expelled student's alternative school, class, or program under this Rule is terminated by the District, the student will be afforded a due process hearing. The hearing will be the same or substantially similar to hearings afforded students expelled from the District. Information regarding such hearing may be obtained from the District's Director of <u>Student Pupil</u> Services.
- II. <u>Student Suspended Ten (10) School Days or More</u>. Students suspended from the District for ten (10) school days or more will be eligible to participate in the District's alternative education program.
 - A. <u>Alternative School, Classes, or Programs Available to Students Suspended Ten School Days or More.</u>
 - 1. <u>Notice</u>. All students suspended from the District for ten (10) school days or more will be advised in writing of the availability of alternative courses or programs.
 - 2. <u>Alternative Education</u>. The alternative education available to <u>D</u>district students who are suspended for ten (10) school days or more will consist of the following:
 - a. <u>High School</u>: Students suspended for ten (10) school days or more will be assigned to a district-approved program that provides approved courses of study designed to support their academic needs.
 - b. <u>Middle School</u>: Students suspended for ten (10) school days or more will be assigned to a <u>D</u>district-approved program that provides approved courses of study designed to support their academic needs.
 - c. <u>Elementary School</u>: A program consisting of materials in reading, math, and writing will be provided by the student's elementary school. A tutor will be provided by the District one (1) day per week at the student's home or another agreed upon location to proctor the course. The principal or principal's designee must approve the learning program prescribed for the student.
 - 3. The District reserves the right to change or modify the alternative education set forth above at any time without advance notice other than to advise expelled-suspended
 Ddistrict students in writing of the changed or modified alternative education available to them. At the conclusion of the suspension period, any student who has satisfactorily participated in the alternative education program will be given full academic credit for the school work, classes, or programs completed. Those students who fail to satisfactorily complete the alternative education program will not be given any academic credit for the alternative school attended.
 - 4. <u>Refusal to Participate</u>. If a parent or guardian refuses to permit a suspended student to participate in an alternative school, class, or program, the District will have no further

obligation to the student, parent, or guardian with regard to providing an alternative school, class, or program.

B. <u>Academic Credit and Requirements for Successful Participation</u>.

- 1. If <u>a</u> student suspended for ten (10) school days or more successfully completes the course requirements of an alternative school, class, or program by meeting the attendance, grade, conduct, and other requirements imposed by the District, such student will be given full academic credit for the school work, class, or program completed.
- 2. To successfully meet the District's attendance requirements, the student must not miss any school, class, program, or session assigned the student unless the absence is excused. Whether or not an absence is excused will be determined solely by the District. In addition, if the student violates any of the District's Standards for Student Conduct, the District will, without further obligation, terminate the program for such student after a due process hearing.
- 3. The District may adopt such other rules, regulations, or requirements it deems necessary to effectively administer this Rule.
- III. <u>Transportation</u>. Students participating in the District's alternative education courses or programs shall not be provided transportation to the alternative education site unless compelling reasons exist for the administration to arrange otherwise. Such determination shall be made by and at the sole discretion of the Superintendent (or designee).

IV. Definitions.

- A. "Alternative Schools, Classes, or Programs" shall mean that special category of schools, classes, or programs required by law to be provided exclusively for expelled students.
- B. "Learning Program" shall mean a general program or plan for all expelled students and students suspended for ten (10) school days or more, or an individualized program adapted from a generally offered program, or an individualized program developed by the school and/or designated staff member to assist an expelled student or a student suspended for ten (10) school days or more in achieving credit toward graduation.

Parental Access 6800.1

- I. Access to Educational Practices. Parents will be afforded the following access to the District's educational practices as required by law:
 - A. **Textbooks, tests, and curriculum materials**: Parents may obtain access to textbooks, tests, and other curriculum materials used by the District by making a request to the Associate Superintendent of Educational Services or said Associate Superintendent's designee. Such request shall be reasonably specific in order that the District may comply with the request.
 - 1. Courses, assemblies, and other instructional activities: Parents may request to attend courses, assemblies, and other instructional activities by contacting the school principal or principal's designee reasonably in advance of the course, assembly, or instructional activity the parent desires to attend. The District will comply with such request if the request:
 - a. Does not materially interfere with the educational process; and/or
 - b. Is not contrary to the best interests of the student.

If the parent's request is denied or qualified, the District will so notify the requesting parent, and will provide an explanation of the grounds for the denial or qualification.

If the parents dispute the denial or qualification, the parents may submit a written request for review to the District's Associate Superintendent for Educational Services. Upon receipt of a written request for review, the Associate Superintendent for Educational Services will review all relevant documents and undertake such investigation as he/she determines to be appropriate. Thereafter, the Associate Superintendent for Educational Services will render a written disposition of the matter within ten (10) school days of his/her receipt of the written request for review.

- 2. Counseling sessions: Parents may request to attend counseling sessions by submitting a written request to the Director of Student Services or said director's designee reasonably in advance of the counseling session the parent desires to attend. The District will comply with such request if the request:
 - a. Does not materially interfere with the educational process; and/or
 - b. Is not contrary to the best interests of the student.

If the parent's request is denied or qualified, the District will so notify the requesting parent, and will provide an explanation of the grounds for the denial or qualification.

If the parents dispute the denial or qualification, the parents may submit a written request for review to the District's Associate Superintendent for Educational Services. Upon receipt of a written request for review, the Associate Superintendent for Educational Services will review all relevant documents and undertake such investigation as he/she determines to be appropriate. Thereafter, the Associate Superintendent for Educational Services will render a written disposition of the matter within ten (10) school days of his/her receipt of the written request for review.

- B. Access to records: The District will permit access to student records pursuant to applicable law, District Policy 5710, and Rule 5710.1. Non-custodial parents will be permitted access to student records pursuant to applicable law, District Policy 5730, and Rule 5730.1.
- C. District testing policy: The District's administration and use of tests will be in accordance with established and recognized testing procedures for tests of scholastic, academic, and intellectual development and status. Testing pursuant to statutory requirements will be in compliance with recognized testing procedures and reasonable objectives. Drug, alcohol, and tobacco testing will be in compliance with District Policy and Rule.

D. Surveys:

- 1. **District participation in surveys.** The District will conduct all surveys of students required by law. The District will also participate in surveys of students conducted for educational purposes or which are reasonably related to the same.
- 2. **Protections of personal information and student privacy.** No surveys shall be conducted which require the disclosure of personally identifiable information unless the survey is required by law, District Policy, or Board authorization. Survey results shall not disclose personally identifiable information unless such disclosure is required by law, District Policy, or Board authorization.
- 3. **Notification and consent.** No student shall be required to submit to a survey, analysis, or evaluation that reveals information concerning political affiliations or beliefs of the student or the student's parent; mental or psychological problems of the student or the student's family; sex behavior or attitudes; illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior; critical appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close family relationships; legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers; religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or student's parent; income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such program); or which originates outside the District, without the prior written consent of the parent or without the prior consent of the student if the student is an adult or an emancipated minor. The District shall provide for reasonable notice of the adoption on continued use of this Rule directly to the parents of students enrolled in the District at least annually at the beginning of the school year and within a reasonable time after any substantive change in this Rule. The District shall directly notify the parents of students at least annually at the beginning of the school year, of the specific or approximate dates during the school year when such surveys are scheduled or expected to be scheduled.
- 4. Right to inspect surveys and to opt out. The parents of district students have the right to inspect any survey before the survey is administered or distributed, including all instructional materials, teacher's manuals, films, tapes, and other supplementary materials which will be used in connection with any such survey. A parent shall be provided reasonable access to a survey within a reasonable period of time after a request to inspect is received. Parents, adult students, and emancipated students, may opt out of participation in any such survey by not providing the required prior consent or by revoking any previously provided consent.
- 5. **Personal information for marketing or sale.** The District does not collect, disclose, or use personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or for selling that information or otherwise providing that information to others for that purpose. The District may engage in the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the exclusive purpose of developing, evaluating, or providing educational products or services for, or to:

- a. Students;
- b. Educational institutions such as college or other post-secondary education recruitment, book clubs, magazines, and programs providing access to low-cost literary products;
- c. Curriculum and instructional materials used by elementary and secondary schools.
- d. Tests and assessments;
- e. The sale by students of products or services to raise funds for school-related or education-related activities, or student recognition programs.
- II. **Annual Review.** This Rule shall be reviewed annually and either altered and adopted as altered, or reaffirmed by the Board, following a public hearing.

SECONDARY PARTNERSHIPS AGREEMENT METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND MILLARD PUBLIC SCHOOLS 2015-16

This is a Secondary Partnerships agreement between Metropolitan Community College, a body corporate and political subdivision of the State of Nebraska ("MCC"), and Millard Public Schools ("High School"). As an extension of the Dual Enrollment Program at MCC, full college credit will be granted for MCC classes taught in a high school setting if they meet MCC standards, policies and objectives. The conditions, procedures and services of this agreement with High School are as follows:

A. CONDITIONS:

INSTRUCTOR QUALIFICATIONS – Any instructor teaching an MCC course, including any instructor teaching/working in cooperation with the selected High School dual enrollment course(s), must meet MCC's predetermined faculty qualifications. The proposed instructor must submit an MCC application and all official post-secondary transcripts to MCC Human Resources in order to be considered and approved as an adjunct MCC instructor.

COURSE CONTENT – To assure equivalent knowledge, skills, and outcomes of any MCC course, including high school academy course(s) offered as a dual enrollment course, the appropriate MCC faculty and Academic Dean/Assistant Dean will provide the course outline(s) and determine the appropriate number of contact hours. Both MCC and High School will maintain their high standards for education, assuring each course meets the desired objectives of each institution.

STUDENT QUALIFICATIONS - High School students who want to participate in any credit course offered as part of an MCC dual enrollment course must be recommended by a High School official and must have completed all MCC prerequisite courses.

Any of the foll	lowing methods can be used to assess MCC prerequisites:

	PLAN/ASPIRE scores
	Assessment/COMPASS scores
	Course objectives of a completed high school course may match the objectives of
	an MCC prerequisite course, and therefore, demonstrate proficiency and readiness
	for college-level work.

It is the responsibility of High School to accommodate students with disabilities taking MCC courses in the High School building.

B. PROCEDURES:

- 1. The proposed instructor's application, experience and transcripts will be reviewed and approved by the appropriate MCC Academic Dean/Assistant Dean.
- 2. The appropriate MCC faculty and administration will provide the curriculum outline(s) and the instructor's textbook, plus other supplemental materials, for the agreed upon course(s). Upon request, the MCC faculty and administration will provide a sample syllabus as a model for the course.

- 3. Students who participate in a dual enrollment course section, which is offered at or originating from MCC, are required to register as MCC students and follow the registration procedures decided upon by MCC and High School officials. If the dual enrollment course is an MCC online course, only High School students in the section who register as MCC students will have access to the online curriculum.
- 4. Students pay \$40 tuition per course, when the course is taught at the High School by the High School teacher who has been approved as an MCC adjunct instructor. There will be no reimbursement to the High School at the end of the academic year when students pay \$40 tuition per dual enrollment course.

Students pay 50% of the MCC Nebraska resident student tuition when the dual enrollment course is taught by an MCC faculty member. There will be no reimbursement to the High School at the end of the academic year when the dual enrollment course is taught by an MCC faculty member.

- 5. Students are responsible for paying all tuition and fees and must follow set tuition refund and drop dates, as applicable. There is no refund for a student who pays \$40 tuition per course. (Refer to the website www.mccneb.edu for tuition and fee costs and tuition refund and drop dates.) Payment for the course is due at the start of the course.
- 6. MCC will select/approve the textbook and supplemental materials for the course. MCC will provide the High School with ISBN # if needed. If High School agrees to purchase the textbooks, or if students wish to own the textbooks, they may purchase them at an MCC bookstore, http://www.mccneb.edu/bookstore.asp.
- 7. Students may register in person or by mail. High School officials will work with the MCC Secondary Partnerships Office to determine the most effective registration method.
- 8. The MCC staff, working with High School, will determine the course start and end dates to ensure sufficient class time.
- 9. Instructor salary/reimbursement payments for these dual enrollment course(s) are issued in one of three ways:
 - i. If a High School instructor is teaching the designated MCC course as part of his/her contract time with High School, MCC does not pay the instructor.
 - ii. If the MCC instructor is not contracted with High School during the class time, payment arrangements will be made directly with the MCC instructor.
 - iii. A minimum class size of 15 tuition paying students must be met before an MCC instructor will be assigned to teach a dual enrollment class in the high school.

MCC does not compensate High School instructors for additional costs, such as mileage and travel time.

10. It is the responsibility of High School to communicate with the appropriate MCC Academic Dean/Assistant Dean regarding any requests for possible changes in the approved course(s) including changes in the course outline, textbook or instructional staff. A course syllabus for each class, prepared by the instructor, is to be on file at the appropriate Academic Dean's office no later than the end of the first week of instruction.

- 11. All MCC policies and procedures, including but not limited to dates for tuition payment and/or refunds, drug free schools/communities, nondiscrimination, proper classification of employees, and FERPA, will apply to the course(s) and registered students. Nothing herein shall be construed to supersede or void High School Policy and Rules.
- 12. The location for each course will be jointly agreed upon by MCC and High School. This location will be documented in the attachment to this Agreement. Should any location changes be necessary, the following parties must be notified prior to the change: the MCC Secondary Partnerships Office, the MCC Academic Dean/Assistant Dean, the High School Official, the instructor, and the site facilitator.
- 13. The instructor of the course(s) involved in the partnership will assign and report all midterm, quarter, semester, and final progress reports to the High School and the final grades to MCC. MCC grades are due, via MCC's grading software, within 48 hours after the end of the course. Once an instructor is approved, MCC will provide the instructor with a grading timeline. If a high school instructor facilitates an online MCC dual enrollment course with an MCC instructor, the high school instructor may request access to MCC Angel or Blackboard, with the understanding high school personnel access only his/her students' grades, course progress, etc.
- 14. Participating school districts will return the requested spreadsheet with desired dual enrollment courses for the 2015-2016 academic year by May 15, 2015. This allows adequate time for MCC and the school district to make appropriate plans for educational success.

C. SERVICES:

- 1. Upon completion of a course, students may complete the required form to receive an MCC transcript with the appropriate MCC course title, credits, and grade. The approved course may be transferable to other institutions based upon the criteria of the other institutions.
- 2. MCC staff may periodically contact/visit any dual enrollment course class offered at High School, to enhance communication between those involved, to ensure the section of the course remains comparable to other sections of the MCC course, and to assure each party's expectations of the course are being met. MCC will provide advance notice and comply with any security procedures in place at the school.
- 3. As High School contracted teachers, instructors will be evaluated according to Board of Education/school policy and rules. The instructor may also be evaluated using standards and procedures established by MCC. Officials from High School and MCC will review such instructor performance evaluations and work cooperatively to resolve issues of unsatisfactory instructor performance.

D. TERMINATION OR ADJUSTMENTS OF AGREEMENT:

1. This Agreement will be subject to annual review. Either party, for any reason, may terminate this Agreement upon thirty days written notice. Written notification of cancellation should be provided to the following: the MCC Secondary Partnerships Office, the MCC Academic Dean/Assistant Dean, the Administration, the instructor, and the site facilitator.

Please note: If MCC is responsible for hiring an instructor who is not concurrently teaching at the named high school, every effort will be made to offer a course. Occasionally, extenuating circumstances arise which may result in the need to cancel or modify course times or dates. MCC reserves the right to cancel a class or adjust the time/date of a class at any time due to enrollment, staffing or other extenuating factors. Cancellations may begin approximately one month prior to the course start date. In the event that a course cancellation occurs, MCC will seek to identify alternative options.

2. The MCC Board reserves the right to make adjustments to the terms of this Agreement, if found to be in violation of law, MCC Board policies, or any negotiated agreement between the MCC Board and an MCC employee group. Any such changes must be communicated to and accepted by High School.

E. COURSES:

Pursuant to terms of this Agreement, High School will partner with MCC to offer dual enrollment college courses. The course names and numbers will be stated in an attachment to this Agreement.

F. GENERAL PROVISIONS:

1. Nondiscrimination Clause

In accordance with the Nebraska Fair Employment Practice Act, Neb.Rev.Stat. §48-1122, and College policy, both Parties agree that neither Party, nor any of their subcontractors, if any, shall discriminate against any employee, or applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of this Agreement with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment because of the age, race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, disability, national origin or prior or current military service of the employee or applicant.

2. New Employee Work Eligibility Status

Pursuant to Neb.Rev.Stat. §§4-108 through 114, High School is required, and hereby agrees, to use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska. High School is further required, and hereby agrees, to require that all subcontractors, if any, use a federal immigration verification system to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the State of Nebraska. Federal immigration verification system means the electronic verification of the work authorization program of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, 8 U.S.C. 1324a, known as the E-Verify Program, or an equivalent federal program designated by the United States Department of Homeland Security or other federal agency authorized to verify the work eligibility status of a newly hired employee pursuant to the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986.

3. Classification of Workers

High School, and all lower-tiered subcontractors under High School, if any, shall properly classify all workers as either employees of High School or lower-tiered subcontractors, if any, or as independent contractors according to applicable law, and shall treat them accordingly for purposes of workers' compensation insurance

coverage, unemployment taxes, social security taxes, income tax withholding and any and all other payments or benefits incident to or affected by such status.

High School, and all lower-tiered subcontractors under High School, if any, utilizing the services of workers who are properly and according to applicable law not classified as employees under this subsection, shall provide written notice to said workers of their status as independent contractors. Said notice shall include a provision advising said workers that they are not eligible for workers' compensation insurance coverage, unemployment taxes, social security taxes, income tax withholding and any and all other payments or benefits incident to or affected by such status, from High School or lower-tiered subcontractor(s), if any. Copies of such notices shall be made available to MCC upon request.

Failure by High School, or any lower-tiered subcontractor engaged by High School, if any, to fully comply with the terms of this provision shall be considered and treated by MCC as a material breach of this Agreement.

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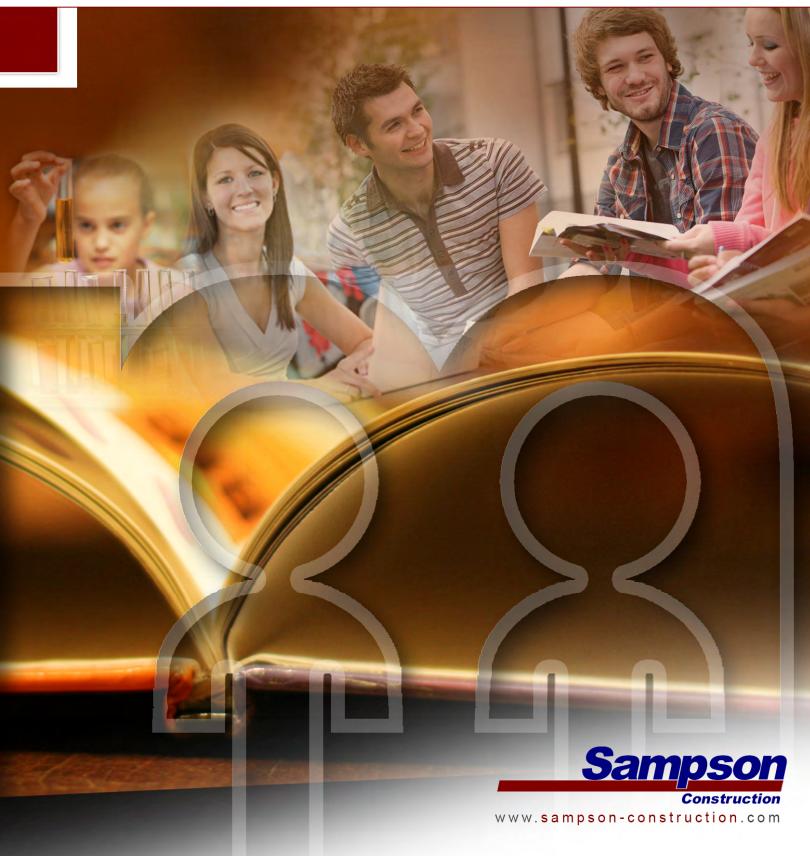

Bond Construction Progress Report

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Executive Summary

There have not been any significant changes in the course of planning or construction in the last 30 days. North High, Bryan, and Ron Witt are still the only projects that currently have construction activity on site. The remainder of the 2015 projects are in the procurement stage and awaiting an early June start for construction. Phase one of the North High project has reached substantial completion as scheduled and the administration team will begin the moving process into the new, but temporary offices.

The short summary below is a snapshot of the budget status, in round numbers, as it relates to contingency as a whole. This snapshot includes Sampson managed projects of \$37,035,969, but is representative of the complete 2013 Bond Budget of \$79,965,000.

First, it is important to understand that, in terms of dollars, the Bond is 21% complete, 35% in construction, and 45% still in the planning stage. The contingency increase shown below for completed projects consists of the balance of unused soft costs and contingency increase combined. The other values are based on current estimates and assuming that projects track historically similar.
