

#### Reports:

#### 2016-2017 Results for NeSA / ACT Assessments:

Dr. Sutfin opened this report stating that NDE has adopted more rigorous college and career readiness standards in English Language Arts, Math and Science. He said Millard embraces the higher level of accountability. We hold ourselves to high standards and adopted the ACT four years ago to measure ourselves against high standards. He said College and Career Readiness is our goal. Dr. Sutfin concluded by stating that in order for our students to be prepared to do well on the ACT, districts must provide a rigorous and challenging instructional program. We must go beyond a basic education if we want to prepare them to be successful post high school.

Dr. Kelberlau said the aggregate results of the 2017 State English Language Arts, Assessment, State Mathematics Assessment, and State Science Assessment for grades 3-8 are displayed. Also, ACT Statewide Assessment results are also shown.

Dr. Kelberlau also stated that as a requirement for the Nebraska Department of Education, each spring students in grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 are required to participate in state ELA and mathematics testing, and students in grades 5 and 8 participate in state science testing. All students in grade 11 complete the ACT with writing test. All data is used to help determine effectiveness of the district English Language Arts, Mathematics and Science programs.

#### Legislative Standing Positions Report:

Nolan Beyer said that each year we bring to the Board the Legislative Standing Positions which guide us through the next session. The Standing Positions listed in the report are the same as last year and no recommendations were brought this evening. Mr. Beyer added that we want to give the Board an opportunity to give feedback or guiding principles.

Mr. Beyer brought attention to Standing Position #5 on the list which involves the Learning community. He felt the Board would want to discuss the current standing position since the common levy was taken away.

Also discussed at length was Standing Position #11 - State and local taxpayers share the responsibility for the Pre-K through  $12^{th}$  grade educational program. The funding should reflect an equitable distribution of state revenue.

It was determined that Mr. Beyer will make changes to the Legislative Standing Positions to reflect discussion with the Board members. He will bring them back to the Board for approval at the next Board of Education meeting.

Mr. Kennedy reminded the Board of future agenda items and said this is the proper time for public questions and comments. There were no requests to speak.

#### Recruitment

Applications will be accepted from candidates who have graduated, or who are preparing to graduate, from accredited colleges and universities. The Human Resources Office will be responsible for disseminating information about the District and for obtaining and processing all application inquiries. Applicants inquiring about positions in the District will be directed to the Human Resources Website.

Whenever necessary, representatives of the administrative staff will visit accredited colleges and universities to recruit outstanding prospective candidates. The Human Resources Office may advertise vacant positions on the Millard Public School's web page, through local newspapers, social media sites, college and university placement offices, and/or professional organizations.

#### Selection

The Human Resources Office reviews and screens applications. When applicants' files are complete, screening and position interviews will be arranged as deemed necessary. Following position interviews, applicants will be notified of the status of their application.

#### **Human Resources**

Substitute Teachers 4205.1

I. Substitute teachers are appointed on a temporary basis and continue as needs require. They do not come under the provisions of the Nebraska teacher tenure law. In accordance with state law and Nebraska Department of Education regulations, substitute teachers shall hold a valid Nebraska Teaching Certificate or Local Option Substitute Certificate prior to being assigned duties requiring such certification. The Board will set rates of compensation for substitute teachers.

- II. There are two classifications of substitute teachers:
  - A. Daily substitute teachers are appointed to serve on a per diem basis for short, indefinite periods in meeting unforeseen and emergency situations. Service for fifteen or fewer consecutive days in any one substitute position is classified as a daily substitute.
  - B. A substitute teacher who is appointed to serve for more than fifteen consecutive days in a given position for a definite, but limited, period is classified as a long-term substitute teacher.
- III. Substitute teachers employed less than ninety consecutive days in a given position do not qualify for fringe benefits provided by the District including, but not limited to: paid sick leave, life, dental and long-term disability insurance. Substitute teachers may become eligible for health insurance benefits under provisions of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
- IV. Substitute teachers are entitled access to the staff professional library. Substitute teachers may participate in classes the District offers for professional growth and graduate credit if there is room in these classes.
- V. All substitute teachers are required to assume duties as the principal may direct, and are subject to the same rules and regulations which govern other teachers. All arrangements for substitute teachers must be made through the office of substitute teacher placement. Teachers and principals should follow the procedures developed by the administration in arranging for substitute teachers.

# Millard Public Schools 2018 Standing Positions

- 1. State and local taxpayers share the responsibility for the Pre-K through 12th grade educational program. The funding should reflect an adequate and equitable distribution of state revenue based on the unique needs of each district (2001, 2018).
- 2. The Millard Public Schools supports continuous improvement of safety and security for all aspects of the educational program (2017).
- 3. The Millard Public Schools supports legislation that holds all school Districts accountable for their results (2016).
- 4. The Millard Public Schools supports legislation that creates an incentive for districts to adopt programs which increase educational rigor and relevancy, including, but not limited to, programs of excellence (e.g. AP, IB, etc.), dual-enrollment courses, and career academies (2016).
- 5. The Millard Public Schools opposes legislation that establishes tuition tax credits, vouchers, and private charter schools. Rationale: The District has opposed all attempts to channel public money to private schools and circumvent the control of the local Board of Education (2015).
- 6. The Millard Public Schools supports legislation that would repeal the Learning Community Law. Rationale: The Learning Community is not necessary and is not benefiting students in the Metropolitan area or accomplishing the goals that were listed when it was established in 2008 (2012).
- 7. The Millard Public Schools supports the independence of established Class III school districts (2009).
- 8. The authority to levy for the general fund should remain with locally elected school boards. Rationale: Locally elected boards are in the best position to make decisions on levies and taxes (2009).
- 9. Locally elected school boards should have the ultimate authority to approve diversity and poverty plans. Rationale: Locally elected boards are more responsive to local needs (2009).
- 10. State aid decisions should not be reconsidered after the February 1<sup>st</sup> certification date. Rationale: School districts need time in order to make proper plans for funding school systems. The rules for state aid should not change after districts have established their budgets and levies (2009).

A total of four (4) bids were received for this work. The low bid received was from Boone Bros. Roofing & Sheet Metal in the amount of \$287,000. Boone Bros. is an Authorized Roofing Applicator for the specified roofing systems. There were no bid alternates. The low project bid amount is \$33,000 below the original estimate of \$320,000. The Contractor has verified they have everything included.

Boone Bros. has completed numerous roofing projects for the District in the past, including many sections of South High School. Therefore we recommend acceptance of their bid in the amount of \$287,000.00 if funds are available.



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# **Commercial Insurance Risk Management Report**

## Insurance Program Overview - Current

The Millard Public Schools' property and casualty insurance program renewed in June 2017; the total insurance premium decreased 5.41%. The total annualized premium dollars declined from \$1,912,070 to \$1,807,946, a savings of \$104,124 (Exhibit 1). The premium reduction was driven primarily by reduced net property, workers' compensation and pollution liability rates.

The Harry A. Koch Co. pre-negotiated favorable renewal terms with the incumbent carriers. Property was marketed in 2017, but coverage remained with Travelers. All other property markets approached declined to quote due to class of business, losses or competitive pricing.

Millard Public Schools' casualty (general liability, auto liability, school board liability, miscellaneous professional liability, fiduciary liability) and workers' compensation policies are loss sensitive programs with large deductibles or self-insured retentions starting at \$100,000. Additional lines of coverage include property, crime, pollution and cyber/network security (Exhibit 2).

The two largest lines of coverage impacting Millard Public Schools' cost of risk continue to be workers' compensation and property. These two lines of coverage have the greatest potential to impact premium due to historical frequency and severity of losses (Exhibit 3). The workers' compensation line is in its fourth year with Sentry Insurance Company. The estimated cost of risk for the 2017 workers' compensation line decreased approximately \$100,000 due to favorable loss history and a decline in net rate. Inside this loss sensitive program, Millard Public Schools is responsible for all employee injury claims up to \$350,000 per occurrence. The move to a large deductible program was based upon several factors: premium savings, forecasted loss analysis, five year loss ratio and trending future cost of workers' compensation. Since moving to Sentry in 2014, workers' compensation losses have been on par or better with estimates, with no significant losses (Exhibit 3). At current loss levels an equity balance may be available for distribution if reserves remain stable.

The property renewal included the most noteworthy change for 2017. The statement of values increased districtwide from approximately \$568mm to \$594mm (\$26mm increase). Property values increased 4.5% to keep with the rising cost of construction. In 2016 the wind/hail deductible increased from \$50,000 to \$100,000. While the district maintains excellent facilities with the appropriate protections, the underwriters remain cautious due to the large concentration of values in a relatively small square mile radius. Total incurred losses including reserves for wind/hail claims are approximately \$3mm since 2011 (Exhibit 3). Travelers Insurance Company has been the property insurance carrier for the district for nearly 30 years and has provided very competitive rates with comprehensive coverage.

Overall Millard Public Schools is performing very well with low severity of losses in all areas within the past 24 months. Casualty coverage (general liability, auto liability, school board liability, miscellaneous professional liability, fiduciary liability) is in its seventh year with United Educators (UE). United Educators is a reciprocal risk exchange (non-assessable) program between 1,200 educational institutions around the United States. The move to United Educators has proven to be an excellent enhancement to Millard Public Schools' insurance program.

The UE program contains a \$100,000 self-insured retention whereby Millard Public Schools is responsible for the defense and settlement of all claims within this amount. Claims are managed by a Third Party Administrator (TPA) and Millard Public Schools' legal counsel. Claims have been managed very well with losses being contained, thus the cost savings has been tremendous compared to the standard market. Since 2011 Millard Public Schools has experienced estimated premium savings in excess of \$1,400,000 due to favorable loss history and reduced insurance premiums.

RIMS annually compiles benchmarking data related to the total cost of risk. According to the 2016 RIMS Benchmark Survey, Millard Public Schools continues to beat the national average for the total cost of risk in the education sector. Based on total revenues and insurance premiums, compared to educational organizations with \$1B in revenue or less, Millard Public Schools pays 33.55% less than the average. The total cost of risk for Millard Public Schools is \$8.29 per \$1,000 of revenue; the average is \$12.48 per \$1,000 of revenue.

#### Future Insurance Market for Millard Public Schools

The move to larger self-insured retentions across several lines of coverages helps insulate the district from unanticipated premium increases due to marketplace conditions, underwriter appetite and base rate changes. However, the cost of healthcare for employee injuries and general liability/school board legal liability claims will drive the future cost of risk for Millard Public Schools.

Property insurance costs will be an ongoing focus for Millard Public Schools and The Harry A. Koch Co. The narrow marketplace, high values, large concentration of real property and desire for nationwide claims experience creates a challenge in the property placement.

The emerging liability from cyber attacks and the theft of personally identifiable information (PII) will be a greater focus in the near and long term future. Currently Millard Public Schools has insurance coverage within the UE program along with a standalone cyber/network security policy with Beazley. Cumulative limits are \$1,250,000 with various sub-limits for regulatory, notification and credit monitoring.

The Harry A. Koch Co. will continue to look at the best available markets for coverage, pricing and limits for the upcoming 2018 renewal. The plan is to market all coverage lines except workers' compensation and casualty (general liability, auto liability, school board liability, miscellaneous professional liability, fiduciary liability) due to the competitiveness and success of these programs.



## 2018 Commercial Insurance Market – Anticipated Trends and Pricing

For recent renewals the overall insurance market has remained "soft" with rates stable and relatively flat. 2018 is expected to bring changes especially in the property market due to recent hurricanes, earthquakes and wildfires. According to U.K. based Fitch Ratings Ltd, "Adding the California wildfires to hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria will make 2017 one of the costliest catastrophe loss years in U.S. history, with insured losses reaching \$70 billion-\$100 billion according to various estimates." Below is a summary of overall market expectations for 2018.

- General liability: 0% 3% base rate increase
- Auto Liability: 2.5% 7.5% base rate increase
- Umbrella Liability: 0% 3% base rate increase
- Workers' Compensation: -3% 3% base rate decrease/increase
- Property
  - o CAT-exposed with losses: 20%+ base rate increase
  - o CAT-exposed: 10% 20% base rate increase
  - Non-CAT property: 0% 5% base rate increase

Millard Public Schools falls in the 'Non-CAT property' category. Wind/hail remains the greatest exposure, coupled with the concentration of values. The Harry A. Koch Co. will continue to advocate for Millard Public Schools to negotiate competitive pricing and support risk management policies that help mitigate the overall cost of risk.

The Harry A. Koch Co. conducts a Risk Analysis and Coverage Audit Review every three years with Millard Public Schools. The most recent audit was completed in the fall of 2017 with administration and various departments over a four-part/half day set of meetings. These audits result in positive outcomes including coverage enhancements and abundant communication on risk awareness. The main objectives of Millard Public Schools' insurance program are always being evaluated: comprehensive coverage, risk identification and best-in-class premium.
