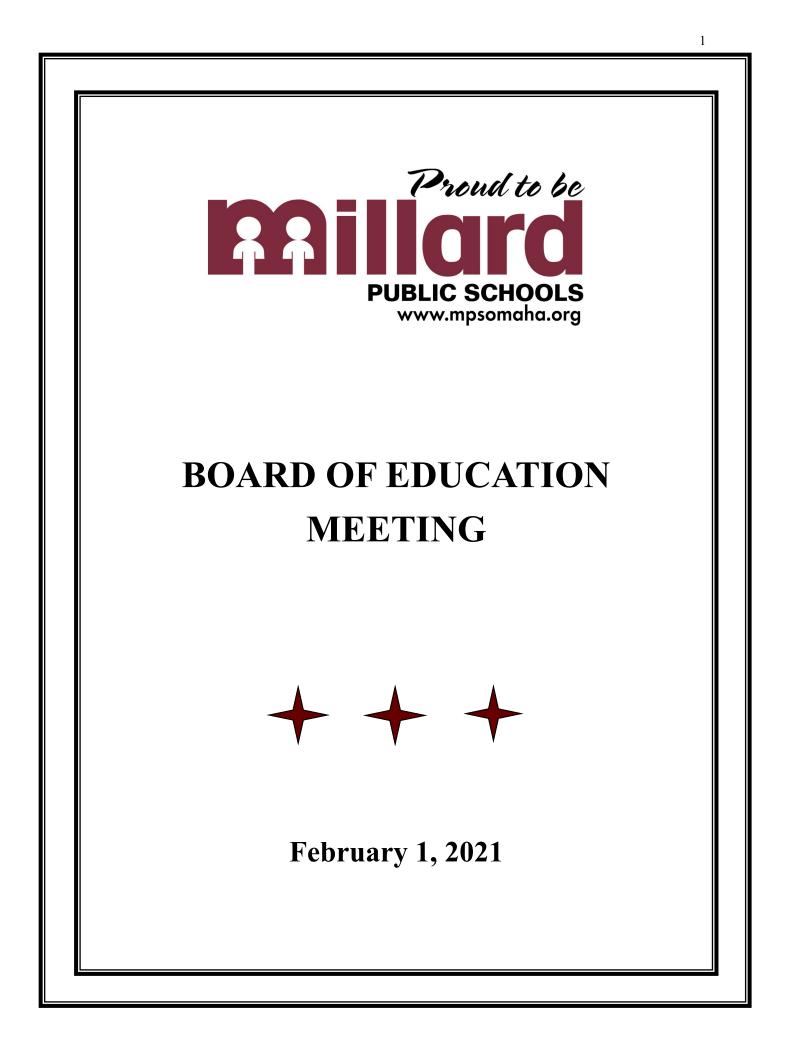

Insurance Report

The District has engaged the services of the Harry A. Koch Company (HAKCO) as its insurance consultant. Each year, the consultant makes a report to the Board and addresses any questions the board members may have. Bill Unger, representative with HAKCO, was available to give a short presentation.

Construction Report

Chief Financial Officer Chad Meisgeier said this report will provide projects that are recently completed. It also provided a detailed breakout of the 2013 bond funded projects. Mr. Meisgeier thanked General Manager Steve Mainelli for all of his work on these projects.

2018 Strategic Plan Update

Assistant Superintendent for Leadership, Planning & Evaluation Dr. Kim Saum-Mills said Millard has used Strategic Planning and Site Planning as the mechanism for school improvement since the 1989-1990 school year. We wrote a new Strategic Plan in 2017-2018 and began implementation in 2018-2019. We are now in year 4 of our implementation of our strategic plan. Next year will be year 5 of the implementation, and we are targeting the summer of 2022 to write our new

plan. Dr. Saum Mills said the report provides an overview and status of each of the eight strategies. Dr. Saum-Mills said she, Dr. Phipps, Dr. Weers, Dr. Houlton and Mr. Jelkin were available to answer questions.

Impact of COVID - Return to Thriving Report

Dr. Sutfin said as the district continues to manage the response to the pandemic, we are also looking toward recovery. Dr. Sutfin detailed the learning gap and said that frequency, intensity, and duration will be key elements to improving student learning as we address the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The learning disruption began on March 13, 2020 with the closure of schools. During the 2020-21 school year, the district has offered concurrent remote learning. More than 4,000 students began the school year remotely. That number has decreased by 25% as the school year has progressed. Additionally more than 1,100 students and staff members have had COVID during some point in the year with another 4,500 student and staff members being required to quarantine after being identified as a close contact to a COVID positive individual.

Dr. Sutfin acknowledged the tremendous effort put forth by teachers and staff to keep our buildings open and maximize learning despite the disruption caused by the pandemic.

Assistant Superintendent for Leadership, Planning & Evaluation Dr. Kim Saum-Mills shared that the district is using our strategic planning process to close the gap. Last week a team of building and district leaders gathered to determine priorities. Detailed planning has begun for the 2021-22 school year including reteaching, interventions, summer school, communication with our families and targeted professional development for our staff.

Dr. Darin Kelberlau, Executive Director of Assessment, Research & Evaluation reviewed data with the Board. He shared that the MAP test scores for students from last fall to this fall show a dip in reading and math. The good news is that recovery is already underway. Being in school this year has been helpful with this winter's MAP scores showing the gaps are closing. But recovery work still needs to be done.

The high school failure rates for students also reflected the impact of the pandemic. In looking at high school students who experienced failing grades in two or more classes, in-person students had an 11.4% failure rate for the fall. This was an increase from past years which had been at 8.6% in 2018-19 and 8.9% in 2019-20. Remote high school students experienced a much higher failure rate of two or more classes at 32.6%. Remote students are welcome to return at any point, and parents are urged to closely monitor their child's academic progress and reach out to the school if they have any questions.

Dr. Heather Phipps, Associate Superintendent of Educational Services answered questions from the Board and shared that she will present high school credit recovery plans at the February Committee meeting.

Dr. Sutfin concluded the report by reminding the Board that together as one community, we can continue to move forward with our response to COVID-19 and ensure our students' continued academic and social-emotional development.

Exiting Senior Survey- Class of 2020 and 8th-9th Grade Transition

Director of Secondary Education Dr. Tony Weers shared the results of the exiting senior and 8th to 9th grade transition survey report. Dr. Weers said the purpose of this report is to give a picture of the preparation for transition from middle to high school and post high school plans for our graduates. Seventy-nine percent of our graduates reported they plan to be in school full or part time within a year of graduating. Extracurricular activity participation continues to be high with over 80% of students reporting participation. The majority of incoming freshmen reported that they felt prepared for academic success in high school.

Legislative Update

Executive Director of Activities, Athletics & External Affairs Nolan Beyer provided the board with a legislative update. Mr. Beyer said tomorrow Tuesday, January 19, 2021 is the ninth day of the 90 day session. Mr. Beyer said regarding the CARES funding, one common misconception by senators is that districts have CARES funding remaining. Mr. Beyer said the

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CARES funding received was not enough to cover expenses. Data is being collected by GNSA to provide CARES funds received and detailed expenses incurred by the districts to the senators.

Mr. Beyer said included in the packet this evening are rosters of the senators, alphabetical as well as by district, list of standing committee assignments, senator calendar and a legislative summary of bills that could have a potential effect.

Mr. Beyer said he continues to work with Mueller Robak on bills that have potential effect on Millard. Stances have yet to be determined. Mr. Beyer said hearings begin a week from today. Typically the education hearings took place in the afternoons on Mondays and Tuesdays until all hearings were completed. Education hearings will now take place all day on Mondays and Tuesdays. The idea is to get the hearings out of the way early. Mr. Beyer said they hope to know the protocols for hearing which are anticipated to be provided by the Speaker this week.

District Update

Dr. Sutfin provided the board with an update on how the district is responding to COVID-19. He said this information is updated on the district's website twice a day. As of right now we have 69 active COVID-19 cases and 237 who are under quarantine.

Dr. Sutfin said he and his team continue to work with Douglas County Health on staff vaccines. This is a work in progress. Dr. Sutfin said he will meet with Douglas County Health Thursday and he hopes to have more information then. Dr. Sutfin said the issue is we don't have enough vaccines available in the state of Nebraska. He said we would need enough vaccines for 3,600 staff.

Mrs. Poole asked if the Board wanted continued COVID updates at each Board meeting. The board reported that they did want these frequent updates.

Mrs. Poole reminded the Board of future agenda items and said this is the proper time for public questions and comments. There were no requests to speak on non agenda items.

Millard Public School Level III/Ombudsman Plus Proposal

BACKGROUND

TITLE 92, NEBRASKA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, CHAPTER 51 (Rule 51) defines Level III Special Education Contractual Services as those special education and related services provided in an educational setting not operated by the school district or approved cooperative whose rates are approved by the Nebraska Department of Education.

Program placement for students with disabilities is determined by the student's Individualized Education Program (IEP). In some cases, a decision is made that the special education programs available within the District are not adequate to meet the needs of the child. In those cases, a Level III placement is made. Historically we have partnered with many Level III providers based on the needs of the student. While these programs are of high quality, Millard does not determine the programming for students in these programs.

Part of the work of Strategy 3.2 (enhance alternative educational opportunities and support structures for students at risk of not being successful at school) was to review all available programming for our students. It was determined that a new partnership could provide Millard with more control over programming for some of our students.

PROPOSAL

If approved by the Board of Education, beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, Millard will enter into a contract with Ombudsman to run an Ombudsman Plus Level III Program for Millard Public Schools students with disabilities who need a Level 3 placement.

The cost of the new program will be off-set by reducing the expense related to students in other Level III Programs. The program will be cost-neutral. We would continue to use other Level III programs for students with other disability needs (e.g. Brook Valley North for students with low cognition/Autism and significant behavioral difficulties).

Bids were received for the Cather Elementary Site Lighting Improvement project at MPS Support Services Center on January 14th, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. Per the attached bid tab, five bids were received. The low base bid was submitted by Schaefer Electric in the amount of \$79,495. Free Breakfast & Lunch

Pursuant to the Families First Coronavirus Response Act of 2020 (P.L. 116-127) U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue announced (<u>USDA Free Meals Press</u> <u>Release</u>) the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will extend several flexibilities through as late as June 30, 2021. The flexibilities allow free meals to be served to all children ages 1 - 18 into the fall months regardless on their status as an in-school learner, concurrent remote learner or those not yet old enough to attend school. This unprecedented move will help ensure – no matter what the situation is on-the-ground – children have access to nutritious food as the country recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic. USDA has been and continues to be committed to using the Congressionally appropriated funding that has been made available.

USDA's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) is extending a suite of nationwide waivers for the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) through the end of 2020, or until available funding runs out. This includes:

- Allowing breakfast and lunch meals to be served at all schools and at no cost.
- Permitting meals to be served outside of the cafeteria.
- Allowing parents and guardians to pick-up meals for their children that are not physically present in school.

This is a temporary flexibility offered by the USDA, families will still need to:

- Complete free and Reduced applications to receive applicable benefits outside of the school meals program and to continue meal benefits when the funding has been exhausted from the USDA.
- These flexibilities do not cover a la carte purchases; items such as individually purchased milk will require payment.
- Continue to have money on account for a la carte purchases.

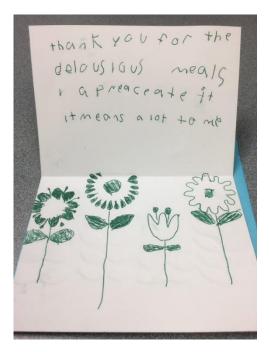

Current ELD Model

Millard serves a population that represents great diversity in language and culture. Therefore, the EL program in Millard is currently an English-only, content-based English Language Development (ELD) program at the secondary level. For elementary students the program is also English-only, but students are pulled out to receive English instruction. In these programs, students are grouped by language ability level. Group assignments are flexible and temporary, changing according to the learners' needs. Most students spend the majority of the school day mainstreamed in the general education program, receiving relevant, meaningful support services from highly trained EL teachers in EL classes.

Definition of Key Terms:

<u>Content-Based Instruction</u> (CBI)-An approach to second language instruction in which content-area subjects and topics are used as the basis of instruction.

<u>Sheltered Instruction</u>-Grade-level content-area instruction provided in English in a manner that makes it understandable to ELs while supporting their English language development.

<u>Dual Language Education</u>-Bilingual education programs that develop bilingualism, biliteracy, grade-level academic achievement, and sociocultural development for all students.

<u>Translanguaging</u>-Pedagogical practices that use bilingualism as a resource rather than ignore it or perceive it as a problem; using both languages to receive, process, and share information.

Key Research Findings

The task force looked at a multitude of books and research articles, including a report prepared by Hanover Research that was completed specifically for Millard Public Schools. The task force findings are aligned very closely to the Hanover conclusions which are reflected in the following chart. The content-based, English only program offered at the secondary level in Millard has strong evidence of overall effectiveness (English acquisition as well as academic achievement) for beginning English speakers. However, pullout, English only programs are less effective for the overall academic achievement of elementary students.

Taskforce Recommendations

- 1. Scheduling
 - a. Elementary
 - i. Increase push-in and co-teaching of EL teacher and classroom teachers for students with an English proficiency level of 3 or 4, particularly at Kindergarten and intermediate grades. Students need to receive content instruction to increase academic achievement.

 - b. Build increased parental engagement
 - c. Develop higher levels of awareness in building administrators who can support and inform teachers and staff members

d. Celebrate multilingualism

Broad or Long-term Recommendations:

1. Consider the feasibility of offering a bilingual or two-way dual language opportunity in Millard in order to promote higher academic achievement for all students.

Research consistently indicates the effectiveness of bilingual programs as a key factor in reducing the achievement gap for English Learners (Alvear, 2015; Lindholm-Leary & Hernandex, 2011; Ramirez, 1992; Steele et al., 2017; Valentino & Reardon, 2014). Because of the variety of languages spoken by our students, a one-way dual language or transitional bilingual program would not be very realistic or feasible. We simply do not have a school with a high percentage of students with the same first language that is not English.

Spanish is the most common first language in Millard other than English. A two-way dual- language program could be developed. A two-way program would consist of approximately 50% of the students with Spanish as a first language and 50% with English as a first language. This dual-language program could be developed by a school as a parent choice program under Policy and Rule 10,001.1

Two-way dual language programs integrate language and academic instruction for both ELs and non-ELs. It includes the three key components of effective instruction:

- 1. Promotes high academic achievement for all participating students(Marian, Shook, & Schroeder, 2013)
- 2. Enhances language proficiency
- 3. Promotes cross-cultural understanding

In addition, research shows that regardless of EL status, participating students experience:

- Increased cognitive stimulation
