Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Daily Record on Friday, July 9, 2021 a copy of the publication is being attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board of Education and a copy of their Acknowledgement of Receipt of Notice and the agenda are attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in advance notice and in the notice of the Board of Education of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

President Linda Poole announced that the open meeting laws are posted and available for public inspection and asked everyone to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken. Mr. Kennedy, Mr. Pate, Mr. Anderson, Mrs. Poole, Mrs. Jolley and Mrs. McGill Johnson were present.

Mrs. Poole announced this is the proper time for public questions and comments on agenda items only. There was one request to speak. <u>Laura Alexander</u> of 16268 California Street spoke in regards to requiring masks for elementary students in the fall.

Motion was made by Mike Kennedy, Seconded by Dave Anderson, to approve the Board of Education minutes for June 7, 2021, approve the bills and receive the treasurer's report and place on file. Voting in favor of said motion was: Mr. Kennedy, Mr. Pate, Mr. Anderson, Mrs. Poole, Mrs. Jolley and Mrs. McGill Johnson. Voting against were: None. Motion carried.

Superintendent's Comments:

Dr. Sutfin said we do have a couple of speakers tonight. He said we have a couple groups of people protesting outside regarding police in schools. Dr. Sutfin said we are all entitled to express our own opinions. The first amendment right to free speech is one of the great freedoms we have by living in this country. Dr. Sutfin thanked and commended our School Resource Officers(SRO) and the Police Department. Dr. Sutfin said they have been an outstanding partner with our district. Dr. Sutfin thanked Chief Schmaderer, Sergeant Fricke and all of the School Resource Officers who have worked hard to keep our school safe. He said they have worked hard to build relationships with the community. Dr. Sutfin said if parents have concerns about how their students have been treated by a School Resource Officer he urges them to contact himself or the building Principal. Dr. Sutfin said he does not support the negative name calling that is taking place.

Board Comments:

Mike Kennedy:

Mr. Kennedy also shared his support for our SRO's. He is upset by the names that officers are being called and would like people to treat them with respect.

Mike Pate:

Mr. Pate thanked Mike Kennedy and Dr. Sutfin for their comments in support of SRO's and said he agrees with them. He said he applauds Mayor Stothert for increasing the police force across the City of Omaha and our SRO's for all of their work.

Mr. Pate also shared a proposed resolution he had written for the Board to consider sending to the Department of Education on the proposed health standards. Click here to view the <u>proposed resolution</u>. Mr. Pate would like the board to take a position on the proposed health standards and would like it discussed as an agenda item in the future.

Dave Anderson

Mr. Anderson echoed the comments made regarding SRO's. Mr. Anderson said in regards to the resolution he thinks it needs to go through the proper channels of proposing a resolution and not be addressed tonight.

Stacy Jolley:

Mrs. Jolley also echoed what her colleagues have said regarding SRO's. Mrs. Jolley said she loves that people are passionate enough to step forward and speak up for things they believe in. She also said she doesn't believe name calling is helpful or

productive. Mrs. Jolley is grateful for the work our SRO's do to create relationships with students in our schools. Mrs. Jolley said if there are specific issues with SRO's in one of our schools to feel free to contact her via email.

Reports:

Educational Services End of the Year Report

Associate Superintendent of Educational Services Dr. Heather Phipps shared this report summarizes the work of the Educational Services Department does throughout the year. She said they refer to this report throughout the year. A few highlights were:

122 Students graduated with an Associates of Arts degree from MCC.

867 Children benefited from our Preschool program.

1410 Students benefited from our ELI program.

\$6 million dollars was received in grants.

Dr. Phipps also shared that an impressive number of students were able to earn credit through the many credit recovery offerings to assist with learning loss related to the pandemic. Dr. Phipps thanked the entire Educational Services department for their hard work during the pandemic.

Mr. Anderson asked what we think contributes to the reduction of participation numbers in the Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corp (AFJROTC) program? Dr. Phipps said the visibility of the program through community activities for AFJROTC were impacted and limited by COVID-19. They anticipate the numbers to bounce back next year.

Mr. Anderson thanked Dr. Phipps and her team for all their efforts and offered praise for this report. Dr. Sutfin also thanked the MEP facilitators and said well done. He also said the MEP facilitators also subbed on average 30-35 days on top of their normal duties due the shortage of sub teachers.

Leadership & Learning Annual Report

Assistant Superintendent for Leadership, Planning and Evaluation Dr. Kim Saum-Mills said that due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, like everyone in Millard, our focus of support changed and some of the professional learning or continuous improvement activities that we normally coordinate were put on pause. She said many of our annual activities continued or were modified to adapt to COVID protocols. Dr. Saum-Mills said we held most professional learning sessions via zoom and our department led the recovery planning similar to our efforts in Pie Planning. Dr. Saum-Mills said during the past year we did move forward with changes to our teacher and administrator evaluation processes and phase one site planning did not occur this past year but phase three site planning did. Dr. Saum-Mills also shared that our five Leadership & Learning Facilitators also supported buildings one day a week for a majority of the school year by subbing in classrooms.

Budget Report

Chief Financial Officer Chad Meisgeier provided an update on the district's budget. He said tonight the focus will be the general fund only and will not include COVID Relief Dollars, building or bond fund expenditures. Mr. Meisgeier shared the budget process timeline and said the purpose of this report is to gather input from the board before the August 9, 2021 budget hearing. Mr. Meisgeier said state aid has been certified and Millard can expect a \$2.8 Million dollar cut in state aid. He also

shared our expense categories and revenue sources and the tax levy history. He also shared the assessed value of properties in the district. Mr. Meisgeier also said the property values will not be certified until August 20, 2021.

He also shared the cash reserve history and balance recommendations. Mr. Meisgeier also reviewed the historical data of personnel and budget reductions from prior years. He said at this time they are not recommending any program and staff cuts for the upcoming budget year.

Mr. Meisgeier shared the draft 2021-22 recommendation which showed a 3% budget increase. He shared the proposed changes to the different levys. The proposed budget would reduce the total levy to \$1.2191 total levy. This keeps us at a very low levy compared to surrounding districts.

District Update

Dr. Sutfin provided the board with an update on how the district is responding to COVID-19 and the opening school protocols. Dr. Sutfin shared the available data on the 7 day rolling average, percent of cases by age groups and zip code, hospitalization and ventilator usage. Dr. Sutfin also shared the data on the number of fully vaccinated residents.

Dr. Sutfin reviewed what we should expect in the fall of 2021 and said that this could change based on guidance from local and state health officials:

- 1. Although significantly less, we should expect positive cases and quarantines.
- 2. We have to anticipate that we may have to temporarily require masking or close a classroom, grade level, or school.
- 3. We are committed to making data driven decisions and responding to the data.
- 4. We are committed to providing the support our staff needs to deliver our curriculum during this time of COVID-19.

Dr. Sutfin said we will continue to make data driven decisions. He hopes our community continues to trust us. Dr. Sutfin shared with the guidance received from Douglas County Health that is available right now, it is reasonable to expect the following response if an individual comes into close contact with another individual who is positive with COVID:

- Students or staff members who were wearing a mask would continue to wear a mask and monitor for symptoms.
- Students or staff members who are fully vaccinated would monitor for symptoms.
- Students or staff members who were not wearing a mask and were not fully vaccinated would quarantine.

Dr. Sutfin said it is possible that the next step in Quarantine procedures will be "Quarantine if showing symptoms after an exposure". Dr. Sutfin said we are waiting to hear from DHHS and County Health.

Dr. Sutfin said he continues to work with Children's Hospital on how to best educate our community. Dr. Sutfin said we will also continue to communicate with our community through editorials, board meetings, letters home and social media. Lastly, Dr. Sutfin said this summer we provided nine opportunities for the community to be vaccinated by hosting mobile clinics. Dr Sutfin reminded the board that we are not promoting the vaccine. We are encouraging families to talk to their doctor and make an informed decision.

Dr. Sutfin shared what he thinks the plans will be for the fall as of today.

- Daily personal screening for symptoms of COVID and other illnesses. If you are sick or you have been exposed to somebody with COVID stay home.
- Masks are optional and personal choice.
- Schools will return to normal lunch procedures.
- We will continue with enhanced cleaning procedures.
- Bussing is still in discussion as CDC requirements are still being interpreted.

Dr. Sutfin said that communication is key and essential. We will continue to communicate with families, which will start with a back to school email from himself soon followed by an email from the principals. Dr. Sutfin said the COVID website will be updated in August. The COVID protocols will be posted on the website. Positive cases by school will be updated on the website daily.

Dr. Sutfin shared that we will be gathering input through a survey from our stakeholders in regards to how the ESSER III funds should be spent in response to the pandemic.

Dr. Sutfin said as we will continue to work with State and Local Health Departments. HE said we need to take into account transmission rates, positivity test rates, and vaccinations levels by zip codes and school locations. Dr. Sutfin said localized response will be extremely important. He also said personal choice and responsibility is up to the individual.

Mrs. Poole reminded the Board of future agenda items and said this is the proper time for public questions and comments. There was one request to speak on non-agenda items. <u>Cooper Pierce</u> of 8118 North 164th Street spoke in opposition of having School Resource Officers in our schools.
